TASTE OF AUTUIN

Roasted Japanese sweet potato is a delight typically enjoyed when strolling through the streets. The scent of freshly roasted yaki-imo can be smelled from streets away and warms you up on a chilly autumn evening. Sweet potato is very popular in Japan, and typically found in desserts, bread and even ice cream.

Kumamoto is the second-largest producer of chestnuts. From the Japanese Kuri-kinton and parfaits


to Western-inspired Mont Blanc and brûlée, chestnuts are a true indulgence in fall.

Roasted Sweet Potato Yaki-imo

The traditional thatched private houses and a mesmerizing gorge is what makes Gokanosho so idyllic. With plenty of welcoming guest houses, camping sites and training facilities, Gokanosho is the perfect spot to immerse yourself in nature and Japan's traditional cultures and history.

Named the Grand Canyon of Kyushu, the Soyo Gorge has the most picturesque view in autumn. The variety of greenery makes a wonderful color palette of fall foliage, and can be viewed from the observatory. Best visited from late October to early November.

Ume-no-ki Todoro is a 116-meter long suspension bridge in Gokanosho, from which the area's gorgeous fall foliage can be viewed. After crossing the bridge, visitors are welcomed with the relaxing sounds of the tranquil Todoro Falls. ■









Gorgeous and worthy of multiple visits, Takachiho Gorge is one of Miyazaki's most remarkable sightseeing spots. Created when Kumamoto's active volcano Mt. Aso overflowed and abrupty cooled down, Takachiho Gorge is now a unique sight, with maple trees adding gentle but vibrant colors to the gorge. November is the best time to visit for those wishing to view the enchanting momiji of Takachiho Gorge.

With an awe-inspiring view from its observation deck, the Michellin star-awarded Kunimigaoka will be one of your most unforgettable autumn memories in Kyushu.

With the marvelous combination of the calming sounds of water, surrounding cliffs and dazzling fall folliage, Shirataki Falls is a breathtaking sight and a must-visit in autumn.

Featuring exciting dance movements and colorful customes, Kagura is a traditional performing art with its origins in Shinto rites. Referred to as the season of hearty appetites, Shokuyoku no Aki, autumn is rich in festivals where Kagura is often showcased.





SHIMA

Floating on a pond and shaped like the Ginkaku-ji, Sakura no Yakata is a café where unique latte art and a variety of local delicious sweets can be enjoyed.

Just a short ride from Kagoshima City, Sengan-en is a classic Japanese-style garden with a quaint landscape design. Built in the Edo period by the Shimazu clan with the 'borrowed scenery' principle, the beautiful scene of Sakurajima and Kinko Bay can be viewed from the garden.

An incredible spot for hiking, Lake Onami is the highest crater lake in Japan. Along the trail, many hot springs, views and hidden treasures wait to be discovered. The ineffable scenery of Onami Lake is enriched with the warm colors of autumn.



With

the looks and the crunch of an apple, the fresh taste of the Japanese nashi pear is a unique experience on its own. The juicy nashi is in season and can be picked as an activity from August to October, and is enjoyed in a variety of ways.

It's as if you have stepped into a movie scene. With more than 1200 gingko trees planted in this

garden, the Senbon Icho ("Thousand Gingkos") in Tarumizu City is a golden treasure. It took more than 35 years for the owner and his wife to create this magnificent view. The best season to visit is from late November to early December.


