




Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Weekly Update Wednesday, November 10, 2021

OUR PARTNER MINISTRY - THE GOOD SHEPHERD FOUNDATION



I'm Karen Jackson and as our congregational spokesperson for what has become our partner ministry to The Good Shepherd Foundation in Haiti, I'm here to thank you all for your continuing and amazingly generous support for this vital health ministry in this, the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere and one of the world's poorest. As most of you know, for the past 5 or more years, as part of our 6 week Lenten journey, we have focused on raising money to support the Foundation's efforts to provide basic health care clinics and clean drinking water to the people in the remote Gran Saline area of Haiti. The challenges these people face are monumental, only made worse by recent events; yet another devastating earthquake followed by the assassination of their president leading to increased chaos and the rise of violent gang activity. As you have no doubt heard in the news, conditions in Haiti have become ever more dire. Due to the dangerous situation there, most non-profit aid organizations have left the country.

However, there is positive news to report: despite these seemingly insurmountable obstacles, The Good Shepherd Foundation continues to serve the desperate needs of their community. Due to the very remote location of the clinic and the very dedicated Haitian doctor and nurses who serve it, the clinic has still been able to serve an average of 180 people every 3 weeks!

Gang violence in the countryside has become an increasing threat to both staff and patients. It's a no win situation. If the staff does not make the dangerous trip to the clinic, their patients don't get life-saving treatment and medications and they also lose essential income. Patients and staff risk a lot in leaving the relative safety of their homes but the potential loss of critical medical care and/or income keep both staff and patients coming. God continues to bless this ministry through a small but very dedicated staff and support from people like us thousands of miles away. So, an update to what is happening in the community...

In addition to providing previously unavailable medical care to the area, The Good Shepherd Foundation realized that unsanitary drinking water in that region was a major factor in prevalent chronic diseases. The focus of their mission expanded to repairing old non-functioning wells, creating new, more easily maintained wells and building sanitary community latrines. Our generous Good Shepherd flock has been a primary provider for these initiatives. In the last 2 years alone, we have raised over \$15,000 which has not only paid for the ever increasing cost of patient care, (primarily due to transportation issues getting medicines) medical equipment, new wells and a latrine, but also other things not before thought possible. Foundation director Linda McGurn attributes one of their most recent "miraculous additions" to our congregation: thanks to our donations, they now have solar powered electricity and running water, unheard of in that area! They now have the ability to keep medications like insulin which require refrigeration in a small refrigerator at the clinic and also have the luxury of a small x-Ray machine. Truly a miracle! In addition to our ongoing clinic support, earlier this year members of our congregation generously responded to the clinic staff's urgent request for funding to enable them to make the dangerous journey to the area affected by the earthquake and provide medical care to the desperate victims. All they needed was money for gas and supplies, their time was volunteered. We were able to collect over \$2000 in donations, making it possible for more than 2,000 earthquake victims to be treated and cared for over 6 days. You generosity is a God-given gift of healing to a hurting people! Thank you!

The local medical team of The Good Shepherd Foundation truly have a love of their fellow country folk and feel called by God to serve them as best they can, sometimes at great risk to themselves. Our ability here at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Monroe, Connecticut to help make that possible is truly a blessing and also a calling. Thank you all for your continued prayers and generous giving, lives are being saved because of you!

Sunday, November 14, 2021 Twenty - fifth Sunday after Pentecost

Prayer of the Day: Almighty God, your sovereign purpose brings salvation to birth. Give us faith to be steadfast amid the tumults of this world, trusting that your kingdom comes and your will is done through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

First Reading: Daniel 12:1-3

Psalm: 16 (9)

Second Reading: Hebrews 10:11-14 [15-18] 19-25

Gospel: Mark 13:1-8



Hebrews 10:11-14 [15-18] 19-25

And every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, 'he sat down at the right hand of God', and since then has been waiting 'until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet.' For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified.[And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us, for after saying, 'This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the Lord: I will put my laws in their hearts, and I will write them on their minds', he also adds, 'I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more.' Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin.]

A Call to Persevere

Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

Mark 13:1-8

As he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!" Then Jesus asked him, "Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down." When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, "Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?" Then Jesus began to say to them, "Beware that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and they will lead many astray. When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birthpangs.
