Summit PPO has 3 tiers of coverage for different groups of clinicians. You receive the best value when you choose high-quality care from Kaiser Permanente clinicians. When choice is most important, you have access to more than 1 million in-network health professionals anywhere in the United States.

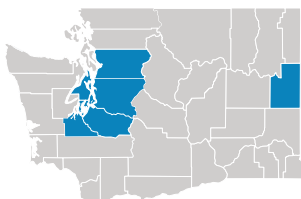
- Tier 1 offers in-network care from Kaiser Permanente providers and pharmacies, as well as preferred contracted providers and hospitals. It's the highest-value, lowest-cost choice.
- Tier 2 includes in-network care from other providers, including First Choice Health providers and First Health providers.
- Tier 3 includes care from out-of-network, licensed providers at higher costs.

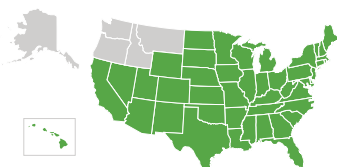
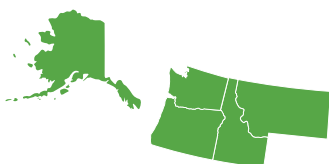
