PROTECT AND RESTORE MARINE AND FRESHWATERS ECOSYSTEMS AND BIODIVERSITY

- Protect at least 30% and strictly protect 10% EU's sea areas
- Restore 25.000 km free flowing rivers

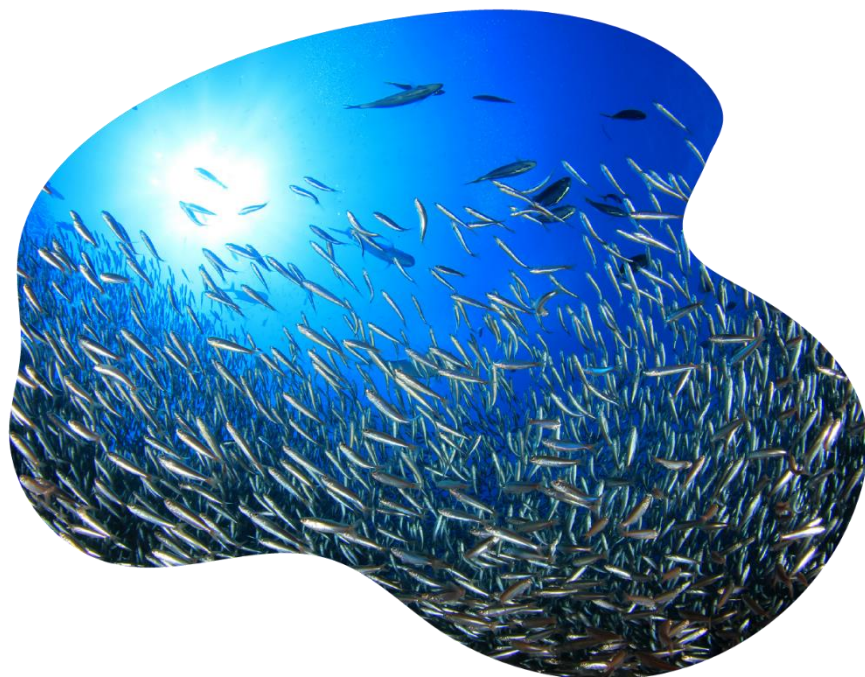
WP 2024 - Mission Ocean, seas and waters

adopted on 17 April 2024: main features

- ✓ Follows the **impact-driven logic** of Horizon Europe and European Missions
- ✓ Supports major **EU policy objectives**: EU Biodiversity Strategy 2030, EU Action Plan toward Zero pollution, the Communication on a Sustainable Blue Economy, the Marine Action Plan
- ✓ Focus on «**lighthouses**»: hubs for the development and deployment of transformative innovations (technological, social, business, governance) in the Mission **4 basins**.
- ✓ **WP 2024: 2 calls; 7 topics + 4 other actions; indicative budget EUR 127 million**
 - Call 1 focuses on Blue parks; migratory fish habitats in freshwaters; impact of fisheries on sensitive species and habitats; Citizen Science and on the co-design of a vision for a restored ocean/water system
 - Call 2 provides support to a coalition of waterfront cities, regions and islands and a comprehensive package of measures for Mission communities of actors,
 - Other actions focus on: DTO; monitoring Mission policy objectives; events; studies



Opportunities to join ongoing projects: calls for Associated Regions





Why associated regions?

- Associated Region concept conceived to support wide replication of innovative solutions.
- It addresses areas with **ecosystems that can benefit from the demonstration activities** (e.g., neighbouring regions and/or regions in a different sea basin) and/or less-developed regions, with the **need to build capacity to implement the innovative solutions** to restore marine/freshwater ecosystems.

