Fire preparedness in Guatemala

In the community of Huehuetenango in Guatemala, forest fires threaten children's safety in the dry season. The local church was empowered to run training sessions and drills to teach staff, children and their families how they can stay safe.

Centre Director Luz shares, "Staff from Compassion centres participated in a brigadier training session to learn first aid, how to respond to a fire, rescue training, and CPR, and now we are training children with basic knowledge they can replicate at home."

"I had so much fun because I've never used an extinguisher before," says 8-year-old Gabriela. Her older sister Diana says, "I feel confident to know what to do in case a fire breaks out a home."



A new home for Alexis and Leyson

Brothers Alexis and Leyson lost their home to a flood during the rainy season in Peru. With bags of their wet clothes in hand, they had to move to their grandparents' for three months. The local church looked after their family during this time and, through Disaster Relief, provided materials so they could rebuild.

Alexis says, "The day it rained, I was sad and afraid and asked God for help. I thank the people from the centre. They taught us how to take someone injured to a safe place."

Maricarmen, their mother, shares, "The centre workers helped us a lot. They gave us roofing sheets and plywood for the house. We got groceries, buckets with lids to store clean water, bed covers and hygiene kits. We also got mosquito nets and repellent. We're very grateful for their support. They'd come to encourage us, pray for us and check in on us."

In March 2025, a powerful earthquake struck near Mandalay, Myanmar, devastating the lives of children and families. In the face of this crisis, your generosity ensured urgent support reached those who needed it most.
