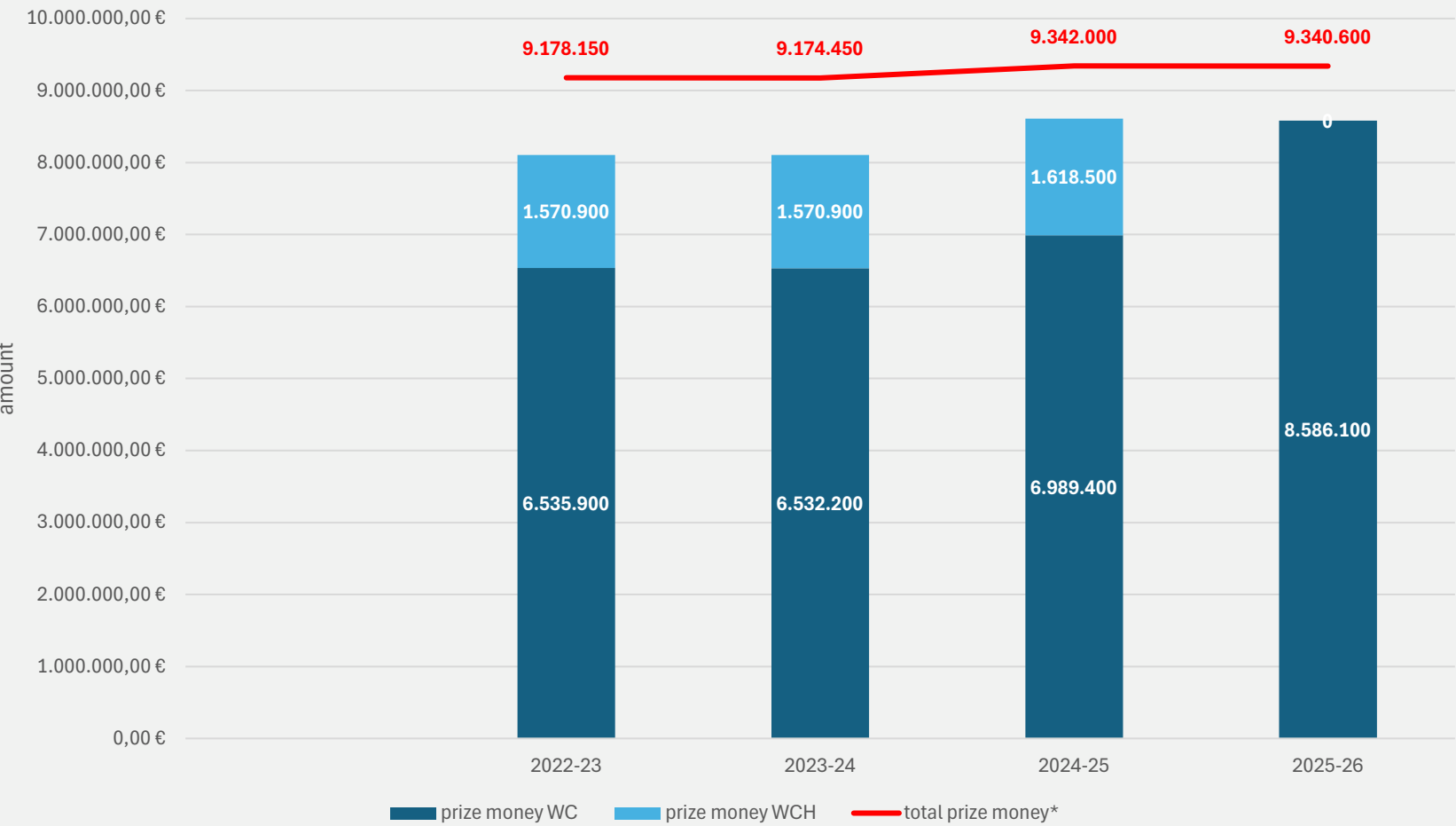

Procedural Fees Policy Effective for the 2025-2026 Season

Confirmed by the IBU EB 176 in June 2025

1. NEW PROFILES: Athletes and Officials

Late Registration in the IBU Membercenter (after the deadline) for:

