

# Red Mirage Update

November 3, 2020



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## Preview: *Red Mirage* forming, “It ain’t over till it’s over”

- Shift to VBM evident (+ early in person) at or beyond expectations
  - VBM already ~38% of record expected turnout
- Partisanship of vote patterns and counting timelines continue to promise a *Red Mirage* on election night
- Public opinion context is troubling: widespread questions of VBM ballot legitimacy and continued expectations of an election night decision
- Media context is encouraging from one report on *Red Mirage* in PA, another focusing reporting on close races with high VBM throughput
- As technical professionals: “It ain’t over until it’s over”

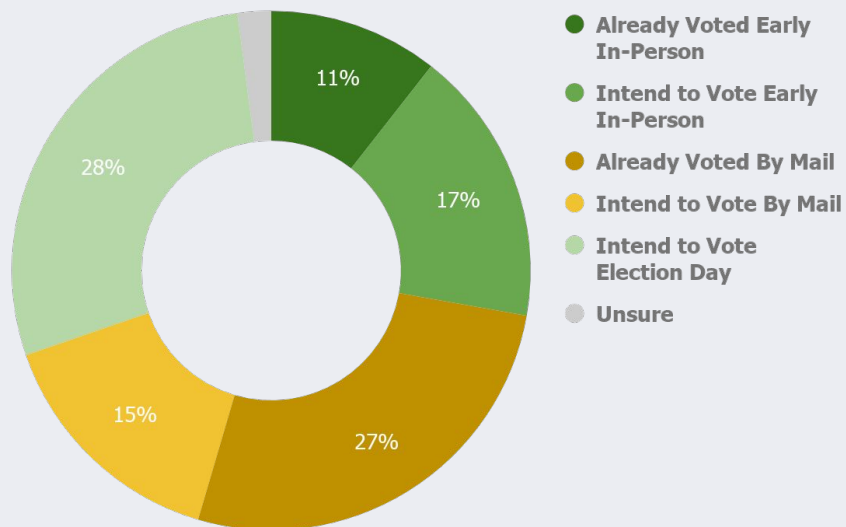
# VBM likely most popular voting method in 2020



