Charlotte Transportation Guide

Once you're in town, navigating the city is a breeze. With a speedy light rail system, multiple bike- and ride-sharing services, and bus routes that traverse the region, Charlotte offers plenty of ways to get you from point A to points B, C, and D.



LYNX Blue Line

The LYNX light rail system in Charlotte offers convenient service with 26 stops connecting neighborhoods like Uptown (the downtown area), NoDa (a vibrant arts district), South End (a nightlife and dining hub), South Charlotte, and University City (home to the UNC Charlotte campus). Parking is available at seven park-and-ride lots along the line. Stops at the Brooklyn Village and Convention Center stations drop you within walking distance of the stadium.

<u>Bus System</u>

The Charlotte Area Transit System (CATS) is the public transportation provider operating the city's bus routes and LYNX light rail systems. Charlotte boasts 65 bus routes with 2,957 bus stops.

CityLYNX Gold Line Streetcar

The CityLYNX Gold Line Streetcar follows an east-west path through central Charlotte, running through the historic West End, Uptown, and Elizabeth neighborhoods. It has 17 stops and is designed to offer convenient connections to the LYNX Blue Line light rail and CATS bus services.

Biking

Hundreds of bike-sharing options are available throughout the city. Dockless bike-sharing companies like Lime and Spin allow riders to pick up and leave their colorful bikes in any legal location.

Scooters

For quick trips, keep an eye out for dockless electric scooters around the city. Bird, Lime, and Spin scooters can be accessed via app, making it super easy to zip through neighborhoods. Don't forget your helmet.
