Afterwards, you will take a ferry that connects the two World Heritage Sites directly to Miyajima, where Itsukushima Shrine is located. Itsukushima Shrine has a history of more than 1,400 years, and the island itself is a mysterious place that has been regarded as an object of worship. In addition to Itsukushima Shrine, our guide will also recommend other noteworthy spots on the island, such as Senryo-kaku and Daisho-in, so you can fully enjoy your visit to the island. 	Hiroshima is also known for its local food, with okonomiyaki being one of the most famous dishes. Hiroshima's okonomiyaki is characterised by the fact that the batter and ingredients are served without mixing, and noodles are added at the end. For lunch on the tour, you will visit a famous Hiroshima-style okonomiyaki restaurant. Be sure to try the hot and filling lunch made on the teppan grill right in front of your eyes!

This is a great place to start your sightseeing in Hiroshima, and can be reached on foot from Hiroshima Station. You can enjoy a lively time feeding the colourful carp in the pond, and a quiet time admiring the sophisticated garden with its serene atmosphere. Hiroshima Castle: The original castle was destroyed by the atomic bombing, but was rebuilt after the war. From the outside of the castle, you can enjoy its majestic appearance and, once inside, you can look out over the city from the castle tower. It is also a valuable historical spot where you can learn about the samurai culture. Atomic Bomb Dome: The Atomic Bomb Dome is a symbolic spot where you can learn about the history of war. The atomic bomb exploded almost directly above this building, which was later rebuilt as a monument to preserve the memory of the bombing and its tragic shape. To this day, it's still visited by a lot of people, its breathtakingly tragic sight resonating with visitors from all over. Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum: A museum where you can comprehensively learn about war and the atomic bombing through many different materials, videos, and explanations. The museum exhibits a variety of stories of people's experiences, as well as scientific materials about the atomic bombing, making it a place where you can feel the tragedy of war and the importance of peace. Okonomiyaki Mitchan Yokokawa Branch: This is a restaurant specialising in okonomiyaki, a famous local dish. Hiroshima's okonomiyaki is characterised by the fact that the batter and ingredients are served without mixing, and noodles are added at the end. As the dish is cooked on a teppan grill in front of you, be sure to enjoy the process as well! The Hiroshima way of eating okonomiyaki is to use a spatula and eat directly from the teppan grill while it is still hot. Hiroshima World Heritage Route: Take a direct ferry from the Atomic Bomb Dome to Miyajima. As there are no trains or buses to transfer to, there is no need to worry about getting tired. Enjoy a relaxing view of the port of Hiroshima and the beautiful Seto Inland Sea. Miyajima Omotesando Shopping Street: This shopping street is Miyajima's main street, and is often crowded with tourists. Here, you can find a variety of Miyajima's local gourmet foods, such as momiji manju, oysters, as well as fine local good, like shamoji, rice paddles used to serve and stir rice. Shop to your heart's content, walk around, and enjoy the unique taste of Miyajima. Itsukushima Shrine: Itsukushima Shrine is the pride of Hiroshima, a World Heritage Site and the symbol of Miyajima, a solemn and elegant shrine built on the sea. The overwhelming beauty of the scenery radiating from the vermillion shrine pavilions is breathtaking and, once inside, you will feel a spiritual breeze flowing through the air. Enjoy the spectacular view of the sea and the vermillion colour of the structures. Daihonzan Daisho-in: The oldest temple on Miyajima, built over 1200 years ago. It is known as one of the most sacred spots on Miyajima, where you can see many Jizo statues wearing colourful hats, and enjoy the unique worshipping experience of walking inside a pitch-black hall, representing a mother's womb. It is also a great place to see the beautiful autumn leaves. Senryo-kaku (Toyokuni Shrine): This shrine is the perfect place to spend some healing time on Miyajima. The Daikyodo, which is the size of about five doubles tennis courts, has no plank walls and its natural ceiling and pillars are exposed. Enjoy the slow flow of time as you feel the unique silent atmosphere of this shrine. Machiya Street: On the other side of the main shopping street crowded with tourists, there is a quiet, old-fashioned streetscape. Machiya Street is lined with the workshops of craftsmen who have passed on their traditional skills, as well as general merchandise stores, and offers a very different atmosphere from the main street.