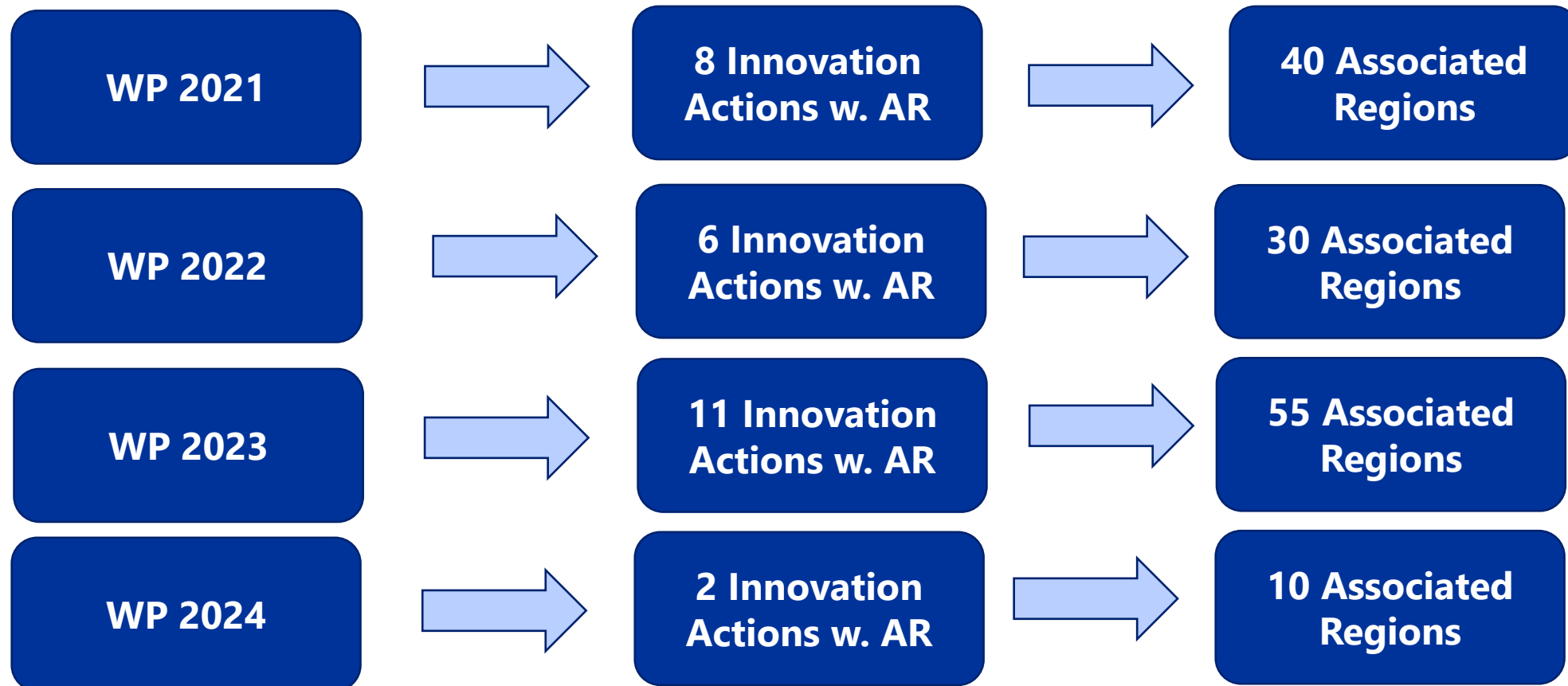


How does the associated region concept work?

- **Calls for Associated regions** organised by relevant projects, with an evaluation process based on transparent and fair procedures
- **Financial support to third parties:**
 - may only be awarded to local and/or regional authorities from an associated region.
 - the maximum amount to be granted to each associated region is EUR 100,000
- Projects should continuously share their outcomes and knowledge with the entities representing 'associated regions' and provide them with technical assistance to build capacity and to implement solutions in their territory that contribute to achieving the Mission objectives.

POLICY CONTEXT

- EU Biodiversity Strategy for 2030

European Blue Parks – Offshore marine protected areas (IA)

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- ✓ Definition of science-based conservation objectives and measures that contribute to the restoration and protection of marine ecosystems and to the management of MPAs
- ✓ Evidence for effective decision-making process at MS and AC level to ensure sustainable management of offshore MPAs
- ✓ New offshore MPAs proposed and/or established
- ✓ Improved knowledge about offshore marine ecosystems (including deep sea) and biodiversity in view of protection and conservation demo activities
- ✓ Enhancement of the provision of ecosystem services compatible with the protection and restoration of the offshore ecosystems, leading to sustainable and scalable business models
- ✓ Active support to the Mission's Digital Ocean and Water Knowledge system;
- ✓ Reinforced EU leadership in international efforts for marine protection



HORIZON-MISS-2024-OCEAN-01-01

European Blue Parks – Offshore marine protected areas (IA)

SCOPE

- Map the distribution and condition of benthic and pelagic habitats in offshore areas (beyond 12 nautical miles from the coast);
- Provide scientific basis for establishing/enlarging MPAs in offshore areas, including strictly protected ones;
- Assess pressures (including cumulative ones) in offshore areas and establishing the necessary conservation measures for MPAs, including through elaboration of their management plans and monitoring schemes.

