We are now working with all 15 primary schools in the town with programmes of work being delivered to both year 6 and now year 5 children. This is an on-going area of development as we explore how we can support 10 and 11 year olds most effectively.

Our work on self-harm and mental wellbeing is impactful and we have increased the people resources we have to support this work. The focus on Christian schools work remains important to us as we focus on supporting young people explore; their faith, the decisions they make, the actions they take and the relationships they form. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

This has been my 11th year at Phase and it just keeps getting better!

We have achieved so much in the past 12 months with the expansion of our work to every primary school in Hitchin, the sharing of our programmes to organisations across the country and sharing ideas, wisdom and knowledge with schools beyond our borders means that the impact and influence of Phase continues to grow.

As director it has been an exciting 12 months seeing the team grow our work with children and young people, strengthening what we offer and playing a more strategic role across the secondary schools.

A teacher recently commented the following 'Phase have continued to be incredibly helpful and supportive following the training they delivered.'

Over the past year we have grown our connection with local businesses in supporting our work, this has a vital activity as it has raised nearly £10,000 through a variety of activities including Fair in the Square and '240in24'. This enables Phase to continue to deliver our services and programmes at little or no cost to young people and schools. For me this is a very important part of our Christian message, that

we want to be light and salt in THANK YOU FOR HELPING MY SISTER THROUGH HER STRUGGLES all we do. Supporting young people in need is of utmost importance, however, giving them the tools to cope with life is the key to seeing the current narrative of the rise in mental health difficulties change.

Just recently I was in a local shop looking for something, the assistant who was very helpful, said 'thank you for helping my sister through her struggles'. The shop assistant and I had not met before. but they had heard about the work Phase were doing first hand. All of this is only made possible because of the continued generosity of our 125



individual supporters, the local churches, businesses, schools and the many individuals who have fundraised for Phase over the past 12 months.

It doesn't stop here! We have big plans and ideas for the coming year, we want to extend our work to engage further primary school

WELLBEING LEAD'S REPORT

Expanding our work to cover every primary school in Hitchin means we have worked with over 500 Year 6 students this year. The third Transition workshop, Get Set, complements the other two, and helps the students from the start of their final year with their resilience to challenges, and as role models with extra responsibilities. There continues to be encouraging take-up of the Christmas and Easter workshops too, and overall we've seen a 76% increase in the number of workshops delivered.

WE'VE SEEN A 76% INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF WORKSHOPS DELIVERED

Staff and students have commented on the fun that features in the sessions, and following a pupil questionnaire, one school reported that the Phase sessions have been one of the favourite bits of Year 6.

Our secondary school work this year began with the second Wellbeing Conference arranged at the Priory School but featuring teachers and pupils from 15 different schools learning and sharing about all things wellbeing. Within Hitchin Boys' and Girls' Schools, we delivered 84 lessons for Year 7, 8 & 9, thus working with over 1400 students, on topics such as internet safety, resilience; we have run the RISE course again.

I had the opportunity once more to join Year 8s from Hitchin Girls' School on residential at Caythorpe, a wonderful opportunity to build on the relationships started in classroom sessions. THIS CONNECTION IS HELPING US TO COMPLETE THE JIGSAW PUZZLE FOR THE WAY THAT WE ALL SEEK TO HELP AND SUPPORT YOUNG PEOPLE, WHETHER AS PARENTS, TEACHERS OR PARTNER AGENCIES.

Phase has worked throughout the secondary school offering practical sessions as part of the 6th Form induction process. The blog has enabled posts contributed by some

of these students, a refreshing insight into current issues, and we have also had movie reviews as well as Grace Read shining a spotlight on issues



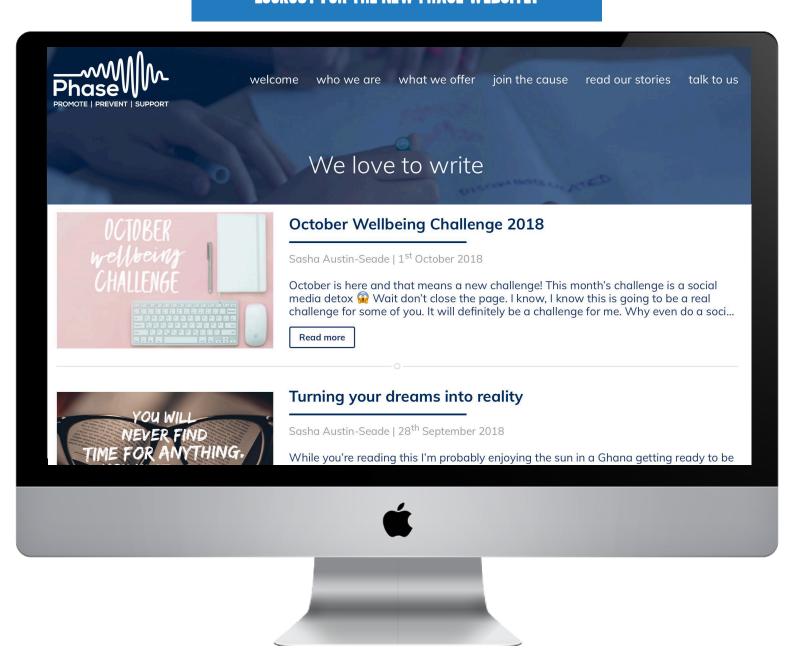
such as body image and anxiety. We would love to see still more engagement with the monthly wellbeing challenges!

