## Lent is a season of Reflection.

It is not supposed to be solemn, unless it's the first day of Lent, "Ash Wednesday". Rather it is a sober reflection. The traditional reflecting of Lent is usually grounded in the truth of the sobering words of Ash Wednesday, "remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." It seems to me, however, that we have been reflecting pretty relentlessly on our mortality these past two years. The point of the gospel is not to make us depressed. A world plague and millions dead can do enough of that.

Here's an idea - this Lent, reflect on the specific ways God has loved you and how God is loving you. Sure we all say, "God loves me and you." Let us be specific now, by asking, "HOW?". Concretely, how is God, has this God done so? If I begin to journal a list, I DO believe it will take 40 days to recall my entire life and ponder examples of God loving me. Inner lights, coincidences, specific people, pets, sunsets, movies, books, poetry, music, groups, incidents, mentors, friends and the list goes on. And the telling to ourselves of the Living God's Hesed. That is faithful love in our lives and it will allow Lent as a "Journey to Greater Wholeness".

## Sunday, February 27, 2022 - Last Sunday After Epiphany

**Prayer of the Day**: Holy God, mighty and immortal, you are beyond our knowing, yet we see your glory in the face of Jesus Christ. #### 2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2



Since, then, we have such a hope, we act with great boldness, not like Moses, who put a veil over his face to keep the people of Israel from gazing at the end of the glory that was being set aside. But their minds were hardened. Indeed, to this very day, when they hear the reading of the old covenant, that same veil is still there, since only in Christ is it set aside. Indeed, to this very day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their minds; but when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit.

Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practice cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God.

#### Luke 9:28-36 [37-43a]

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" —not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.[

On the next day, when they had come down from the mountain, a great crowd met him. Just then a man from the crowd shouted, "Teacher, I beg you to look at my son; he is my only child. Suddenly a spirit seizes him, and all at once he shrieks. It convulses him until he foams at the mouth; it mauls him and will scarcely leave him. I begged your disciples to cast it out, but they could not." Jesus answered, "You faithless and perverse generation, how much longer must I be with you and bear with you? Bring your son here." While he was coming, the demon dashed him to the ground in convulsions. But Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit, healed the boy, and gave him back to his father.

And all were astounded at the greatness of God. While everyone was amazed at all that he was doing, he said to his disciples,]
