
Social Thinking Vocabulary Kahoot - Online Trivia


- 1. Use this link → https://kahoot.com/schools-u/ to make your own trivia games
- 2. You write your own questions, provide answers, include a visual, and set the length of each question
- 3. Make trivia question for any concept you're teaching (social thinking vocabulary, being a social detective, hidden rules, how the social world works, etc.)
- During the session, have students click this link → https://kahoot.it/
- 5. Start the game that you made on your computer, and it will give you a "Game Pin." Send this game pin to all group members, and they will type it in to join the game. They will be prompted to choose a username for themselves (this is a great coaching opportunity to talk about perspective taking, the boundaries of other people's minds, and what would confuse other people.)
- 6. When you start the game, you can share your screen so they can see the questions and / or read the questions out loud. The students will just see four colored boxes on their screen where they click one to submit their answer (red, yellow, blue, and green are like A, B, C, D for a multiple choice question).
- 7. A scoreboard generates between each question to show where everyone ranks with points; just this as an opportunity to coach monitoring / defeating the D.O.F, size of the problem / size of the reaction, flexible thinking, or brain filters, depending on their learning