IMPORTANT

- Additional eligibility conditions apply – use of Copernicus/Galileo/EGNOS
- FAIR approach to data to be made available via EMODNet
- Delivery of action plan and roadmap for the replication and scale up of the proposed measures, taking into account Marine Spatial Planning plans.
- Involvement of MS/AC authorities and concerned stakeholders
- Proposals addressing the EU Outermost Regions are encouraged.

Danube river basin lighthouse – Protection and restoration of migratory fish habitats (IA)

POLICY CONTEXT

- EU Biodiversity Strategy for 2030
- Marine Strategy and Water Framework Directives

- Updated River Basin Management Plan for Danube (ICPDR)

INDICATIVE BUDGET

Total: EUR 15.6 million

Per project contribution: EUR 7.8 million



HORIZON-MISS-2024-OCEAN-01-02

Danube river basin lighthouse – Protection and restoration of migratory fish habitats (IA)

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- ✓ Improved protection and management of migratory fish species in the Danube River Basin and its delta
- ✓ Measurable improvements in critical fish habitats, their availability, accessibility and connectivity within the Danube River basin and its delta
- ✓ Improved transnational and trans-sectoral cooperation between national/local authorities and other actors involved in fish habitat protection and restoration;
- ✓ Evidence to support the implementation of River Basin Management Plans addressing the needs of migratory fish species



HORIZON-MISS-2024-OCEAN-01-02

Danube river basin lighthouse – Protection and restoration of migratory fish habitats (IA)

SCOPE

- Demonstration activities to enhance a protected network of critical habitats for migratory species with a focus on:
 - endangered species of high significance for the ecosystem and/or for local communities;
 - measures combining habitat availability, accessibility and connectivity with the protection and restoration of critical habitats, such as spawning, nursery, feeding and wintering grounds
- Include impact monitoring of the activities, in cooperation with the Information System set up through previous projects
- Support inclusive and long-term management of the restored and protected ecosystems, including natural, social, economic and cultural elements and business models for generating revenue and involve for that purpose local business communities



HORIZON-MISS-2024-OCEAN-01-02

Danube river basin lighthouse – Protection and restoration of migratory fish habitats (IA)

IMPORTANT

- Additional eligibility conditions apply:
 - use of Copernicus/Galileo/EGNOS
 - demo activities in at least 3 MS/ACs of the Danube River basin
- FAIR approach to data to be made available via EMODNet
- Deliver action plan and roadmap for the replication and scale up of the solutions for fish habitat protection and restoration
- Engagement of 5 Associated Regions!

Associated Regions: Key points

- **Calls for Associated Regions** organised by relevant projects, with an evaluation based on transparent and fair procedures
- **Financial support to third parties** up to EUR100.000 per third party, may only be awarded to local and/or regional authorities from an associated region: one grant per region
- The projects should ensure that the **Associated Regions are not already involved in the demonstration sites** covered by the projects
- May be considered in your dissemination strategy and/or for the delivery of replication plans.

HORIZON-MISS-2024-OCEAN-01-03

Reducing the environmental impacts of fisheries on marine species and habitats (IA)

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- ✓ Reduction/elimination of incidental catches, discard and damage of sensitive species and juvenile fish for an accelerated transition towards more sustainable and economically viable fishing practices
- ✓ Improved mitigation measures to protect sensitive species, juvenile fish and their habitats
- ✓ Enhanced knowledge on incidental catches (e.g.: spawning grounds, locations of nursery areas; recruitment processes)
- ✓ Increased value of seafood products from sustainable fisheries



HORIZON-MISS-2024-OCEAN-01-03

Reducing the environmental impacts of fisheries on marine species and habitats (IA)

SCOPE

- Identify, test, validate and demonstrate in real conditions innovative and economically viable solutions, technologies, practices and processes to mitigate the impact of fisheries
- Focus on all following issues:
 - demonstration of mitigation measures and sustainable fishing tools (e.g. : innovative gears, techniques to improve selectivity/bycatches);
 - demonstration of mitigation measures and sustainable fishing operations (e.g.: restricted areas, temporal/special closures, safe handling of bycaught species, experimental restocking);
 - assessment of the operational feasibility in commercial fishery situations and support broad uptake of solutions
- Each proposal should address one sea basin i.e.: Atlantic and Arctic basin; Mediterranean sea basin, Baltic and North Sea basin

