




Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Weekly Update Wednesday, January 5, 2022

A Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Congregation

The Journey Between Promise and Fulfillment

God showed Abraham the stars in the sky and promised him descendants just as numerous, if he would leave his home and all that was familiar and move to an unknown country at the age of 75. God showed Joseph in a dream that one day those horrible older brothers of his would bow down to him. God showed 3 astrologers from Persia a star and led them on a journey to see the One bom to be King of the Jews, and as it turned out, so much more.

For Abraham, for Joseph, and for the 3 astrologers, those visions were a high point of their lives. God had shown up, given them a vision of their deepest desire, their most daring dream, their most dazzling delight, and PROMISED that if they trusted in God's love and power, they would receive all they ever wanted. Can you imagine their awe, their excitement, their exceeding joy? And then came the journey itself.

Abraham and Sarah kept waiting, week after week, month after month, year after year, for 25 years for Isaac to be born. Abraham had to wait from the time he was 75 until the time he was 100 and Sarah has to wait from the time she was 65 until the time she was 90 for them to have Isaac! That could not have been easy.

After 17-year-old Joseph was given a dream of a glorious future, his brothers sold him into slavery and he was taken to Egypt and just when things began to look up for him, he was propositioned by Pharaoh's wife, and when he resisted, was unjustly accused, placed in a dungeon, and for all intents and purposes forgotten. It was 12 years of trials before he became Pharaoh's right hand, and nearly another decade before the dream of his family bowing down to him came true.

The journey of the 3 astrologers was likely not easy either. Imagine setting out on foot or on camel on a journey towards a destination that is by no means sure, so there's no map as you'll be following a star. It could be a journey of 5000 miles and could last the better part of the year or more. You have to carry all you'll need with you – or enough things to barter or trade with to pay for your food and lodging along the way. The star is only visible on clear nights, so you've got to travel when the roads are the least safe. The journey takes more than the 4 months you'd anticipated and ends up being close to 2 years.

It's so easy for us to focus on God's promises and God's fulfilling of those promises in Scripture without stopping to think about the journey in between. And yet it's in that in-between place that you and I

live.

I believe that God calls each and every one of us to journey towards our deepest desire, our most daring dream, our most dazzling delight. What is the deepest desire of your heart? What is God calling you to do and to be? Where do you want to get before your life on this planet ends? When we first understand that call, that vision, that promise, we are filled with hope and excitement and joy. But then comes the journey – and not just the outer journey, but the inner one, because in order to follow faithfully and get where God is taking us on our outer journey, we need to follow faithfully along that inner journey. That means reaching down deep into our spirits to connect with God, to open ourselves to God's direction, and to receive from God all we will need to sustain us on our journey.

For me, 2022 will begin just that way as I commit to a 21-day course of prayer and fasting. The fasting part is driven by the desire to lower my cholesterol, break my sugar addiction, and lose the weight added during the pandemic by following a cleansing diet. The prayer part is driven by my desire to be more attuned to following God, so that I don't end up like Israel for whom an 11-day journey to the promised land ended up taking 40 years!

I invite you to join me in 21-days of prayer and fasting, beginning Sunday January 9th. If you're interested, text or call or email me, and we can discuss your physical and/or spiritual goals and potential resources to help.

I know that for me the key is to hold onto the dream, no matter how impossible it is, and to trust that if I watch and listen for God, if I pay attention to how God is working in my life, if I do what God calls me to do, God will fulfill the deepest desires of my heart, God will help me to grow into my fullest potential, and God will get me to exactly the place I'm supposed to be.

I pray that you will hold onto whatever promise God has made to you, whatever vision God has shown you, whatever dream God has planted in your heart. And I pray that God will guide you every step of the way on your Journey between Promise and Fulfillment.

Lutheran Disaster Relief seeks support to assist Colorado wildfire victims

On Dec. 30, the Marshall Fire ignited in Boulder County, Colorado. Over 6,200 acres burned quickly, forcing the evacuations of 35,000 people. The fire spread throughout suburban neighborhoods, destroying at least 500 homes. While December wildfires are rare, the severe drought in the western United States created hazardous conditions that allowed the Marshall Fire to spread rapidly.

Lutheran Disaster Response is engaging with the Rocky Mountain Synod and Lutheran Family Services Rocky Mountains to respond to the impact of the fires. They anticipate that immediate needs will include emotional and spiritual care, temporary shelters, food and other necessities. With local partners, Lutheran Disaster Response will continue to accompany survivors throughout the years of long-term recovery.

The Monroe Food Pantry provides emergency food assistance for over 100 needy individuals and families in Monroe each month. The Social Ministry and Community Outreach Committee invite you to contribute items to the Shepherd's Pantry located in the narthex. You may drop them off during office hours, or on Sunday mornings. The items are delivered to the Monroe Food Pantry once a month. Items needed include:

- Juice (apple, cranberry, etc)
- Mayonnaise, Mustard, Ketchup
- Canned Vegetables
- Grape Jelly, Strawberry Jam
- Hamburger Helper, Knorr Pasta/Rice Sides, Macaroni & Cheese
- Egg Noodles
- Rice (brown or white)
- Hot & Cold Cereal
- Bread Crumbs
- Canned Tomatoes (crushed, whole, diced, stewed, paste)
- Chicken, Beef, or Vegetable Broth

Sunday, January 9, 2022 - Time After Epiphany

Acts 8:14-17

Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Luke 3:15-17, 21-22

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."
