


We will use opportunities at officer seminars, safety campaigns and vessel visits to emphasise the human elements that are often present in the chain of events leading up to accidents and incidents.

Utilising digital platforms we will analyse our accident and near miss reports to identify and trend root cause factors with an aim to proactively target weak areas.

Global security challenges, including emerging cyber security threats remain a concern. We will continue to engage the industry in developing and promoting best management practices, identifying vulnerable areas in our operations and assets and ensure that we have robust defences in place.

Rules and Regulations

Inventories of Hazardous Material (IHM) objectives have been established for all vessels in compliance with the Hong Kong Convention and the EU Ship Recycling Regulation (latest compliance date 31 December 2020).

The revised MARPOL regulations on SOx emissions remain at 0.1% in ECA from 1 January 2015 in EU waters and 0.5% outside ECA from 2020. California port authorities also intend to reduce air pollution through mandatory use of shore power. We are exploring technology and fuel options to ensure a cost-effective compliance.

Maersk Tankers aspires to comply with the Ballast Water Convention which entered into force on 8 September 2017. We are assessing various technologies and docking strategies to find the most optimal solution considering vessel size and trade requirements.


Fuel Efficiency and Emissions

Maersk Tankers will, in addition to complying with implemented laws and regulations governing emissions of CO₂, SOx and NOx, continue to focus on improving its environmental profile.

The focus areas will build on the current execution platform and will focus even further on providing automated data transparency. This will assist the dedicated fuel efficiency team to enhance the decision making and focus on continuously improvements in close collaboration with the vessel crew, fleet group managers and voyage managers.

Maersk Tankers aims to improve EEOI by 22.5% by 2019 as compared to 2010 baseline.

Environmental Compliance

Environmental Compliance is an integral element of the Sustainable Priorities. Maersk Tankers has a Compliance culture, carefully underpinned within the shore organization and highlighted to our seafarers during Officers' seminars.

The inconsistent enforcement of environmental regulations could lead to an uneven playing field, paving the way for other operators to avoid compliance.

Maersk Tankers advocates a fair approach to ensuring compliance and believes that equitable responsibility-sharing will maintain a level playing field amongst all stakeholders.

Anti-Corruption

Maersk Tankers has signed up to the UN Global Compact and is committed to the principles therein, in addition to complying with the UK Bribery Act.

Effective from 1 October 2017 Maersk Tankers will adopt a ZERO FP policy. Any demands or harassment or suspicion of same, for bribes or facilitation payments will be escalated and reported to appropriate authorities and industry bodies.

Responsible Procurement

Our aim is that all procurement activities will be carried out in a manner that protects the environment and all employees involved in providing services and materials to Maersk Tankers. By 2019, we expect to have full traceability on country of origin for all materials purchased by Maersk Tankers.

Products and services, which are sourced from highrisk countries and/or fall within high-risk material categories, will, by 2019 be sourced from suppliers who have previously been evaluated as conducting their business in a responsible way. Suppliers will be approved based on their written self-assessment. However, in cases where there is any doubt, the approval will be after an on-site-audit, which confirms their compliance.

Labour and Human Rights

Maersk Tankers complies with the Maritime Labour Convention and the Maersk Principles on Global Labour Relations. We support and constantly strive to uphold the basic ILO principles in our daily business activities. We extend our efforts to integrate these principles in our supply chain by monitoring and providing guidance to our strategic suppliers.

In 2016 Maersk Tankers completed the human rights due diligence exercise. A Global Labour Relations project team has been established to design and implement an updated e-learning program on Labour Relations for relevant employees and key decision makers. By increasing the knowledge and awareness, we aim to highlight the importance of good labour relations.