IMPORTANT

- **Additional eligibility conditions apply:**
 - **use of Copernicus/Galileo/EGNOS**
 - **demo activities in at least 3 MS/ACs of the basin addressed by the proposal**
- **FAIR approach to data to be made available via EMODNet**
- **Involvement of end-users and fisheries communities as well as relevant authorities**
- **Deliver action plan and roadmap for the replication and scale up of the solutions for sustainable operations and tools**
- **Proposals addressing the EU Outermost Regions are encouraged.**

Science for Community– Building the Marine Citizen Science data network of the future to valorise data from the ocean and increase engagement (CSA)

POLICY CONTEXT

- Mission ocean and waters enablers:

Science for Community – Building the Marine Citizen Science data network of the future to valorise data from the ocean and increase engagement (CSA)

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- ✓ Establishment of a pan-European Marine Citizen Science data network
- ✓ Data and metadata standards and methodological approaches based on existing European frameworks (such as SeaDataNet, EMODnet and other marine data infrastructures)
- ✓ Increased visibility and impact of Marine Citizen Science activities
- ✓ Good practices on Marine Citizen Science information and data consumption



HORIZON-MISS-2024-OCEAN-01-04

Science for Community– Building the Marine Citizen Science data network of the future to valorise data from the ocean and increase engagement (CSA)

SCOPE

- Three groups of activities.
 1. **Establishment of a Marine Citizen Science network**, bringing together relevant actors active in citizen science and data collection;
 2. **Information and data collection**, making them FAIR (findable, accessible, interoperable and reusable) and integrated in existing management platforms (e.g: EMODnet, Blue Economy Observatory, etc.) and eventually available for use in the European Digital Twin Ocean;
 3. **Support the deployment of cost-efficient citizen science observing devices/equipment** through two use-cases to demonstrate in real conditions the benefits of standardised and simple-to-use devices for citizen science campaigns.

