The Cement contained in this product reacts alkaline when in contact with water or humidity. This may cause severe irritation of skin or mucous membranes. The humidity of the skin or mucous membranes is enough for this reaction. Prolonged direct contact to the dry product should be avoided therefore. Pour downwind and allow as little free fall as possible while emptying bags into equipment.  
Breathing must be protected when large quantities are de-canted without local exhaust ventilation.

Hygiene measures : When using, do not eat, drink or smoke.  
Hands and/or face should be washed before breaks and at the end of the shift.  
At the end of the shift the skin should be cleaned and skin-care agents applied.  
Gloves must be inspected regularly and prior to each use. Replace if necessary (e.g. pinhole leaks).  
Remove contaminated clothing immediately and clean before re-use or dispose it if necessary.
