Suffixes - 'Ous' Year 3 / P4

A **SUFFIX** is a letter or a group of letters that can be added to the end of a word to form a new word.

Adding the suffix -ous turns a noun into an adjective e.g. danger + ous = dangerous

There are some rules when changing from the root word to the word ending in -ous:

Words ending in 'y': remove the 'y' and add 'i' + 'ous' (fury > furious)

Words ending in 'ge': keep the 'e' and add 'ous' (courage > courageous)

Words ending in 'ce': remove the 'e' and add 'i' + 'ous' (space > spacious)

Words ending in 'our': change to 'or' and add 'ous' (humour > humorous)