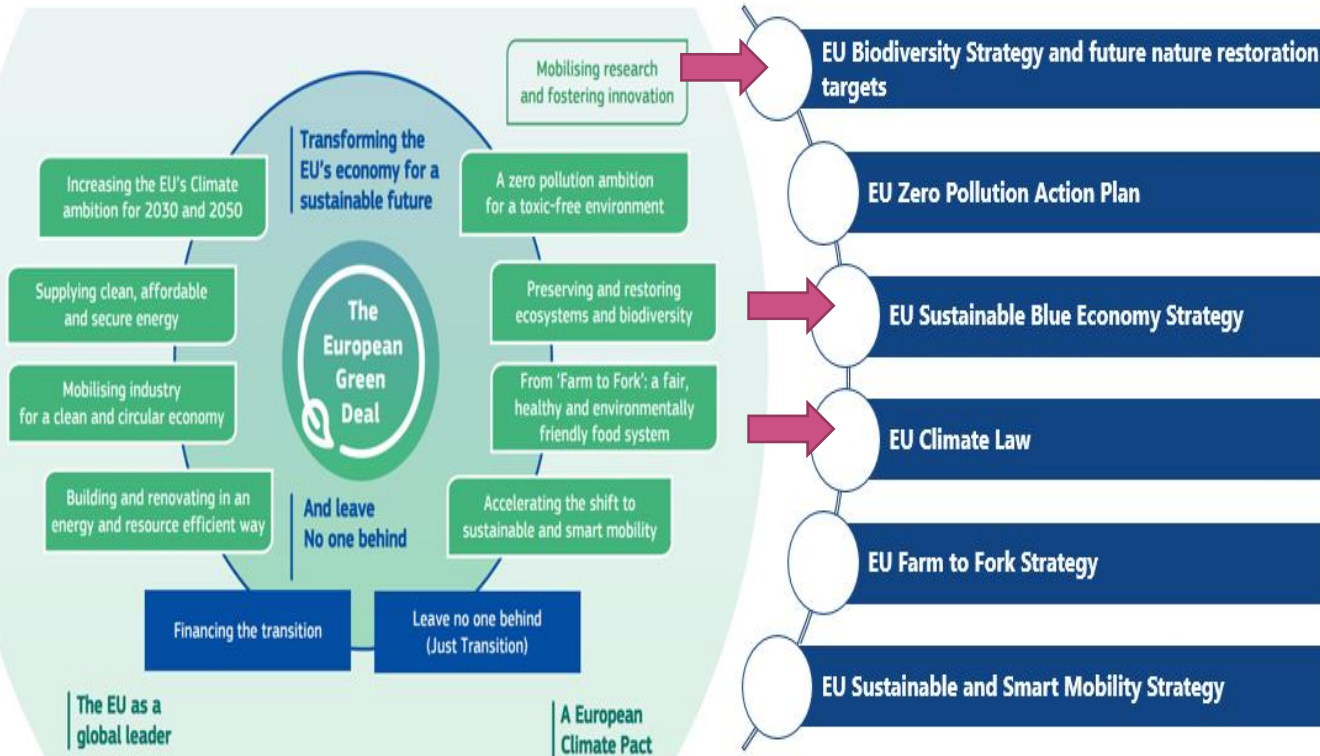

Our Blue Future – Co-designing a future vision of a restored ocean and water system in the EU by 2030 and 2050 (IA)

POLICY CONTEXT



EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- ✓ Increased confidence in and support for the transitions required by the European Green Deal, by co-designing possible science-based transition scenarios .
- ✓ Mission progress is supported by co-designed inspiring narratives that stimulate effective action and by identified pathways for their realisation.
- ✓ Increased awareness of decision-makers, stakeholders and citizens, including students, on the urgency of the climate, biodiversity and pollution crises and the central role of restoring the entire water system to address these crises.
- ✓ National, regional and local decision-makers are supported in planning decisions and in taking measures to protect and restore their ocean, coastal and water spaces and ecosystems.



HORIZON-MISS-2024-OCEAN-01-05

Our Blue Future – Co-designing a future vision of a restored ocean and water system in the EU by 2030 and 2050 (IA)

SCOPE

- Develop and co-design futures of the EU, in which the Ocean, seas and waters are conserved or restored to good health.
- Co-creation of scenarios, narratives and transition pathways for EU ocean and water spaces for 2030 and 2050, incl. a business-as-usual and a scenario where Mission and EGD objectives are achieved.
- Develop both a pan-European and specific visions for each of the four Mission lighthouse areas in the Atlantic-Arctic, Danube, Mediterranean Sea, Baltic and North Sea.
- Develop a map and interactive, dynamic and digital visualisation tools and applications compatible with the EU Digital Twin Ocean

INDICATIVE BUDGET

Total: EUR 3.0 million

Per project contribution: EUR 3.0 million

IMPORTANT

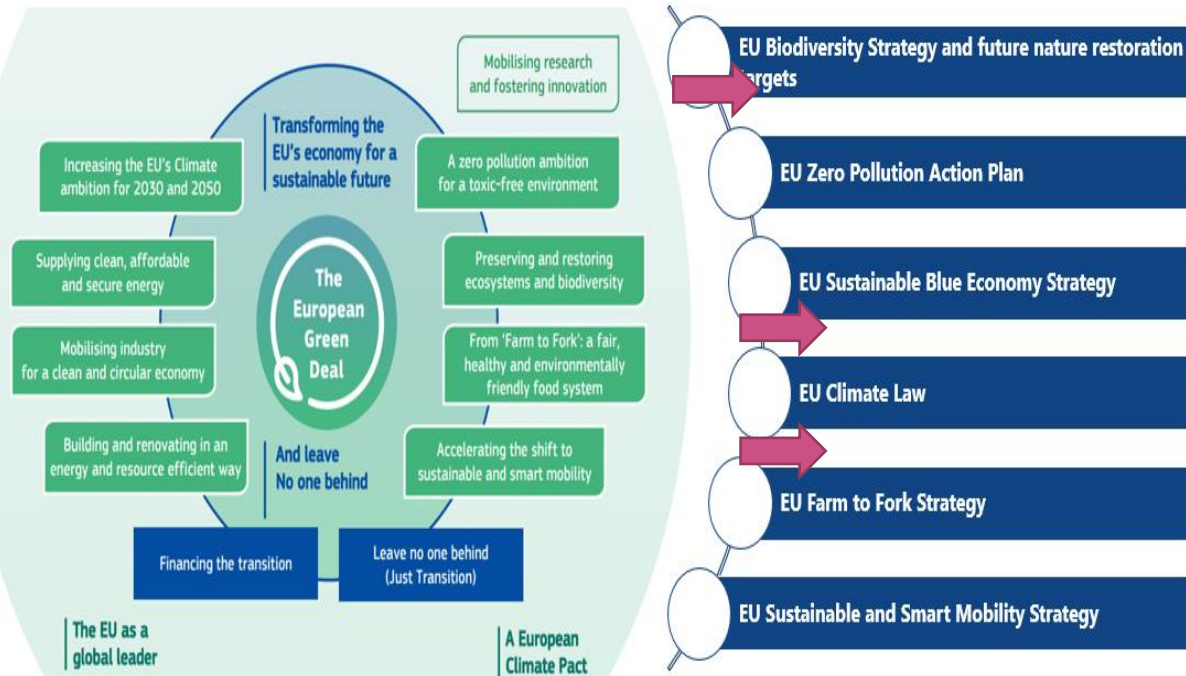
- Involvement of citizens incl students and key stakeholders such as scientists, experts and decision-makers
- Minimum of four large scale case-studies
- Work closely with other Horizon Europe Mission projects and MISP
- Contributions of social sciences and humanities (SSH) disciplines and the involvement of SSH experts

