### FLORIDA MAN SAYS In Florida, while there are more registered Democrats than Republicans, there are more

likely voters who are Republican. In 2016, for example, more Republicans voted than Democrats.








How many Republican and Democratic voters have not requested a mail-in ballot? Vote by Mail Request Deadline in Florida: October 24th, 2020

The final outcome will depend largely on voters who show up in person. We track the number of voters from each party who have yet to vote as well as those who have not requested a mail-in ballot. We do not expect all of them to vote; Florida's 2016 turnout rate was 75%.