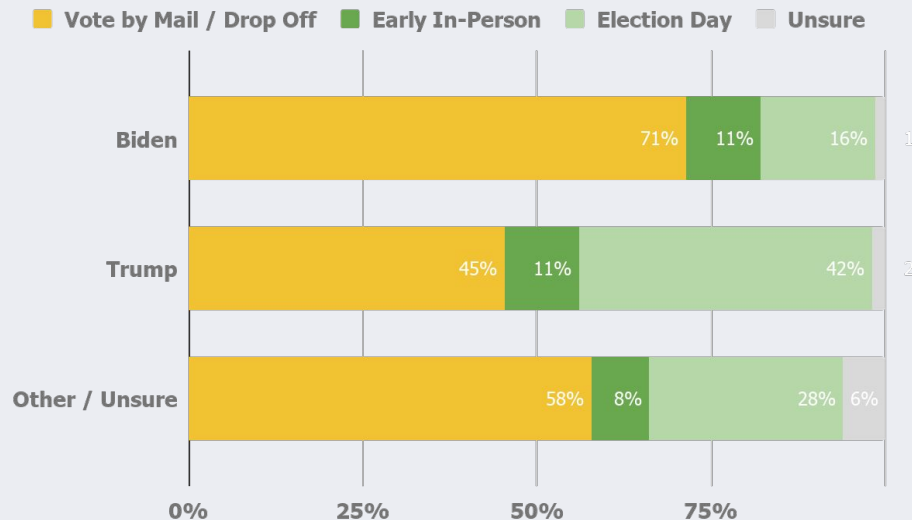
VBM already almost 45% of 2016 turnout

## All Respondents Vote Method and Status



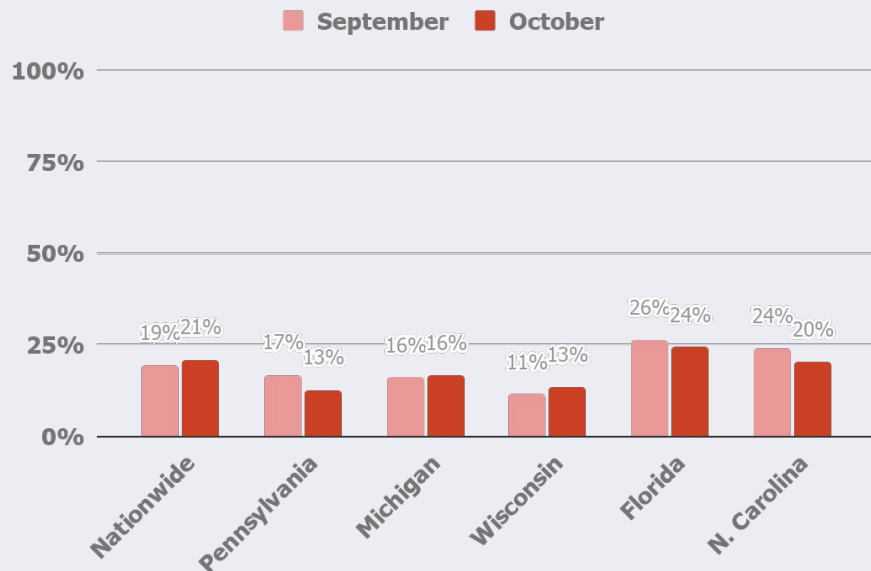
## Vote Method by Candidate Support



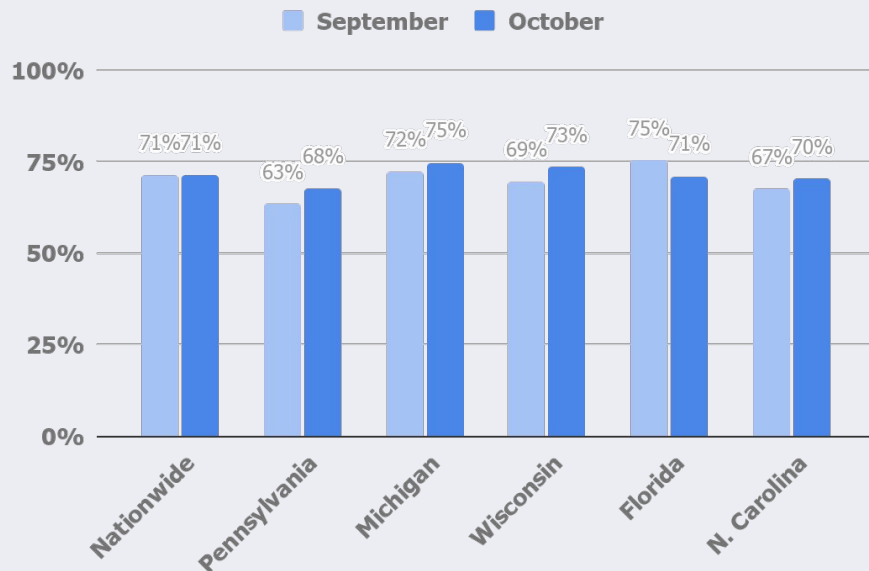
# Virus concerns for in-person voting stable & partisan

