




Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Weekly Update Wednesday, May 4, 2022

Dear Pastor Ryniewicz and the People of Good Shepherd,

This is beyond words. It would be hard to thank you sufficiently for the gifts we have received this year from the church. Your recent checks for \$400 and 11,425 have come at a time when we are reaching out to our patients in different and God-sent ways. And so, we again have the joy of thanking you for your partnership in our medical and water mission to the people of Haiti. We continue to be touched by your faithfulness in caring for those in need as our Lord did.

We have amazing news. We began our daily clinic onsite on March 23rd and it is going incredibly well. I don't yet have details, but we are hearing that Oskar is seeing 100 or more people each week and we are already talking about increasing staff there to meet the needs of the patients. He has delivered a baby, is giving home PT to 2 stroke patients, sent a young girl to the hospital for appendicitis, and that was just last week! We are now holding clinics, 5 days per week, for 4 hours per day, with Oskar also on call and an MD on call for physician referral.

This is nothing short of amazing! Our next goal is to begin nutrition care, an infant formula program, and prenatal care, as funds become available. We are currently in the process of finding a way to set up a lab onsite, for immediate diagnoses.

This is truly miraculous, and we thank you and your faithful generosity, along with the generous gifts of so many of God's people. We pray in thanksgiving for your support, and, we continue to need your prayers. Please remember to include our work and the people we will be treating in the congregation's prayers during worship on Sundays. Both they, all the people of Haiti, our volunteer staff, and the Haitian doctors and nurses need that spiritual support.

Wishing you Easter blessings as we walk with and serve the risen Christ!


