

## Global Digital Asset-Based Exchange Traded Products AUM Shows 14.1% Increase in April

London, UK, May 12, 2025 – Fineqia International Inc. (the "Company" or "Fineqia") (CSE: FNQ) (OTC: FNQQF) (Frankfurt: FNQA), a leading digital asset and fintech investment business, announces that its analysis of global Exchange Traded Products (ETPs) with digital assets as underlying collateral revealed Assets Under Management (AUM) grew to \$142.6 billion in April, marking a 14.1% increase from \$125 billion at the beginning of the month.

The broader digital assets market capitalisation grew by 10.3% in April, reaching \$3.05 trillion, up from \$2.77 trillion at the end of March. This indicates premium growth for ETPs backed by digital assets in the past month. ETPs holding digital assets, which include Exchange Traded Funds (ETFs) and Exchange Traded Notes (ETNs), saw a rebound in AUM in April. This follows two consecutive months of decline in AUM, reflecting a renewed appetite from investors in the past month.

"Following a two-month dip, the digital asset market came roaring back in April," said Fineqia's CEO Bundeep Singh Rangar. "The rebound in AUM and strong market growth signal a fresh wave of investor optimism."

Bitcoin (BTC) price rose 14.4% in April, ending the month at \$94,419 compared to \$82,552 at the end of March. During the same time, the AUM of ETPs holding BTC increased by 15.3%, climbing to \$125.6 billion from \$108.9 billion, reflecting both price appreciation and net inflows. This highlights a resurgence in investor interest towards BTC-linked financial products, following the negative flows observed in March.

During April, Ethereum (ETH) decreased 1.8% in value to \$1,792 from \$1,824 recorded at the end of March. In the same period, the AUM of ETPs holding ETH as underlying increased 2.2%, to \$8.62 billion from \$8.43 recorded at the end of the previous month. This indicates growing investors' interest in ETH-based financial products in recent weeks, marking the first month of positive flows for ETH ETPs in 2025 and signalling a broader resurgence in demand beyond BTC-focused instruments.

ETPs representing an index of alternative coins surged 11.5% in AUM during April, to \$4.70 billion, from \$4.22 billion recorded at the end of March. Similarly, ETPs representing diversified baskets of cryptocurrencies recorded an 8.5% rise in AUM, growing to \$3.73 billion from \$3.44 billion. These figures indicate broad-based investor interest across the digital asset sector in recent weeks, with AUM growth observed across multiple underlying assets.

ETPs include Exchange Traded Funds (ETFs) and Exchange Traded Notes (ETNs). Fineqia Research's AUM calculation factors in the launch or closure of ETPs during any stated period. The number of tracked ETPs stood at 255 as of the end of April.

All references to price are quoted in USD, and the cryptocurrency prices are sourced from CoinMarketCap and CoinGecko.