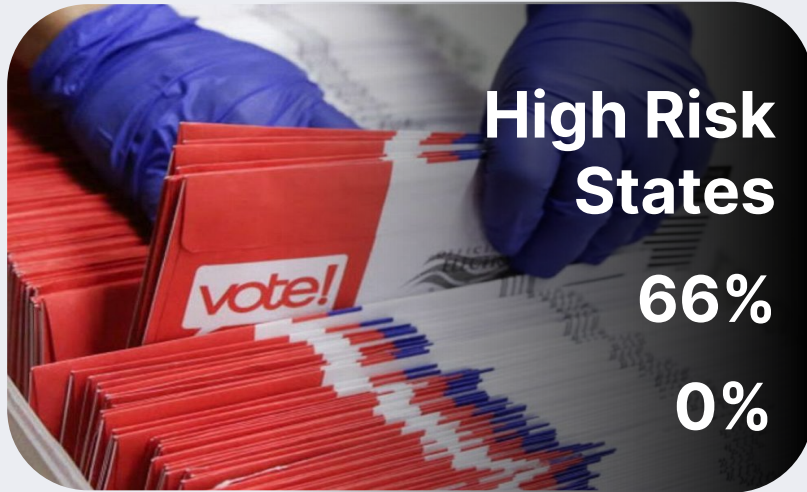

# Scenario A: Delays in limited number of close states



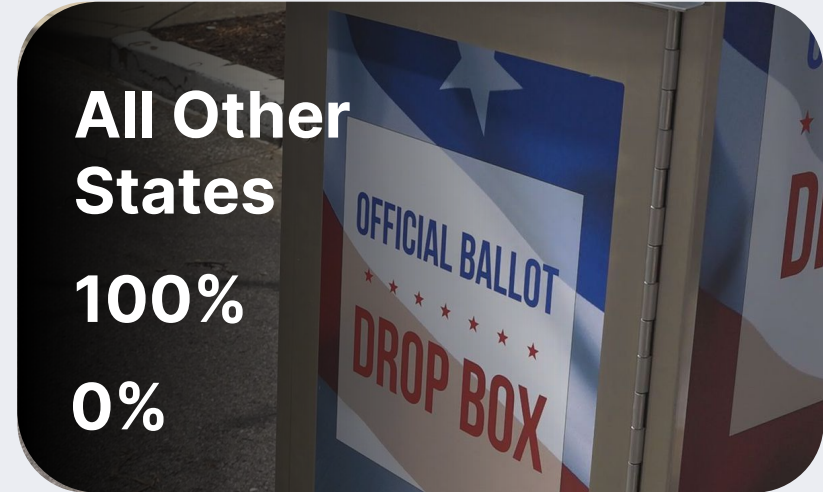
**With Biden's current lead** nationally and in specific states (*FiveThirtyEight* avgs)

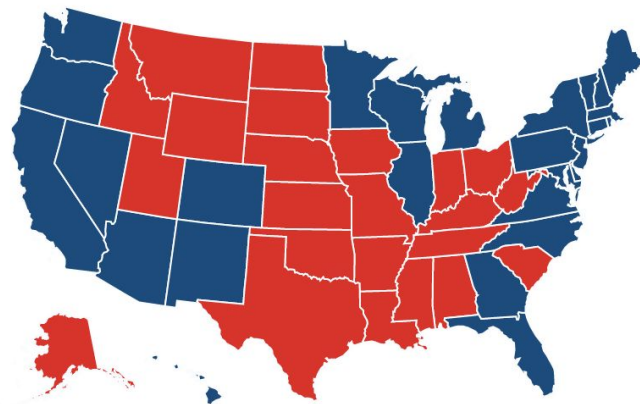
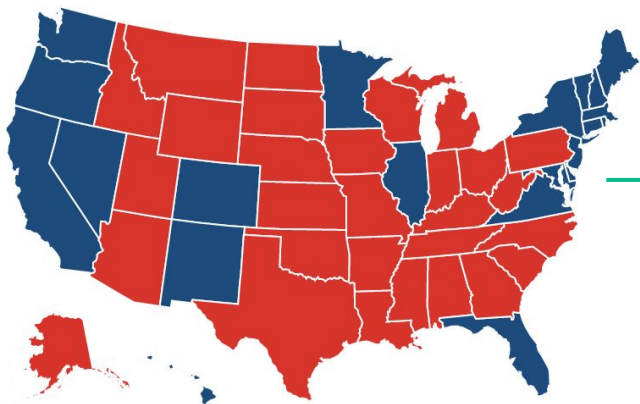

# Scenario B: VBM Delays + non-partisan rejections



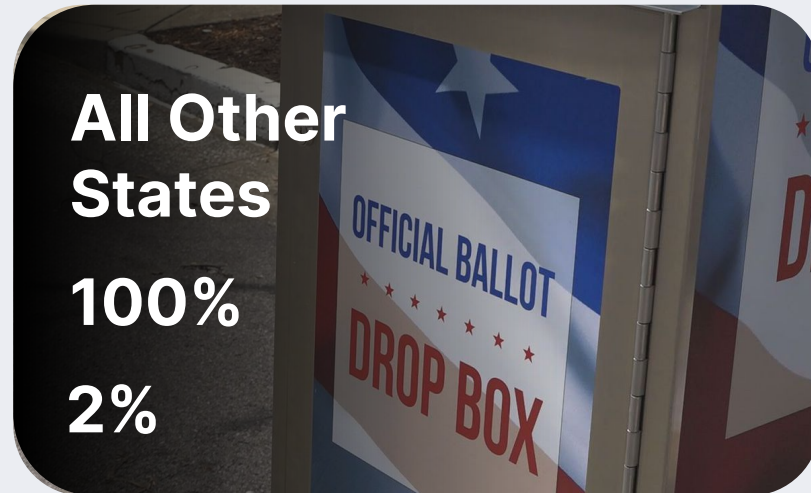
**With Biden's current lead** nationally and in specific states (*FiveThirtyEight* avgs)

**If high risk states are able to count 2/3 of their VBM ballots on election night,**  
and 5% of their VBM ballots are rejected (due to postal delays, signature matching, or other technical challenges)...