- New Athletes
 - New Officials
 - Change from “Basic” to “Full” athlete profile
- ➔ **Fee: €100 per person**

Existing Registration Deadlines (reminder):

- New Athletes: by October 30th
- New Officials: by November 15th
- IBU Youth/Junior World Championships (YJWCH) – New Athletes or change from “Basic” to “Full” athlete profile: by February 1st

2. LATE ENTRY CHANGES: After the Entry-by-Name Deadline

- Up to 2 changes per NF/per IBU Event (e.g. sickness):
➔ **No fee**
- More than 2 changes per NF/per IBU Event:
➔ **Fee: €50 per person, starting from the third change**

3. EXISTING PROFILES: Updates and Transfers

- Athlete/Official transfer between NFs
- Upload of new or expired documents
- Submission of missing required documents

Deadline: One week before the first official training of an event for which the change applies. Expiring documents must be updated well in advance and not during the season or an event.

➔ **Fee if after the deadline: €30 per person**

Fees will be **deducted from the NF contributions** and reallocated to the **Athlete Solidarity Fund**, managed and reported by the BIU.

Additional Provisions:

- Exceptions may be granted in cases of **force majeure**, provided the IBU is notified immediately and written justification is submitted.
- All cases will be **documented by SIWIDATA** (registrations) and reported to the Sport & Event Department for validation and accounting.

9.1. REPORT DEVELOPMENT

1. Development Programmes - NF's Development Projects Support 2025/2026

Project coordinator: Maija Savolainen

IBU received 160 applications from 44 NFs for the NFs Development Projects grants for season 2025/2026 by the deadline 12th of May 2025. The total budget requested was 2.581.424,00 €. The support proposal is for 118 Development Projects with a total budget of 1.698.538,00 €.

The most applied projects were "NFs' Partnership projects" (26), followed by „Identification and Training of Youth and Junior athletes" (25), 'Popularisation among Kids and Youths' (19), "Gender Equality" (16), „Athlete involvement after sport career" (9), "Support of training venue" (9), "Biathlon expert support" (8) and "Sustainability" (4)

2.2. REGIONAL SUMMER EVENTS 2025

The application period for Regional Summer and City Events closed on the 31st of May 2025. IBU received 18 applications for Regional Events from 13 National Federations. The total budget requested was 118.344,00 €. The support proposal is for 15 Regional Summer Events, with a total budget of € 98,644.00.

NF Norway and NF Germany applied for City Event support for summer 2025, with a budget of €40,000.00. The support proposal is €40.000,00 for City Events.

2.3. REGIONAL EVENTS ORGANISERS MEETING, 17 June 2025

The main focus of the meeting was reviewing the past season's regional events and outlining plans for the upcoming season 2025/2026, including new qualification points, financial support guidelines, common waxing procedures, athlete registration processes, and promoting regional events through proper communication channels.

The meeting was jointly led by the Development and S&E departments, with support from TC Chairman Christophe Vassalo.

3. Olympic Solidarity Support – Development of National Sports System 2025

Project coordinator: Dagmara Gerasimuk

We continue our successful collaboration with the Olympic Solidarity and have received opportunities to provide additional support for our National Federations (NFs). The support is intended to be directed at developing federations following the IF recommendation and based on OS regulations and the internal evaluation process.

5. IBU-IOC Development Camps

The development department team will run three development camps in 2025, with the same layout as in 2024: two IBU-IOC camps (Summer and Winter), and an IBU Youth International Camp.