POLICY CONTEXT



EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- ✓ Demonstration of measurable, verifiable and ambitious progress towards reaching one or several interlinked objectives and targets of the Mission through implementation of effective and well-managed community-led pilot actions and other types of support to Mission communities of actors
- ✓ A concrete contribution to support Member States/Associated countries, their national, regional and/or local authorities, all concerned stakeholders, to implement related EU legislation
- ✓ Mobilised and engaged Mission communities of actors (regions, ports, cities, islands, etc.)
- ✓ Leveraged resources and investments to restore the ocean, seas and waters
- ✓ Increased readiness at local level to deploy at scale innovative solutions to restore the ocean, seas and waters



HORIZON-MISS-2024-OCEAN-02-01

Community-led actions to restore our ocean, seas and waters (RIA)

SCOPE

- ✓ Mobilising a broad set of actors to take meaningful action to restore our ocean, seas and waters.
- ✓ Practical, easily accessible support for established or emerging communities of actors to facilitate:
 - ✓ the deployment at scale of innovative actions, measures and initiatives contributing to the Mission's objectives, and
 - ✓ the transformations required at national, regional, and local level.
- ✓ Each proposed action under this topic should address 1 of the 4 basins covered by the Mission and should foresee all of the following types of support to Mission communities of actors of the respective basin:
 - ✓ financial support to third parties (also referred to as cascading grants) to **community-led pilot actions**
 - ✓ cascading grants for **transition agendas**
 - ✓ **technical assistance**, to be provided by the consortium.

