




For those being Confirmed, some important dates are:

If you have not done so already, please contact Pastor Doug by text, or phone at 860-595-9560 to confirm attendance at the Retreat and Confirmation.






The Good Shepherd Book Club will meet again on October 5th at 2:00pm.



Dear Pastor Ryniewicz and the People of Good Shepherd,

Once again, thank you so very much for your generosity and support of The Good Shepherd Foundation with your recent gift of \$467 to support Earthquake Relief in Southern Haiti. It means a great deal to the people we are serving.

As you know, we continue to hold clinics at the new rate of every 3 weeks, hoping to stem the tide of serious illness by being available in shorter intervals for our patients. We continue to be extremely proud of the fact that almost 100% of all money donated to TGSF goes directly to providing care for the people we serve who have little other opportunity for healthcare.

As you also know, a devastating 7.3 magnitude earthquake struck Haiti at 8:30 am on August 14, 2021. It has been reported that over 2,000 people lost their lives and those injured have surpassed 10,000. Medical help is sorely needed to save as many people as possible. We are pleased to announce that, in addition to our regular clinic, The Good Shepherd Foundation has medical and nursing staff in Haiti who have already travelled to the southern and hardest hit areas of the country, due to the generosity of you and many others. The first 3-day clinic saw almost 1,000 patients with medical care and we are planning a second trip as soon as it is safe to travel (gangs are again roaming the countryside!).

Your gift will help provide the just over \$US 6,000 to bring medication and supplies as well as the salaries, transportation, lodging and food for four nurses, a pharmacy assistant, and two doctors to provide a three-day clinic to serve the injured in this badly affected area. Our team has also brought along 4 volunteers to assist with their work!

We pray in thanksgiving for your support, and, we continue to need your prayers. Please continue to include our work and the people we will be treating in the congregation's prayers during worship on Sundays. Both they and our volunteer staff, and the Haitian doctors and nurses need that spiritual support.

Sunday, September 19, 2021 Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost

Prayer of the Day: O God, our teacher and guide, you draw us to yourself and welcome us as beloved children. Help us to lay aside all envy and selfish ambition, that we may walk in your ways of wisdom and understanding as servants of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

First Reading: Jeremiah 11:18-20 or Wisdom 1:16-2:1, 12-22

Psalm 54(4) Second Reading: James 3:13-4:3, 7-8a Gospel: Mark 9:30-37



James 3:13-4:3, 7-8a

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace. Those conflicts and disputes among you, where do they come from? Do they not come from your cravings that are at war within you? You want something and do not have it; so you commit murder. And you covet something and cannot obtain it; so you engage in disputes and conflicts. You do not have, because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, in order to spend what you get on your pleasures. Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded.

Mark 9:30-37

They went on from there and passed through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed, he will rise again." But they did not understand what he was saying and were afraid to ask him.

Then they came to Capernaum; and when he was in the house he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest. He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." Then he took a little child and put it among them; and taking it in his arms, he said to them, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me."
