




Poppy Instructions


A bright and resilient flower that flourished on the stark battlefields of the Great War the poppy inspired the poem 'In Flanders Fields.'

This led to the red poppy becoming a longstanding symbol of both Remembrance and hope for a peaceful future, worn as a show of support for the Armed Forces community.











1. Start by cutting out the red square piece of paper and folding it in half diagonally.







3. And one more time.




4. Cut into a petal shape.



5. Cut end off tip.



6. Cut out and fold the stem.



7. Repeat the process with the second red square and the smaller black squares.



8. Glue them all together to finish your poppy. To make your poppy extra sturdy, fasten everything together with a paper fastener.