INDICATIVE BUDGET

Total: EUR 50.0 million

Per project contribution: EUR 12.5 million

IMPORTANT

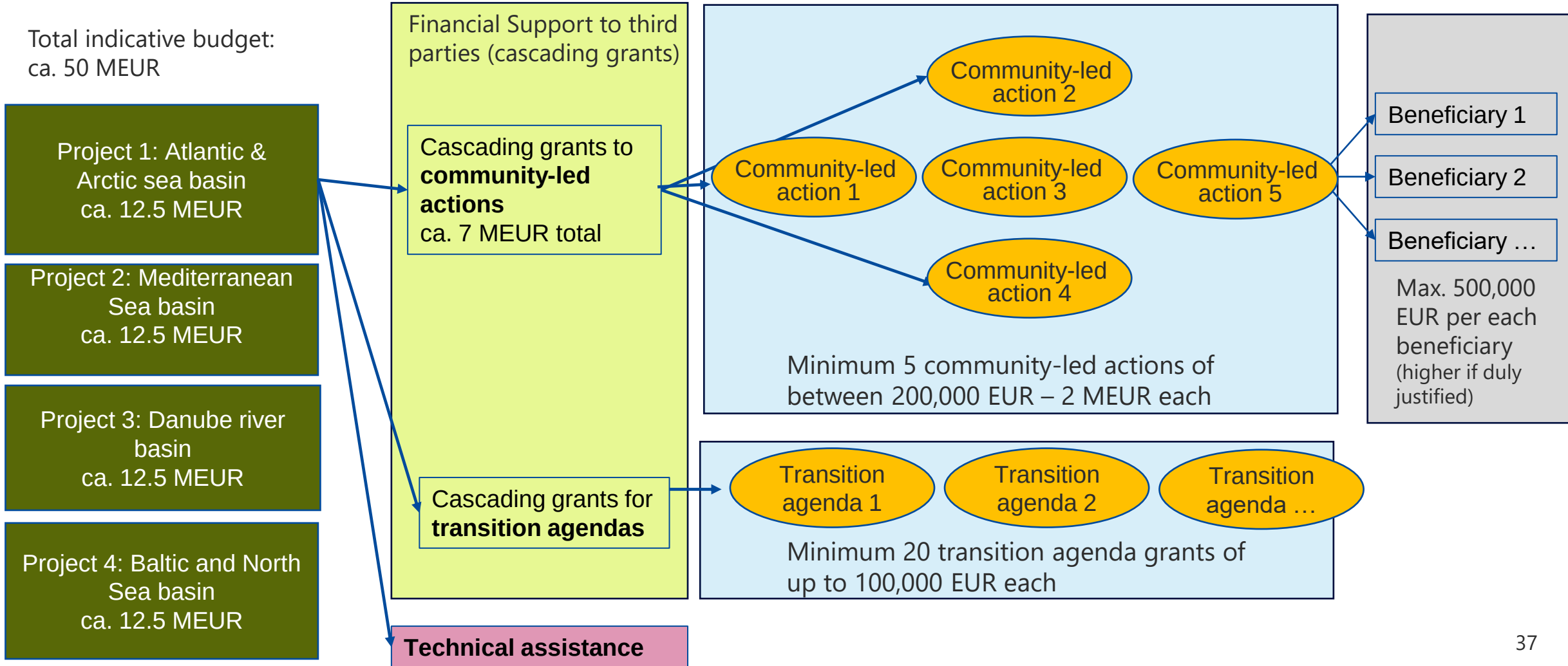
- the best proposal in each Mission Lighthouse will be funded
- the consortium must include beneficiaries from at least 2 regions, represented by the relevant public authorities, or associations thereof from the respective lighthouse area/basin covered by the proposal.
- A recipient may only benefit from the financial support to third parties once within the duration of the project.

