## DETERMINATION OF THE COMPLAINT AGAINST A TRAINEE TEACHER "T3"

DATE OF DECISION: 24 February 2022

On the 24 February 2022, the Ethics and Trademarks Committee (ETC), (formally the Ethics and Certification Mark Committee) (ECMC) of Iyengar Yoga Australia (IYA) made a determination in relation to a formal complaint against an IYA member and Trainee Teacher ("T3") in accordance with Clause 20 of the IYA Complaints Handling Procedure (CHP).

- 1. The Committee was satisfied T3 did not abide by their obligations under clause 10.2 CHP in that T3 failed to advise the Committee that:
  - Police had investigated a complaint made against T3 by a student affiliated to the Yoga School where T3 was a trainee teacher.
- 2. Police had applied for a Family Violence Final Intervention Order against T3 to the Magistrates Court of Victoria in order to protect that student; and
- 3. A Family Violence Order was granted by that court to protect that student from T3.

In accordance with clause 24 of the CHP the ETC imposed the following sanctions:

- 1. That T3 be reprimanded in accordance with clause 24.1(b) of the CHP
- 2. That a condition placed upon T3's IYA membership requiring participation in education designed to instruct that person as

- to their obligations under the Teachers' Code of Conduct in accordance with clause 24.1 iv of the CHP, and
- 3. That a condition placed upon T3's IYA membership requiring that T3 be supervised by another teacher nominated by the ECMC in a manner to be determined by the committee in accordance with clause 24.1 iv of the CHP.
- 4. That the decision to sanction T3 be published on the IYA website in accordance with Clause 38 of the CHP.