# Scenario B: Limited delays + non-partisan rejections

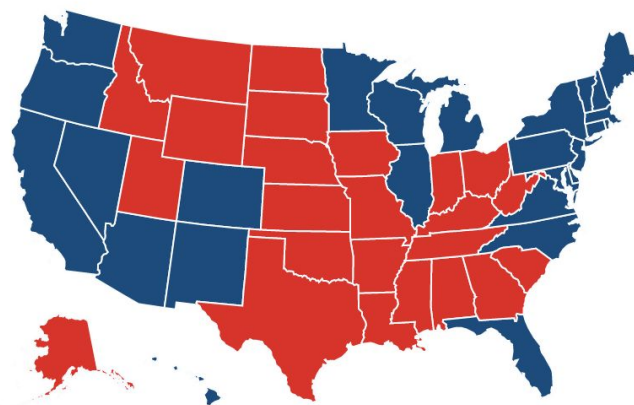
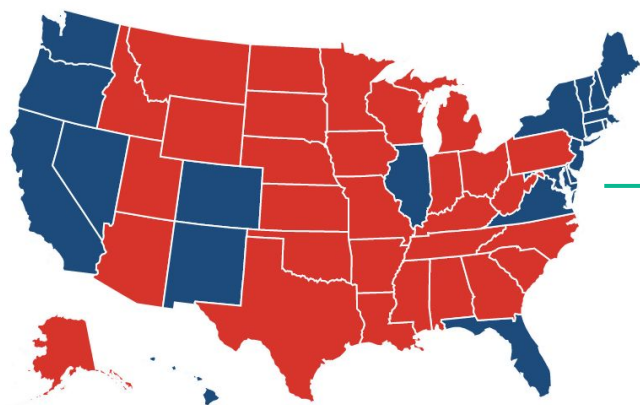

Limited non-partisan rejections (e.g. late ballots) likely inconsequential (trailing in MN on election night and lose GA in final results)