- Summer Camp (in partnership with Para Biathlon) - 29th June to 5th July – Lillehammer – NOR. Camp is organised in collaboration with Lillehammer Olympic Legacy Sport Centre and the Norwegian Biathlon Federation. The Camp is led by Knut Kuvas Brevik (Camp Head Coach) with the support of Anders Øverby(NOR), Håvard Bogetveit(NOR), Kristina Skjevdal(NOR) and Andrine Overland(NOR).

Summer Camp registration ended on the 31st May 2025 with 45 Athletes and 13 coaches from 13NF.
- Youth International Camp (in partnership with Para Biathlon) - 27th September to 4th October – Arber - GER. The camp is led by Matthias Ahrens (GER) (Camp Head Coach). The IBU Youth International Camp application ended on April 30, 2025, with 104 Athletes and 27 coaches from 27 nations.
- Winter Camp - 1st to 7th December – GOMS – SUI. The winter camp application will close on August 31, 2025.

The programme is supported by an Olympic Solidarity grant of 70,000 USD for the summer and winter camps, and 60,000 USD for the Youth International Camp.

OS granted in total of 200'000 USD for 4 years for the Youth International Camps.

6. DEI working group and first meeting

Project coordinator: Theresa Jost

As part of its ongoing commitment to promoting diversity, equality, and inclusion (DEI) across the sport, the IBU has officially launched its newly established DEI Working Group. The group will play a central role in guiding the transition from the current Gender Equality Strategy 2026 toward a more comprehensive DEI Strategy 2030, in line with the IBU's long-term sustainability vision outlined in its Target 2030 strategy.

Following a call for applications earlier this year, the IBU is pleased to announce the members of the DEI Working Group:

The group brings together a diverse range of perspectives and expertise from across the biathlon family. Each member has a strong background in DEI-related work, complemented by valuable experience in sports, athlete representation, or governance.

The kick-off meeting took place on 6 May, officially marking the beginning of the group's work. The first phase focuses on collecting best practices, sharing experiences, and identifying key focus areas and objectives for the new DEI Strategy.

The goal is to help the IBU EB develop and publish the IBU DEI strategy in early 2026, setting a clear roadmap to ensure that DEI principles are embedded in all areas of biathlon governance and development.

7. IBU Gender Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Forum 2026

Project coordinator: Dagmara Gerasimuk

As part of the IBU's commitment to gender equality, diversity, and inclusion, we have started planning an international forum to be held in April 2026 (preferably 22-24) in Lausanne. IOC expressed their interest and offered support. Following the initial conversation with the IOC, we could organise it at the Olympic House with a maximum capacity: 144 participants. The forum is going to be organised for the winter sports community, with an invitation to some summer Ifs representatives. The concept is under development. WOF development funds can support the budget with 50.000 USD.

8. Development Commission

The Development Commission (DC) met on 27-28th of May in Munich. The meeting saw full attendance of members, including Christian Borch from Denmark, Thomas Braun from Germany (online), Lilya Budzulyak from Ukraine, John Farra from the USA, Rikard Grip from Sweden, Carlos Lannes from Spain, and Aliona Sosunova from Lithuania (online). Also in attendance were IBU's Development Director Dagmara Gerasimuk, Head of Academy Gerold Sattlecker and Development Project Coordinator Maija Savolainen. Furthermore, IBU President Olle Dahlin and IBU Secretary General Max Cobb shared their insights, contributing to the meeting's conclusions together with EB member Tore Boygard.

1. COACH EDUCATION

Courses

- From 1-7 April, the **First Level Course 2024/25** concluded with an education week in Ramsau (AUT). 19 coaches received their well-earned certificates.
- From 12-16 April, the second week of the **Second Level Course 2024/25** was held in Lillehammer (NOR).
- From 25-31 April, the yearly **Basic Course 2025** was held in Salzburg and Ruhpolding with 19 participants from 17 different NFs. 13 female coaches took part.
- From 4-10 May, the **First Level Course 2025/26** successfully started with an education week in Hochfilzen (AUT). 20 coaches from 19 different NFs started their journey.
- From 19-21 May 2025, the second week of the **Third Level Course** was held at the Mid Sweden University in Östersund.
- From 1-7 June 2025, the **Second Level Course 2024/25** was finished successfully. 16 participants from 13 different NFs received their certificates.

