**Step 1:** Cut out a rectangle in the front and back of your box.

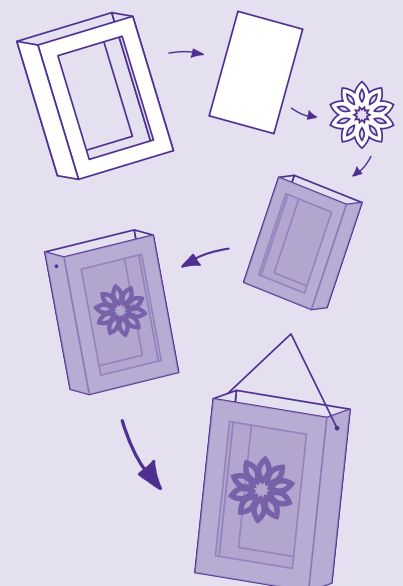
**Step 2:** Use the off-cuts to make whatever shape or pattern you like (you can also use other elements like leaves).

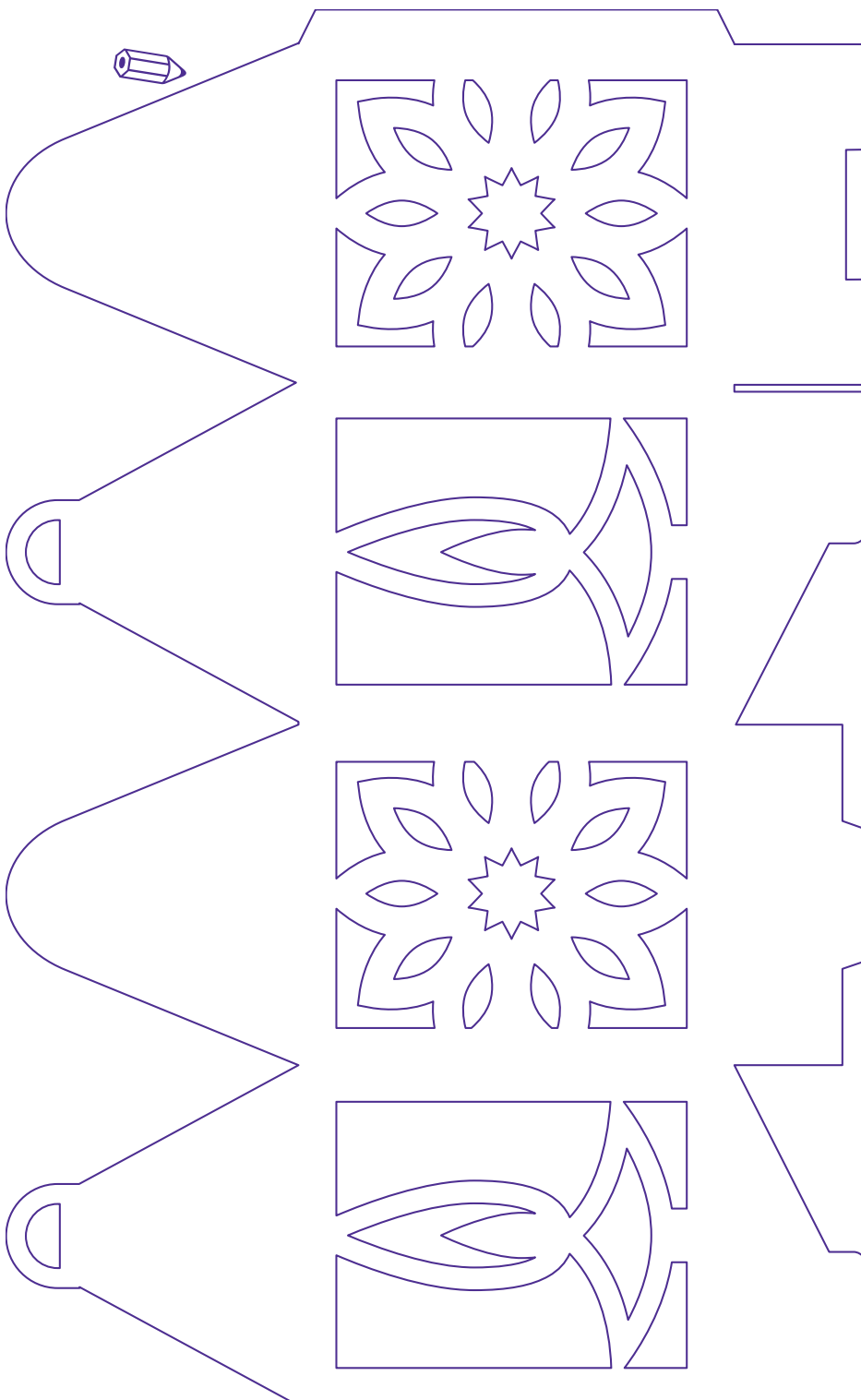
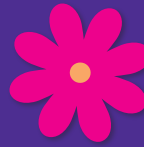