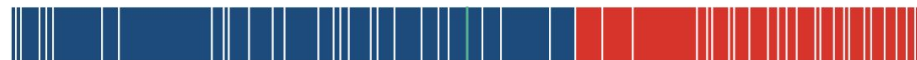

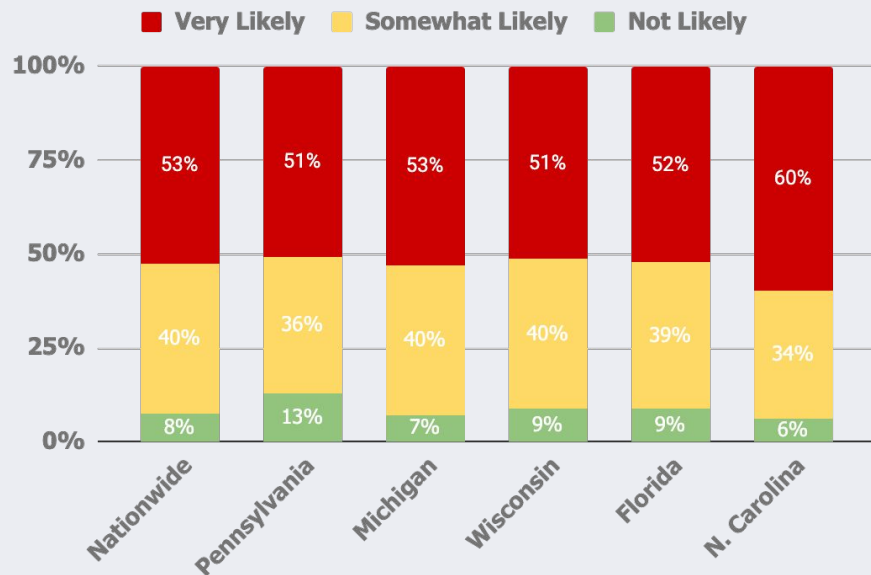

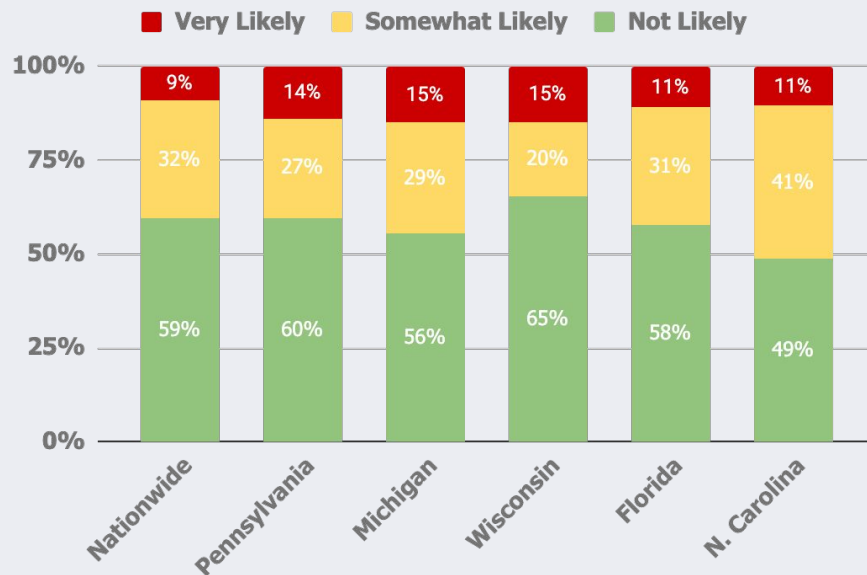
# VBM ballot concerns (among Trump supporters) remain

## % of Trump Supporters Concerned



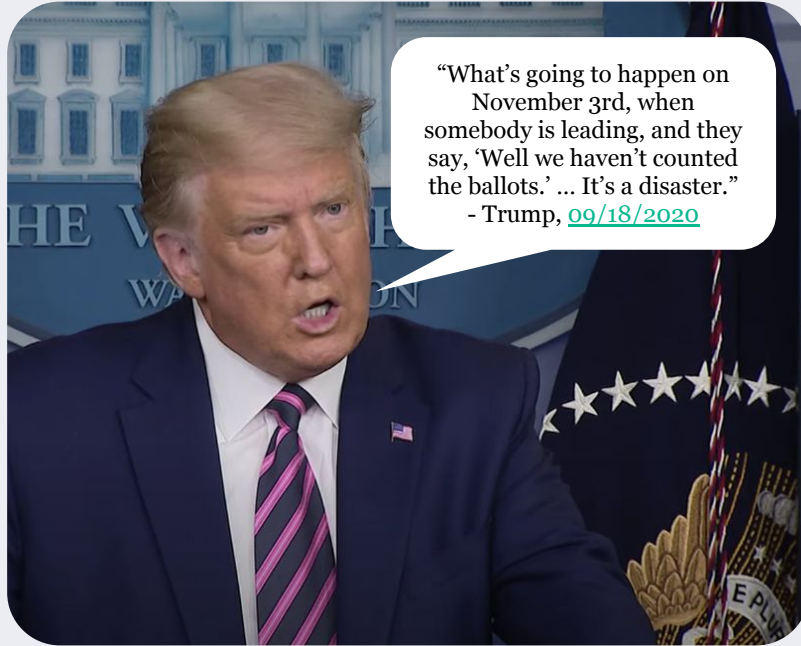
## % of Biden Supporters Concerned

## *Needle Update: What to Expect on Election Night*

This year, an additional reason the results will be unrepresentative is the method of vote count. Our needle needs to know not only where votes remain uncouneted, but also whether they were cast mainly on Election Day, early in-person or via mail. For most states, we just won't have that data in real time.

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# Methodology



## Inputs, analyses, and scenarios

To assess vote choice and intention to vote by mail versus at one's polling place, we surveyed above 13,783 registered voters in fifty states and the District of Columbia between October 15, 2020 and October 22, 2020. Responses were filtered to those who said they were likely to vote and weighted to represent state and national registered voter demographics.

Our survey data allowed us to calculate state-specific estimates of vote choice for each voting method, adjusting vote choice to recent published state and national *FiveThirtyEight* estimates (October 24, 2020).

For our scenarios, we assumed that all votes at the polls will be counted on election day (November 3).

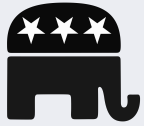
While projections of how long it will take for states to handle the higher volume of VBM ballots vary greatly, the [Brookings Institute](#) suggests “we may have to prepare for election week, or even election month.” For mail-in ballots, we grouped states by several VBM reporting risk factors, and we adjusted the counting and rejection rate for each group.
