Director's Report

Every year it seems that Phase is going from strength to strength, and we have a fantastic team that are passionate, skilled and committed to seeing improving the lives of the children and young people in Hitchin. We are backed up by our committed and enthusiastic volunteers, who are at the core of all that we do.

Over the past 12 months we have continued to grow and develop our programmes and services. We now work in every primary and secondary school in the area to help build the students' wellbeing and resilience. Our work ranges from assemblies, classroom activities and support groups to one of our growing list of new projects. Phase continue to create space and time for young people to explore the Christian faith and ask the big questions about their lives.

I could tell you about all the lesson activities we've delivered, or workshops completed, numbers of young people we have mentored, or staff trained. However, the outstanding moments for me are the stories of change that we hear from the young people, school staff and parents!

opportunities to engage more and more with parents. As we are all aware, life is difficult for children and young people today, there



are a myriad of opportunities, challenges and influences that they face, with not all of these being positive. It is a difficult time for parents too, as they want to love, protect and care for

Wellbeing Lead's Report

It has been a very exciting first year with Phase and I have loved being part of the team. Over the past year I have had the privilege of leading our work on promoting wellbeing and resilience in both the primary schools and secondary schools in Hitchin.

The primary schools work continues to grow and develop with Phase able to offer every primary school three transition workshops equipping year 6 students for the move to secondary school. Accompanying this, Phase has two other workshops focusing on the Christmas and Easter festivals, helping students explore the values in these traditions. 92% of the schools rated the quality of the workshops as excellent, with the teachers describing the workshops as 'Engaging and thoughtful'. 100% of the schools said that they would book the workshops again.

The work in the primary schools could not be possible without the dedication and commitment of our Primary Schools Team. Over the past year we have developed training videos for each of the Primary School Workshops in order to help the team feel equipped and supported for their role, along with increasing opportunities for our volunteers to get involved with, such as our termly retreats. We have received great feedback from our team, with one person saying, 'I feel both trusted and looked after as a volunteer at Phase.'

We also continue to work very closely with all three secondary schools in Hitchin.

At both Hitchin Girls' School and Hitchin Boys' School we have delivered over 70 sessions on topics such as resilience, social media and healthy relationships through our RISE Course to those in year 7, 8 and 9.

This year again we had the opportunity to deliver sessions within The Priory School and

Hitchin Boys' School PSHE drop down day programmes. These were focused on Year 9 students (13-14 years of age) looking at the



topics of Body image and Healthy Relationships. In July we delivered resilience sessions to every young person preparing to go to 6th form at one of our three secondary schools.

Earlier on in the school year I had the privilege to attend the year 8 Caythorpe trip with Hitchin Girls' School. This was a great way to be able to build relationships with both the pupils and the teachers.

Towards the end of last term, we piloted a new Let's Talk Emotion Group at The Priory School helping a small group of Year 7's expand upon their emotional literacy. One student said, 'I found talking about emotions really helpful because it helped me realise what angers and upsets me and how I can express it safely and in good ways' This course will now be offered to all three secondary schools in a small group capacity.

We have continued to expand the work that we do with parents and staff. Delivering training to school staff on the topic of wellbeing and resilience, in order to help them feel equipped with skills and tools to be able to share with the children that they work with on a daily basis. From the training 100% of the staff felt that the training expanded their knowledge and confidence around the topic of resilience.

In all of this, it is such a privilege to be able to help young people to flourish and thrive in all that they face in today's culture. I am excited and look forward to all that is ahead of Phase in the coming year.

I'm Emily and I have just moved to Hitchin from Bournemouth. I studied psychology at University and for the past two years I have been working in a secondary school in Bournemouth as a Teaching Assistant. I have also been involved in leading and volunteering with different youth projects, both in church and outside.

I moved to Hitchin because I was really excited about the job at Phase. I am really passionate about supporting young people to really reach their potential, and about having a positive impact in these really key and forming years. I was particularly interested in the focus on building resilience in young people because so many young people face such tough circumstances and challenges that can really impact their future and change the trajectory for their lives. Although we cannot control these things that happen to young people, working with them to build resilience and teaching them that they have a choice in how to respond is an amazing opportunity to really make a difference.



Change is inevitable, but change isn't always easy! The main face to face contact that I have with children at Phase is during the three transition workshops we run. Here we help Year 6 children think about how to cope with the big change of moving from Year 6 to Year 7. Last year Phase also saw lots of changes too, as Donna moved on and Helen went on maternity leave and enjoy time with baby Jonathan. As a team we had to cope with these changes, maintain our delivery standards and also preserve our own wellbeing!

It has been amazing to see how a small team of just 3 or 4 people could deliver training, wellbeing programmes & support, on time, with quality, and across so many schools & churches. The help from our volunteers has been critical to achieving this.

One of the highlights of 2018/19 has been the addition of an Administration Assistant working in the office two mornings a week. Lizzie Feltoe has quickly taken on the organisation of all the regular monthly communications work, as well as re-starting the blog schedule – even getting me to start writing blogs too! The biggest challenge in the office this

year has been to keep consistency in the recruitment of volunteers. Picking up this area of expertise, when Tracy King was



unable to continue to organise it, has been difficult. But safeguarding of the children that we work with, is of paramount importance to Phase and so the continuity of quality in this area has remained critical.

2018/19 has continued to see huge support for Phase through fund-raising activities – from pre-school messy play days and recycling programmes, to a London Arcelor Mittal abseil, a 10k race and a marathon, a Variety Express Show and a Staff Panto, 480km in 24hrs running event and even an Ironman! Two churches have also donated multiple funds from events held in 2019 as part of their Anniversary celebrations! We are truly blessed by this support. Fundraising administration continues to be a growing office task and the addition of Lizzie allows this area to be better resourced.

Treasurer's Report

It was always anticipated 2019 would be a challenging year for Phase in terms of generating the level of income required to continue to fund the ever increasing volume of activities we are performing although I'm delighted to say the Trust dealt admirably with these challenges resulting is a small deficit of £5,723 for the year. This amount being well within budgeted parameters and still leaving us with sufficient cash reserves as a contingency moving forward.

The bulk of our income, in excess of £50,000, comes from specific gifts from our local churches as well as in excess of 120 people making regular monthly donations by standing order. This is the financial foundation on which Phase is built and we are extremely grateful to all those who give by these routes.

It is also hugely encouraging to see the number of individuals willing to make the effort to take part in all manner of fundraising events on behalf of Phase. From competing in an Ironman, joining a team running 480 kilometres in 24 hours, performing in a variety show, all the way through to washing some cars and making some cakes! Every single penny raised makes a real difference to us.


We have always looked as a charity to have as low a fixed cost base as possible and for the 2019 year this meant we able to commit 90% of our annual expenditure directly to payroll costs so going to those directly providing our front line services.

With the expansion of our team August 2019 will be an even more challenging year on the Fundraising front to enable us to continue to enhance the work we are performing although we are confident those challenges can be met – with a little help anyway!


