SECTION 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

General advice : First aid personnel should pay attention to their own safety.
If the patient is likely to become unconscious, place and transport in stable sideways position (recovery position).
Immediately remove contaminated clothing.
Move out of dangerous area.
Show this material safety data sheet to the doctor in attendance.
Symptoms of poisoning may appear several hours later.
Do not leave the victim unattended.

If inhaled : Keep patient calm, remove to fresh air, seek medical attention.

Consult a physician after significant exposure.
If unconscious, place in recovery position and seek medical advice.

In case of skin contact : Immediately wash thoroughly with soap and water, seek medical attention.

If skin irritation persists, call a physician.
If on skin, rinse well with water.
If on clothes, remove clothes.

In case of eye contact : Wash affected eyes for at least 15 minutes under running water with eyelids held open, consult an eye specialist.

Flush eyes with water as a precaution.

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- Remove contact lenses.
Protect unharmed eye.
Keep eye wide open while rinsing.
If eye irritation persists, consult a specialist.
- If swallowed : Immediately rinse mouth and then drink 200-300 ml of water, seek medical attention.
- Keep respiratory tract clear.
Do NOT induce vomiting.
Do not give milk or alcoholic beverages.
Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.
If symptoms persist, call a physician.
Take victim immediately to hospital.
- Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed : May be fatal if swallowed and enters airways.
Causes skin irritation.
May cause drowsiness or dizziness.
Suspected of damaging the unborn child.
- Notes to physician : Treat symptomatically.

SECTION 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

- Suitable extinguishing media : Water spray
Foam
Dry powder
Carbon dioxide (CO₂)
- Unsuitable extinguishing media : High volume water jet
- Specific hazards during fire fighting : Do not allow run-off from fire fighting to enter drains or water courses.

SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

- Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures : Use personal protective equipment.

Remove all sources of ignition.
Evacuate personnel to safe areas.
Beware of vapors accumulating to form explosive concentra-

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tions. Vapors can accumulate in low areas.

Environmental precautions : Prevent product from entering drains.

If the product contaminates rivers and lakes or drains inform respective authorities.

SECTION 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE
