
* THANKSGIVING MEALS - VOLUNTEERS NEEDED -

Dear Pastor Ryniewicz and the People of Good Shepherd,

My records show that we received another \$50 gift from the church and we again have the joy of thanking you for your partnership in our medical and water mission to the people of Haiti. We continue to be touched by your faithfulness in caring for those in need as our Lord did. Your support of The Good Shepherd Foundation has been invaluable. As you well know, you have enabled us to touch many thousands of lives with medical care that eases the suffering, and indeed saves the lives of men, women and children in Haiti.

We are sad to report that it looks like the Rotary International is reneging on their October 22, 2020 commitment to grant our water project grant. We are still working out possible alternatives and will keep you informed. To say we are disappointed is the greatest understatement of a lifetime!

Sadly, the political situation in all of Haiti seems to continue to get worse, and our patients sometimes fear going out onto the roads to get to the clinic. The cost of gas is \$25 per gallon, making our clinic costs outrageous. Mercifully, our medical staff is still travelling to the clinic when they are able and continue to see patients and provide needed medications. We are hoping that we can get there soon, just to review what is happening in the clinic, but it does not look good yet. The staff keeps us well updated, but it is so much better with a hands-on visit.

God has been good to us through your faithful generosity and we thank you for this most amazing support in showing God's love. What a blessing you have been in so very many ways.

We pray in thanksgiving for your support, and, we continue to need your prayers. Please remember to include our work and the people we will be treating in the congregation's prayers during worship on Sundays. Both they, all the people of Haiti, and our volunteer staff, and the Haitian doctors and nurses need that spiritual support.




COVENANT TO CARE THANKSGIVING FOOD DONATIONS

Sunday, November 21, 2021 Last Sunday after Pentecost

Prayer of the Day: Almighty and ever– living God, you anointed your beloved Son to be priest and sovereign forever. Grant that all people of the earth, now divided by the power of sin, may be united by the glorious and gentle rule of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

First Reading: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

Psalm: 93 (2)

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1

Gospel: John 18:33-37



1 Corinthians 1

Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes, To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind— just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you— so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength. Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God. He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

John 18:33-37

Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?" Pilate replied, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here." Pilate asked him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."
