COMMON WAXING means

Unified Ski preparation

(same for all)

Cooperation

(between Teams, Technicians, OC)





Common Waxing = Collaboration with Teams

- All skis will be cleaned and waxed in the same way before each Competition according the IBU Common Waxing Procedure
- Measured by Bruker Alpha II FT-IR Spectrometer on side (if possible)
- Tools, Equipment and Fluor Free waxes from IBU Suppliers

COMMON WAXING

PREPARATION THE DAY BEFORE COMPETITION



COMMON WAXING THE DAY BEFORE

- Collect the ski after Draw in scheduled time
- More time to prepare skis (possible hot waxing)
- No stress before the race just bring skis to the Start area
- Possible to add Manual structure
- > Technicians are available during the Competition





Common waxing day before

(IND, SPR, MR, Relays)


Time to deliver the ski and Start Common Waxing

According to the Daily Schedule

Base preparation by Teams before Common Waxing Only base Fluor Free waxes officially supplied by the IBU or accepted by RE OC



Base preparation by Teams before Common Waxing Scrape and brush properly





CW PROTOCOL 25/26



COMMON WAXING PROCEDURE

1. SKI MARKING

- > Skis must be delivered to the wax station in scheduled time
- Marked by Technicians with the appropriate stickers (Athletes start number)





2. SKIS CLEANING

- > Cleaned with liquid wax cleaner applied by sponge bottle
- > Brush 2x by roto brush: copper (bronze) or soft steel
- Let the ski base dry







3. LIQUID WAX APPLICATION

- > Brush the base again with hand steel brush and wiped
- > Applied dedicated Liquid wax
- Let the wax dry (according to the producer's recommendation)





4. POLISHING THE SKIS

- Polish ski base by a dedicated roto wool or brush
- Wiped from the dust

Done the same way !!!







5. Manual Struktur

Each Team may add a manual structure within the scheduled time before the start Brush after or wiped by CW tools



Manual Structure

Possible to add before each race in time window 90-30 minutes before the Competition Start

Only at the CW station in the presence of OC Officials by NF's Technicians (max 2 from each Team)

Strictly following the common rules





6. SKIS TRANSPORT

- > Skis will be transported to the Start area by Volunteers in ski holders
- Skis will be stored in the dedicated Tent close to the Start corridor entrance



7. PICK UP SKIS BEFORE START

- > Skis will be handed over by the Athlete directly before the Start at the entrance to the starting corridor
- > The Athlete must collect the skis personally, without the assistance of the referee


COMMON WAXING

(without help from Referee/Volunteer)












In cooperation with Suppliers, the IBU/OC will provide:

- > Ski Waxes for different conditions
- Dedicated Roto & hand brushes
- > Liquid wax cleaner
- > Aku drills with an additional battery
- > Ski racks
- Waxing tables/ profiles
- Fluor test device (if possible)



In cooperation with NFs' Teams:

- > 4-8 Technicians (Before every Competition day)
- Each NF one time (3h) during JC week
- Experience and professional work
- Opportunity to learn and share experience


PREPARATION DURING THE COMPETITION DAY

COMMON WAXING PROCEDURE







- Skis must be delivered to the wax station 1 h 15 min before the RACE START
- The remaining procedure is similar to that of waxing on the day before the competition



COMMON WAXING Rules

- > Whole protocol
- > What is allowed or not allowed before
- **Penalties**