We have also this year had the opportunity to connect with parents, delivering talks on a variety of practical and supportive topics, with a real appreciation for the work that Phase is doing in Hitchin. This connection is helping us to complete the jigsaw puzzle for the way that we all seek to help and support young people, whether as parents, teachers or partner agencies.

Finally may I say a big thank you to everyone who has worked, helped, supported or prayed for me and the work we do at Phase. I have had an amazing two years here at Phase, and although I am leaving, I am confident that the work will continue to grow and flourish in the coming years.

SUPPORT AND INTERVENTIONS LEAD'S REPORT

2017/18 has been an interesting year for me personally as I was on maternity leave for the majority of the year, enjoying motherhood and family time. I returned to work part-time in February and eased myself in gently to what became a busy summer term. Due to my absence, there was a reduction in capacity for a short while but supporting young people through their challenges has remained a key part of the work of Phase.

Over the course of the year, we have mentored 57 young people, journeying with them and encouraging them towards their goals. One of the biggest indicators of the progress some of these students have made is the fact that pastoral staff in school report a big drop in the number of times that these students turn up at the pastoral base needing support. This is great news as it means they are implementing what they have learned and using coping strategies to become more independent.

Since my return we have also been able to start up our 8 week support groups again, which we have now incorporated under our "Let's Talk" brand of resources. In the summer term, we delivered 2 anxiety support groups now called "Let's Talk"

Anxiety." In both of these groups the young people showed an increase in their self-esteem and a reduction in their anxiety. One girl who



attended this group went from being unable to talk in front of people at the start of the group to boldly giving the rest of the group advice in the last session.

We have been dreaming up what the future holds for our support and intervention programmes. There has been a demand for our Creative Space drop-in sessions to start up again and so we are making plans to do this next year and opening it up to any students who have attended one of our support programmes. We are also planning some new workshops, in collaboration with other agencies, that can help to prevent specific issues that we are seeing a lot in our support work.

It is always a privilege to be part of a young person's journey and I look forward to being able to do a lot more of this next year

SCHOOLS AND YOUTH WORKER'S REPORT

It has been an exciting and busy year in my role at Phase and Walsworth Road Baptist Church. Some of the key projects I have been leading are:

There have been two Fuel events this academic year with talks on a wide range of topics including managing behaviour, learning through life skills and growing faith in children at home. We have been focussing on getting a balanced programme with sessions for children's, families and youth workers. We have continued to develop Fuel Training and make it the best it can be. It has been encouraging to hear Fuel delegates described sessions as "clear and concise with lots of very useful information", "fantastic and very interesting", and "really enjoyed this, spoke well and from the heart".

There have been lots of changes at Holding Nothing Back this year, particularly at the Girls' School. We have been taking advantage of the weather to run a much more detached model, and have been building lots of new relationships with students whilst maintaining a strong core group. One member of the group said "I like that we can all come together as a family and just talk if we want to and I like the people running it because they're so friendly."

to two sessions – a detached session followed by a second, providing students the opportunity to question and explore topics around life, faith and God



We have held three

great Time Trek events this year, all with a good mixture of churched and unchurched families. We've looked at the Good Samaritan, David and Goliath and Daniel and the Lions' Den.

The children have enjoyed Time Trek, telling us that "I like it when the Professor and Pip do silly things" and "it's always all about Bible stories, which is good too".

Having piloted the Ambassador programme last year, this academic year has been the first of the full programme. We have had some Ambassadors leave because of academic commitments but have also seen several new young people join the programme. One Ambassador told us that "being an Ambassador is great because you learn new skills and more about what Phase do".

The staff have also benefited from being involved with the Ambassador programme. "Mentoring an ambassador is a great opportunity to see a young person at their best; to witness their enthusiasm, to help

them grow and develop new skills and to share in celebrating their achievements"

Having piloted this new model in one school, we will be rolling it out across the others next academic year in partnership with local churches. We will also expand it I look forward to growing this programme over the next year and have already had interest from some of the year 6s going up to Hitchin secondary schools.

OFFICE MANAGER'S REPORT

Many of the young people we work with face challenges and struggles: Phase is here to support them through these times, guiding and encouraging as best we can. Managing the Phase office is much the same for me, as I try to help the Phase team working with these young people; but I love it! The key areas that I am responsible for are office organisation, publicity, volunteers, fundraising and supporters.

One of the highlights of 2017/18 has been to see the final installation of the new office desks, allowing everyone to work together in one room. In waiting over 2 years for this to happen, it has been an exercise in patience and trusting in God's timings!

