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Information for Interim Tests

Interim papers have been scheduled in to the year-long 11Plus / Entrance Exam course planner and should be completed only when they appear in the course planner.

Each interim test is broken down into maths, English, verbal reasoning and non-verbal reasoning papers. Each paper includes a sample of questions from the topics taught in previous weeks.

ALL TESTS WILL BE COMPLETED AT HOME. Please make sure you bring your book to your lesson the week after a test has been completed, for marking and review.

Your tutor will inform you when a test should be completed.

Which tests should I complete?

Your tutor will direct you to **complete the relevant sections** depending on the course planner you are following and the exam you are preparing for.

Some children will complete all sections of each interim test if they cover maths, English, verbal-reasoning and non-verbal reasoning in their 'course planner sessions'. If one or more of these subjects has been omitted from your course planner, then you will not be required to complete the interim tests associated with these topics.


Just like in any exam, you may be faced with questions that you have not yet been taught. Have a good go at these questions and use the **'topic practice'** area of Compass for **further practice** if needed.

Exam 'Top Tips'

- Listen carefully to any explanations or instructions you are given.
- Work accurately you may have optional answers, so choose the most reasonable answer if you don't know for sure.
- Move on if stuck if you are stuck on a question, move on. Remember, you need to complete enough questions to score well.
- **Read questions carefully** including instructions on how to answer questions.
- Work speedily often the biggest challenge in the exam is completing enough questions to gain top marks.
- **Don't stop!** use all the time you are given. If you finish before the time is up, use this time to check your answers are accurate.

Information for Interim Tests

At the end of each set of interim tests there will be a perforated answer sheet per subject to mark the correct answer. These pages can be torn out and placed alongside the test paper to mark answers as children are working. Boxes should be marked with a **thin horizontal line**, as shown in the example below. When **two answers are required** for a question, mark an answer from each column of the box with a thin horizontal line.



The 11+ test will be marked by a computer, but it is important to learn how to use the answer boxes correctly in preparation for the exam. **Mistakes should be rubbed out** carefully, not crossed out, since in the real test this would not be recorded properly by a computer.

Marking and Feedback

Once you have completed an 'interim test' you will mark it alongside your tutor. Add your score next to each test on the score sheet on Page 4.

Reflecting helps you to develop your skills and review their effectiveness. To be self-aware is to be able to realistically assess your strengths, areas for development and set goals, while maintaining a positive mindset. You will get some time after each test for self-reflection and an opportunity to use Compass to work on any tricky topics from the test.





"The Green Dragon's going where Father is," said Phyllis; "if it were a really real dragon, we could stop it and ask it to take our love to Father."

"Dragons don't carry people's love," said Peter; "they'd be above it."

"Yes, they do, if you tame them thoroughly first. They fetch and carry like pet spaniels," said Phyllis, 20 "and feed out of your hand. I wonder why Father never writes to us."

"Mother says he's been too busy," said Bobbie; "but he'll write soon, she says." "I say," Phyllis suggested, "let's all wave to the Green Dragon as it goes by. If it's a magic dragon, it'll understand and take our love to Father. And if it isn't, three waves aren't much. We shall never miss them."

So when the Green Dragon tore shrieking out of the mouth of its dark lair, which was the tunnel, all three children stood on the railing and waved their pocket-handkerchiefs without stopping to think whether they were clean handkerchiefs or the reverse. They were, as a matter of fact, very much the reverse.

And out of a first-class carriage a hand waved back. A quite clean hand. It held a newspaper. It was the old gentleman's hand.



What it Lacks in Thrills...

While the Ferris wheel is not as thrilling as a roller coaster, it is still very exciting. The fact of being high in the air makes it so much more entertaining than a lot of rides. I mean, how often do you 10 hang that high up in daily life?

Nevertheless, I have to admit, I don't seek Ferris wheels out because of their excitement. Rather, I find them very relaxing. At the top of the Ferris wheel you get beautiful sights of the park. You also get a sense of calm that you don't get in the hustle and bustle of the park below.

It Happened at the World's Fair

The first Ferris wheel was made by and named after George Washington Gale Ferris, Jr. He 15 designed it for the Chicago World's Fair in 1893. It was the tallest attraction there, standing 264 feet high.

However, visitors to the fair were impressed by the size of the ride, as well as the mechanics of it. In 1893, anything that was not turned by hand was considered a sight to see. And the wheel, which was a machine, was truly incredible to see. Furthermore, as one visitor put it, the wheel was

20 amazing because it seemed to be missing support. That is, it did not look like it could stand on its own. And yet it did and even rotated!

They Keep Reaching Higher and Higher

Ferris wheel technology has only improved since then. Most of today's Ferris wheels are much larger than that first one. The largest in the world is the Singapore Flyer, which stands slightly more than twice as tall as George Ferris's wheel.



Delays to Flights at Heathrow Airport






