



- ✓ For doctoral candidates

#### **Being a Trend-setter**

- Emphasis on transferable skills.
- Emphasis on integrating non-academic sector.
- Career development plan.
- Guidelines on supervision.
- Green Charter.

### **Attractiveness of European Programmes**

- Wider access to courses, expertise and infrastructure.
- Skills for innovation and long-term employability.
- International and interdisciplinary experiences widening career prospects.
- Better visibility of European doctoral programmes.





# MSCA-DN evolves from year to year

### **√** <u>2022</u>:

- Provide alternative to multiple recruitment in **DN-ID**
- Abolish maximum secondment duration for DN-ID and DN-JD
- Simplification: Abolish requirement of a "Steering Board"

### **✓** <u>2023</u>:

- Increase the DN grant size from 360 to 540 person-month
- Increase the DN-JD maximum duration of fellowships to 4 years and of projects to 5 years
- <u>Simplification</u>: Abolish requirement of letters of commitment for Associated Partners

### **√** 2024:

Allow organisations from non-associated 3<sup>rd</sup> countries as degree-awarding institutions in **DN-JD** (jointly with ones from MS/AC)













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

# What is a joint or double/multiple degree?






Joint degree: single diploma issued by at least 2 higher education institutions and recognized officially









**Letters of pre-agreement** to deliver joint/double doctoral degrees are mandatory in the proposal



### Academic vs Non-Academic

#### **Academic sector**

- ✓ Public or private higher education establishments
- ✓ Public or private non-profit research organisations
- ✓ International European Research Organisations



#### Non-academic sector

✓ Any socio-economic actor not included in the academic sector

Your entity's sector is defined upon its registration in the participant register!

# Eligible participants

### Who can apply?

- ✓ Any Legal Entity worldwide
- ✓ But not all applicants are eligible for funding

Min. 3 entities from 3 ≥ MS/AC of which 1 from a MS



#### Consortia

- ✓ Universities, research institutions and research infrastructures
- ✓ Businesses including SMEs
- ✓ Other socio-economic actors

No minimum / maximum number of **Associated Partners** 



# Some specific cases



- ✓ Restrictions for the protection of European communication networks
  - Entities that are assessed as high-risk suppliers of mobile network communication equipment (and any entities they own or control) are not eligible to participate as beneficiaries, affiliated entities and associated partners.
- ✓ Legal entities established in Russia, Belarus, or in non-government controlled territories of Ukraine not eligible to participate in any capacity



# Eligible size and duration

#### Size

✓ Up to 540 person-months for all type of actions





#### **Duration**

- ✓ Proposal: max. 48 months for DN and DN-ID
   incentive for DN-JD 60 months
- ✓ Fellowship: 3 to 36 months for DN and DN-ID
   incentive for DN-JD 48 months
- ✓ Secondments: worldwide, any sectors, up to 1/3 of the fellowship duration for Standard DN incentive for DN-ID and DN-JD no secondment limitation

# Other eligibility conditions

All beneficiaries must recruit at least one doctoral candidate, host and supervise in own premises, or use associated partners linked to them to do so

Max. 40% of budget allocated to the same country or to a single international organisation.

**Re-submission restrictions** 

for proposals scoring below 80% in Call 2023



# Specific eligibility conditions



### **Industrial doctorates (DN-ID)**

- ✓ Min 50% in non-academic sector
- ✓ Non-academic sector as Beneficiary or Associated Partner (full flexibility)
- ✓ No secondment limitation
- ✓ Academic and non-academic organisations jointly supervise



# Specific eligibility conditions



### **Joint doctorates (DN-JD)**

- ✓ Min 3 participants awarding PhD, 1 of which from MS/AC
- ✓ Enrolment in **joint/double/multiple PhD** (delivered by different entities from min. 1 MS/AC)
- ✓ Joint admission, selection, training, supervision, governance
- ✓ Letters of **pre-agreement** to deliver joint/double/multi degrees (template)
- ✓ Max 48 months fellowship, max 60 months network

Max 1/3 fellowship

No limitation on secondment duration



# Eligible researchers



#### **Doctoral candidates**

- ✓ No doctoral degree at the date of recruitment
- ✓ Open, merit-based and transparent recruitment procedure
- ✓ Enrolled in a PhD from min 1 EU MS/AC
- ✓ Any nationality
- ✓ fulfill the MSCA mobility condition:

DCs must not have resided or carried out their main activity in the country of the recruiting beneficiary for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately before their recruitment date.

# **Funding mechanism**



- ✓ Fully based on unit costs
- ✓ 1 person-month = 1 unit
- ✓ Amount in EUR per unit cost
- ✓ Total costs = costs per unit x number of units
- √ 100% Reimbursement rate for eligible beneficiaries
