Matthew 27:38-44

- A. In addition to all the physical pain Jesus endured, He also endured taunts and reproaches while on the cross from sinners whose real issue was with God in heaven. **ROM 15:3.**
 - 1. These were part of His soul-sufferings of exceeding sorrow. MAT 26:38.
 - 2. These were part of the hell He experienced before death which culminated with the Father's forsaking Him. MAT 27:46; ACT 2:27.
- B. They taunted His Sonship, "...If thou be the Son of God..." (v. 40).
 - 1. Jesus's public ministry began with that doubt-provoking insinuation. MAT 4:3.
 - 2. The spirit of Satan taunts us continually with that same doubt.
 - 3. It was not for lack of miracles that they didn't believe Him. ACT 2:22; JOH 12:37.
 - 4. Their underlying disorder was their unbelief of God's word. **JOH 5:45-47.**
 - 5. Not even a witness of bodily resurrection can cure this unbelief. LUK 16:31.
 - 6. The only miracle that can persuade natural man to believe is a new birth by the Spirit of God. **1CO 2:14; JOH 3:3.**
- C. While on the cross in weakness (**2CO 13:4**), His detractors suddenly found the bold speech they could not muster when He walked among them and spoke boldly. **JOH 7:26.**
 - 1. In previous challenges Christ had stopped their mouths with sound doctrine.
 - TIT 1:9-11 c/w LUK 13:17; MAT 22:41-46.
 - 2. Cowards deride and threaten when they are safe. Give them a keyboard and a room in the basement and they are very bold.
 - 3. Pray for boldness in witness. ACT 4:29; EPH 6:19-20.
- D. Compare v. 43 with PSA 22:7-8.
 - 1. These Christ-deniers virtually spoke verbatim what was prophesied of the Christ.
 - 2. Some of the strongest proofs that Jesus was the Christ were provided by His enemies who did to Him what the Scriptures said would be done to the Christ. **ACT 13:27.**
 - 3. God made their wrath praise Him. **PSA 76:10.**
 - 4. They mocked the fact that Jesus trusted in God to deliver. c/w **HEB 2:13.**
 - a. This was a long-standing problem with Israel: trusting in other than God to deliver. **JER 11:12; 17:5; 7:4, 8; ISA 28:15; JOH 8:33.**
 - b. Jesus did not only trust God to deliver *from* evil, but *through* and *out* of evil. ACT 2:27 c/w ROM 8:37; 2TI 3:11.
 - c. Jesus believed that joy was beyond the cross and so endured their contradictions. **HEB 12:2-3.**
 - 5. Mockers not only proved Whom Jesus's Father was by their folly, they also proved who their father was. c/w **JOH 8:44.**
 - a. Like Satan at the beginning of Christ's ministry (**MAT 4:1-3**), they baited Jesus with a suggestion to save Himself contrary to God's will.
 - b. Like father, like son. They didn't even need to have been in the wilderness with Satan in the tempation: his spirit works everywhere in the children of disobedience. **EPH 2:2.**
- E. They taunted, "He saved others; himself he cannot save..." (v. 42).
 - 1. This insinuated that His other miracles were likely shams. c/w MAT 12:24.
 - 2. They unwittingly spoke truth in their mockery but they had a corrupt twist in it.
 - 3. Christ's power to save was not limited by His ability but only by His covenant duty.

MAT 16:21.

- 4. He could have forsaken His duty, come down from the cross and saved Himself but to what value?
 - a. They still wouldn't believe, and He would have been disobedient, a sinner.
 - b. It was more important that the Scriptures be fulfilled. **MAT 26:53-54.**
 - c. One of the greatest expressions of power is not using it.
 - d. Without His death there is no New Testament, redemption or eternal life. **HEB 9:15-16.**
- 5. Christ was not only "...not easily provoked" (**1CO 13:5**), He was not *oppressively* provoked.
 - a. In this He was, thankfully, greater than Moses. **PSA 106:32-33.**
 - b. Life and death are in the power of the tongue (**PRO 18:21**), and our salvation hung on His power of restraint. **1PE 2:22-24**.
- F. The taunters also wanted Him to prove He was the King of Israel by coming down from the cross. **v. 42.**
 - 1. But the proof that Jesus was God's Son and Israel's King was not by coming down from the cross but by *coming up from grave*! **ROM 1:4.**
 - 2. David had an eye on His resurrection when He saw the Messianic Son of God coronated. ACT 2:29-32.
 - 3. God was not lying to David about the certainty of his seed's reign---from heaven! **PSA 89:35-37.**
 - 4. There was a great deal at stake by Christ not coming down from that cross: eternal life by His death, justification by His resurrection (**ROM 4:25**), a New Testament for all nations, reign over all things from heaven (**1PE 3:22**), victory over death and Satan, and a lively hope for all believers. **1PE 1:3**.
- G. We prove that we are sons of God by embracing His cross and His resurrection.
 - 1. We forsake all denial of the finished work of redemption from the cross. **HEB 1:3 c/w GAL 3:13.**
 - 2. We glory in it to the exclusion of our own merit. GAL 6:14.
 - 3. We bear our own cross of submission to God after His model. MAT 10:37-39.
 - 4. This is Christ's death and resurrection in action in our lives. **ROM 6:4, 10-11.**
 - 5. The life of submitted obedience is called *walking after the Spirit*. **ROM 8:1.**
 - 6. Submitted saints led by the Spirit of God are the sons of God and kings of His Israel. ROM 8:13-14; 5:21; REV 1:5-6 c/w GAL 6:15-16.