Upcoming: For the upcoming month, several coach education courses are planned:

- The final week of the **Third Level Course** in Salzburg (8-10 July),
- The **Regional Basic Course in Japan** (together with Korea and China) from 23-27 July,
- The **Regional Basic Course in Croatia** (together with Bosnia) from 25-29 August,
- and the **Regional Basic Course in Poland** (together with Lithuania and Slovakia) from 2-6 September.

7. DC4Biathletes – Erasmus+ Sport

Project coordinator: Anna Kitzbichler

During the YJWCH in Östersund, we conducted a survey to gain a better understanding of how to support young biathletes in balancing their sport and education. Over 100 athletes completed a survey.

Next steps: a workshop and athlete interviews are planned during the IBU IOC Camp in Lillehammer on 1st and 2nd July 2025.

8. IBU Mentorship Programme

Project coordinator: Dagmara Gerasimuk

We launched the 3rd edition of the IBU Mentorship Programme: 'Shaping Tomorrow's Biathlon Leaders'. The programme runs in collaboration with the SheSkillz Global company.

We have received 18 applications, which are gender-balanced. All candidates were great during interviews and eager to be part of the programme.

The next step is an in-person meeting on July 2nd and 3rd in Anif, which will include a visit to the headquarters. The programme includes Leadership Skills training, webinars with a focus on developing the managers' skills, practical group assignments, and mentoring with 'biathlon' and business mentors. It ends in April 2026. The programme is co-funded with the WOF development funds, 50,000 USD.

9. Academy Assistant recruitment / Parental Leave replacement

In April 2025, the IBU Academy announced the position of an Academy Assistant. In total, 4 applicants were chosen to have interviews with. Finally, Maja Milatovic from Slovenia was selected for this part-time (20 hours) position. Maja is highly skilled in administrative work in the field of international sports. Furthermore, Sophie Mayr from Italy was selected to replace Christoph Gressenbauer, who took four months of parental leave from June 1 to September 30.

9.1.2. Biathlon 4 All and International Biathlon Day 2025

1. Biathlon for All (B4A)

Project coordinators: Dagmara Gerasimuk and Maija Savolainen

1.1. B4A Coordinators meeting, 9 April 2025

The Development Department hosted the Biathlon 4 All (B4A) Coordinators Meeting on 9 April 2025, bringing together National Federation representatives responsible for Biathlon 4 All and Development. The session aimed to align efforts, exchange ideas, and strengthen collaboration ahead of the 2025 B4A season.

Coordinators were introduced to the Biathlon 4 All website, designed to enhance visibility and access to resources. Guidance was provided on utilising the B4A visual identity, social media templates, and the importance of consistent branding. **International Biathlon Day – 24 May 2025** was introduced, with an invitation for National Federations to submit event concepts via IBU Scope by 23 April.

Facts:

- 45 NFs supported from B4A project since 2023
- 576 rifle sets (app. 13 rifle sets per NFs) distributed
- The number of participants in 2024/2025, as reported by 23 NFs, is 49,139 (app. 2136 participants per NF), U15 – 70%, youths – 17%, juniors -13%; female vs. male participants 49/51%. In comparison, in 2023/2024, 39 NFs reported 74,890 participants (app. 1920 participants per NF).

1.2. Biathlon 4 All Events Guide

The Biathlon 4 All Events Guide was created to help B4A organisers plan a local event, school activity, or community festival. This practical guide provides tips, inspiration and ready-to-use templates to help host an inclusive and engaging event for participants of all ages and abilities.

As a vital part of Biathlon4All, the International Biathlon Day will give people of all ages a chance to hit targets with laser rifles and engage in fun, family-friendly activities.

