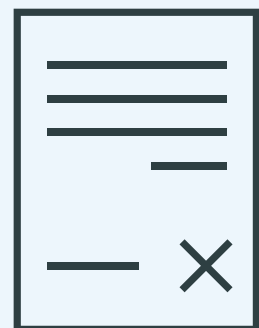

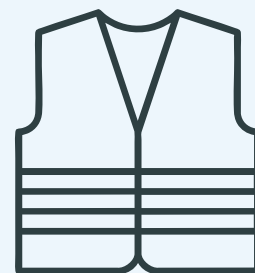

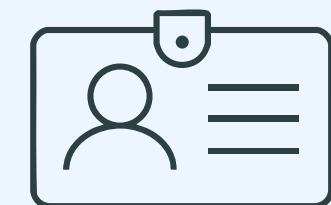

# Points	Sanction
1	Warning letter
2	Warning letter
3	Safety & Security test
4	Pass suspension 7 days
5	Warning letter

10	Safety & Security test
11	Warning letter
12	Pass suspension 28 days
13	(Un)specified pass blocking



Point Reduction

After 6 months without any
violations, 1 point will be
deducted. From 13 points
onwards, the Schiphol pass will
be revoked; reapplication and
full reassessment are required
for any new access.



-1 point
Per 6 months
without violation(s)

From the total points, the most severe corresponding sanction from the table above is leading.

Points system | Consequences of risk exposure

Example of a violation with different levels of risk exposure

Violation	Example	Risk exposure & circumstances	Consequence & sanction
Article 14F Smoking outside designated smoking areas	1.	The Schiphol pass holder was found smoking just outside the designated smoking area.	The initial violation results in 1 penalty point, without any further increase. In this case, the risk factor does not apply.
	2.	The Schiphol pass holder was found smoking near an aircraft during refueling.	Due to this situation, the pass holder endangered both themselves and others. The initial violation accounts for 1 penalty point, but because of the increased risk factor, the number of points may be raised, subject to assessment by the SAA Backoffice.