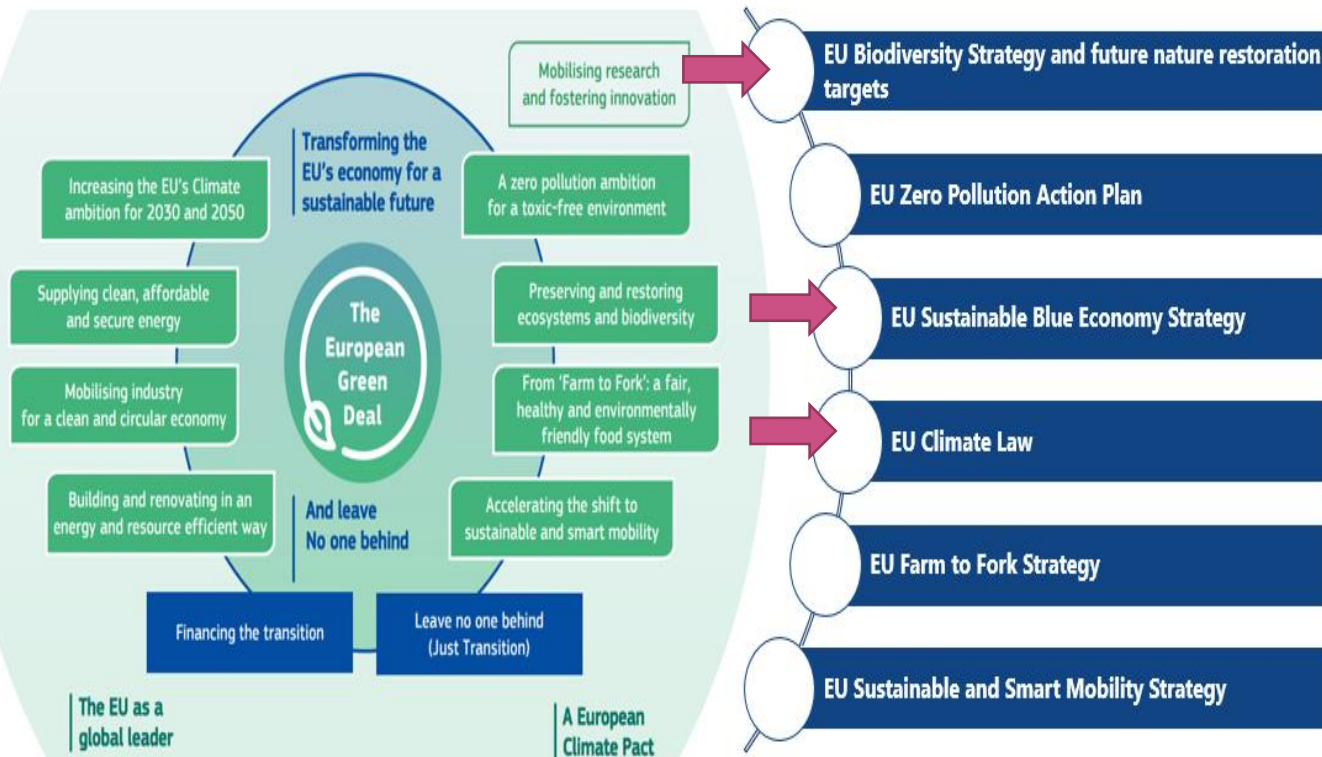

Support for the Coalition of waterfront cities, regions and islands for Mission Ocean and Waters (CSA)

POLICY CONTEXT



EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- ✓ A broad, highly impactful Coalition of waterfront cities (including their ports), regions and islands, that contributes to achieve the Mission objectives and strengthens resilience against extreme climate events, sea-level rise and floods;
- ✓ Actions and initiatives aiming to achieve the Mission objectives across waterfront cities, regions and islands designed and implemented by the Coalition;
- ✓ Further structuring and consolidation of the Mission communities of actors;
- ✓ Wide citizen and stakeholder engagement at regional and local levels, as well as political and social acceptance of actions addressing restoration of the health of the ocean, seas and waters;
- ✓ Strong cooperation with various institutions, organisations and initiatives relevant for the Mission and better access to EU and Member State, and private funds.



HORIZON-MISS-2024-OCEAN-02-02

Support for the Coalition of waterfront cities, regions and islands for Mission Ocean and Waters (CSA)

SCOPE

- establish and strengthen a Coalition of coastal and inland waterfront cities (including their maritime or inland water ports), regions and islands across the EU and Associated countries and support its governance;
- co-ordinating, networking, twinning, and mentoring of the Coalition members, as well as sharing best practices and deploying solutions together with the projects resulting from the topic HORIZON-MISS-2024-OCEAN-02-01 and in collaboration with the MIP;
- develop participatory processes, robust mechanisms for regional and local dialogues and facilitate coordination and collaboration between the Coalition and relevant national, regional and local authorities
- enhance the visibility of the Coalition and leverage funds to support its actions

INDICATIVE BUDGET

Total: EUR 4.0 million

Per project contribution: EUR 4.0 million

IMPORTANT

- include beneficiaries from at least one region, one waterfront city and one island
- facilitate synergies and access to EU, national, regional and private funds (foundations and philanthropies) as well as the financial sector (e.g. EIB).

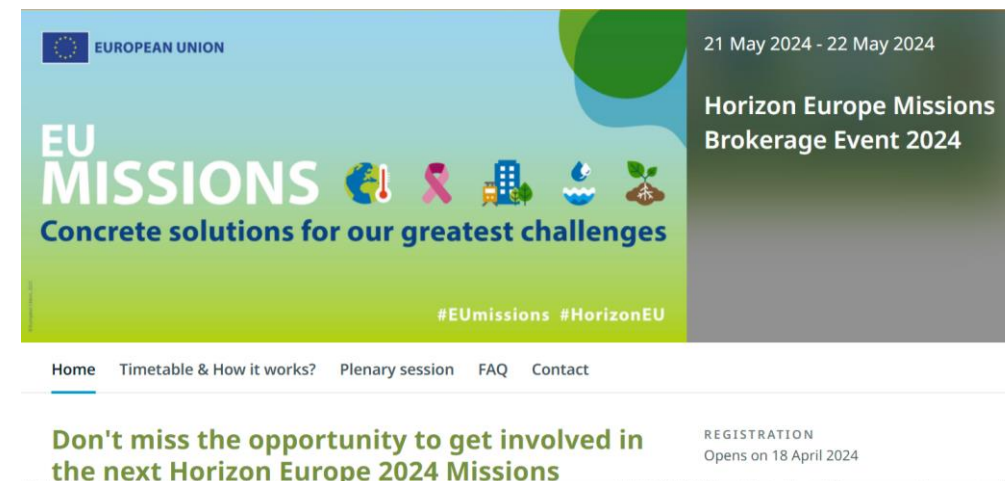