My biggest challenge in the office this year has been to oversee the changes needed due to GDPR and this continues to be an area of focus to ensure our systems are compliant and that we take the security of our data seriously. However, the switch to new Mailchimp lists has been very successful and has even seen the number of requests for Blog post updates increase.

From September 2017 we were sad to lose Molly (one of our Ambassadors) as a weekly helper with publicity, as Molly concentrated on her Year 13 studies. But God provides, and we have been blessed once more in the office with the help of some dedicated volunteers who would all probably say they don't do much — but to me/Phase they are invaluable!! Without them the monthly prayer guide & newsletter wouldn't get out and Time Trek wouldn't be so well organised. Thank you.

Much of the regular work in Phase has been underpinned by the support of many individuals. 53 people now volunteer with Phase in one way or another to keep Phase running and working in schools and churches. Without all these

Without all these volunteers we would

not be able to deliver the quality and depth of work that we currently do. My thanks to them all and we hope they enjoyed our



annual BBQ, but thanks especially to Tracy King who has continued to help as our Volunteer co-ordinator in the office late on a Friday afternoon, even after she returned to work full time in school in April!

2017/18 has seen an increase in the number of individuals & organisations who have fund-raised for Phase – including an art exhibition, running events, a Silent Auction, Coast-to-Coast Bike Ride, cake sales & raffles, coffee pod recycling and even a Rock Choir concert! Fundraising administration is now becoming a major office task and I envisage this area will only continue to grow.

Finally, this year we have continued to offer the support of Phase staff in more areas of the curriculum, including the Year 13 leavers BBQ at Hitchin Boys' School, the Year 8 PGL trip at Hitchin Girls' School and Parent sessions at The Priory School.

TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to report on another fantastic year in the life of Phase where all the income generating hard work produced an annual income figure of £123,364 which has again enabled us to expand the level of work we were able to perform.

We have always looked as a charity to have as low a fixed cost base as possible and for the 2018 year this meant we able to commit over 90% of our annual expenditure directly to payroll costs so going to those directly providing our front line services.

We are fortunate to be able to rely on regular annual gifts from local churches as well as in excess of 120 people making regular monthly donations by standing order. During the year we were also able to secure £12,450 by way of grants or donations from separate organisations or charities for which we are very thankful.

But the most amazing number was the £28,455 that was raised by all manner of individuals doing all manner of fund raisint! Financially the amount enabled us to meet our expenditure estimates but it's the increasing number of events that's as pleasing showing the work we do is making

a real difference to the community and more people are therefore looking for ways they can help.



So overall for August 2018 we were able to report a small (£1,793) deficit on our unrestricted reserves being well within budgeted / acceptable levels.

August 2019 will again be a challenging year on the Fundraising front to enable us to continue to enhance the work we are performing although we are able to carry forward the amazingly generous donation of £15,000 received from Covenant Praise within designated funds for use on appropriate projects.

With thanks again to everyone who helps generate income for Phase, however small or large we couldn't function without you.

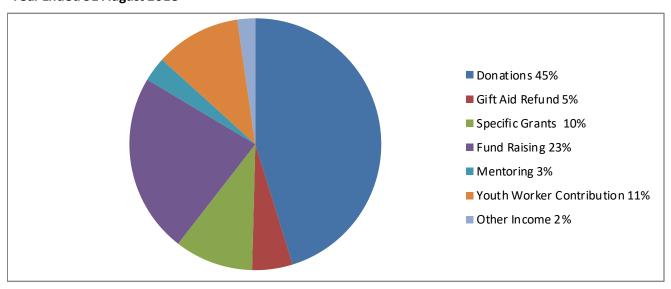

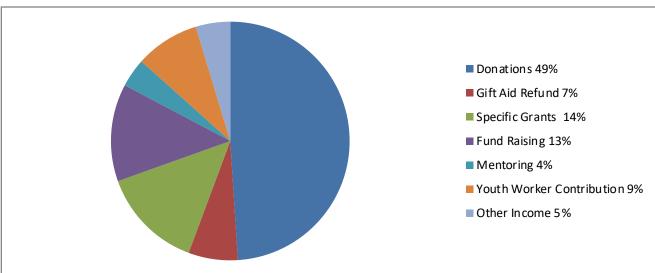

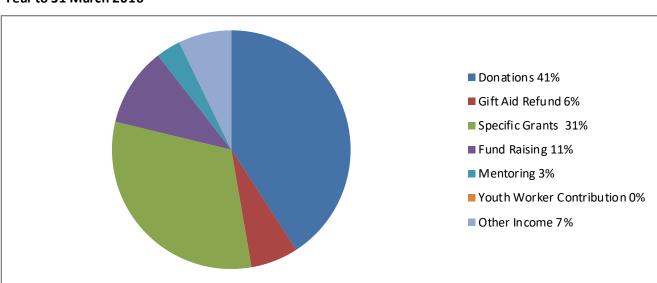
Incoming Resources Summary Year Ended 31 August 2018