Nearly 20 National Federations have announced events at various venues around the world. Four NFs were chosen as flagship events and supported by a paid media campaign (NF ROU, NF ESP, NF SLO, NF UKR), and 5 NFs were supported by IBU content creators (NF ROU, NF ESP, NF SLO, NF UKR, NF SWE). 15NFs were supported with promotional materials (banners/line numbers/beach flags) from the B4A budget (list below).

9.2. Closing the Competition Gap – intern report

Introduction

The program is dedicated to supporting the development of National Biathlon Federations by strengthening their potential and capabilities to achieve significant results during the WCs, WCHs, and Olympics. This is a completely innovative and transformational partnership between NF and IBU.

The initial phase of the CCG project (2024/2025) was **transformative in setting the foundations** for growth. While differing in scale and maturity, most NFs saw benefits in athlete support, coaching development, infrastructure and strategic direction.

These outcomes validate the **IBU's investment and consultative approach**, while signalling key opportunities for the next stage: scaling successful pilots and integrating tailored metrics with each NF.

Project Goals

By 2030, we aim to see more NFs win medals and achieve top positions in international competitions. This includes increased diversity of representations from various NFs on the podium, Flower Ceremonies, and the top 10 during the World Cup, World Championships, and Olympic Games, which will bring future commercial opportunities for our sport. In particular:

- 8 NFs with medal(s) during the Olympic Games 2026
- 15 NFs top 10 during the WCs
- 15 NFs during the Flower ceremonies during the Olympic Games 2030
- 10 NFs with medal(s) during the Olympic Games 2030
- 10 NFs with medals during each Junior Championships

Key Priorities 2025/2026:

- Olympic preparation processes for 2026 and 2030 (NF's projects).
- Long-term strategy planning for 2030 and 2034 with expert support.
- Basic marketing programme development in cooperation with IBU experts.

Maximum funding available per National Federation: €50,000

NFs list: NOR, SWE, GER, FRA, SUI, ITA, AUT, BEL, BUL, CZE, EST, FIN, KAZ, LAT, LTU, POL, SLO, SVK, UKR, USA. NF CAN included from 2025/2026.

- **Total number of online meetings:** 19
- The meetings were led by Dagmara Gerasimuk and Gerold Sattlecker, with support from Tore Boygard (EB member), Max Cobb, Riikka Rakic, and Daniel Boehm, when possible.
- **Date range:** 28 April – 3 June 2025

- **Focus areas:** Olympic preparation, athlete development, coaching education, infrastructure, partnerships, and long-term strategy.

The 2025 meeting summaries show an aligned, ambitious movement across nations to close the competition gap before the 2030 Olympics and beyond. Despite differing resource levels, all federations are strategically investing in:

1. Athlete development and health with a focus on medical, recovery, and psychological support.
2. Coach education - mainly through the IBU Academy participation.
3. Technology and infrastructure, including treadmills, testing labs, and grinding machines.
4. International collaboration through the NFs Partnerships

Key Observations

1. NFs value direct dialogue with the IBU leadership and development team. The calls were repeatedly cited as motivating, clarifying, and instrumental in guiding national plans.
2. The first year of the CCG initiative has mobilised internal strategies across numerous NFs: 10+ federations are now implementing long-term strategies, coach education pipelines, or new NFs partnerships.
3. One-size-fits-all support models are insufficient; individualised calls and co-created plans enable the IBU to address each NF's unique context better.
4. The trusted relationship formed through consistent calls enhances transparency and encourages federations to ask for help, admit weaknesses, and collaborate beyond formal applications.

Recommendations

1. Continue yearly one-on-one calls with CCG NFs. Consider calls with C, cat. NFs.
2. Use these calls not only for project follow-up, but as a strategic relationship touchpoint between the IBU and its members.
3. Best practices sharing workshops – 'Grow as we do'

The calls and resulting collaborations are more than administrative exercises—they are **relationship-building mechanisms** that establish the IBU not just as a governing body, but as a **true partner in growth**.
