

ABOUT THE CAMP

The IBU LENZI Youth Camp in Lenzerheide is an adventurous training camp, combining training, education and multicultural exchange, for biathlon talents from all over the world.

Lenzerheide is hosting the IBU World Championships in 2025 and the youth camp is an important event in their preparation. Creating good Championships for the elite athletes is important but even more crucial is inspiring the next generation of biathletes.

Lenzi welcomes athletes between the ages 16 and 18 to the camp. During the week the participants are offered a varied training program led by experienced coaches. The Swiss elite athletes will be training in the same venue and it will be possible to have a chat with them and pick up some new ideas.

Beside the training, there is an education program focusing on communication and the use of social media. And of course there will be plenty of time for the young athletes to get to know each other, build new friendships and share experiences.

- Young biathlon athletes from IBU nations all over the world
- Age: IBU Youth category, 16-18 years old (born 2006 and 2007)
- 20 nations invited, two female and two male athletes + one coach per nation
- Maximum four athletes and one coach pro nation
- Maximum total number of participants: 100 (80 athletes, 20 coaches)

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

The Positive and Favourable Effects of Social Media / Promote the unknown sports

The rise of social media has brought up advantages and disadvantages. One advantage, particularly for young athletes, is the new marketing opportunities offered through social media platforms. Athletes can promote themselves and their sport on their own channels and potentially become influential figures. However, it is crucial for athletes to be aware of the risks associated with social media.

With this in mind, we are offering to advise participants in utilizing social media channels effectively for promotion and communication. We are planning to incorporate a dedicated social media training session led by professionals. As part of this program, we will also organize a social media contest during the camp to provide hands-on experience and evaluate participants' progress. Additionally, we will offer optional individual coaching sessions to help athletes enhance their profiles. This initiative is intended







ABOUT LENZERHEIDE

TRAVEL

Arrival to Lenzerheide by train:

- From Geneva and Basel to Zürich
- From Zürich and St. Gallen via Sargans to Chur and via Chur-South to Lenzerheide
- From Lugano via Thusis to Tiefencastel and Lenzerheide

Travel comfortably and climate-friendly by public transport to the Lenzerheide. Public transport offers various packages and savings options for transport and travel.

All transport services are the responsibility of the participating nations. All sports facilities used for the camp are within walking distance.

IBU supports NFs with travel contributions of 350 EUR per participating <u>athlete</u> if travelling by car and 500 EUR per participating <u>athlete</u> if flying.

ACCOMMODATION

The Roland Arena is located in Lantsch/Lenz, about five kilometres from the village centre of Lenzerheide. Thanks to the multifunctional building architecture, the arena has developed into a well-known sports hotspot and is a meeting place for elite and junior athletes, leisure athletes, clubs and sports associations.

Anyone who feels like it can experience the sport of biathlon for themselves in a taster course, compete against each other in the family hit and fortify themselves with delicacies in the Bistro Bualino

The Roland Arena and the Lenzerheide holiday region offer athletes and coaches the best possible conditions for training camps at 1,400 metres above sea level. The heart of the arena is the Nordic House. The impressive wooden building was opened in December 2016 and has since welcomed thousands of leisure and competitive athletes to the Lenzerheide holiday region every year.

The infrastructure includes Don Bosco (walking distance from the Arena) with 15 multi-bed rooms, 55 beds and the Nordic Hostel with 13 multi-bed rooms, 57 beds and shared bathrooms/showers, a bistro, an athletics room exclusively for athletes, public changing rooms, showers and toilets, as well as a rifle room, waxing room and boot dryer in the basement.

ACCOMMODATION

- Accommodation will be in multi-bed rooms (2-6 persons)
- Within the camp period and the national contingent, the organiser will cover the costs for accommodation and full board
- Check-in is scheduled on October 23rd by 5:00 p.m. at the latest, and the departure on October 28th after lunch.
- Different dates of arrival and departure must be agreed upon with the OC on time, and additional
 costs in the event of exceeding the planned time of the camp must be covered by the participants/
 the participating nations (EUR 55.- per night including breakfast).

NECESSARY EQUIPMENT

The following equipment is required for each participant the camp:

- Rollerski equipment for skating (helmets and eyewear are mandatory)
- Biathlon rifles and ammunition app. 500 per person
- Running shoes, indoor shoes and hiking shoes (or a second pair of running shoes)
- Clothing for outdoor and indoor training

VISA REGULATIONS

People entering Switzerland must be in possession of a valid passport. Please check the visa regulations when travelling to Swizerland within your country.

Participating nations requiring an invitation will receive one from the OC/IBU.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Insurance

The organiser will provide the foreign participants combined insurance (liability insurance/ health insurance/ accident insurance). The organiser bears the costs. The prerequisite is the timely registration of the data of the participants.

Language

The camp will be in English but we have coaches mastering a wide range of languages.

- Biathlon rifle and ammunition
 - If requested (Pre-registration is mandatory. The application form will be provided).
- Weather and clothing

In October we can have all kinds of weather in Lenzerheide. The participants should bring clothing for both cold temperatures and rain. The Nordic House has facilities for drying clothes and shoes.
