This year, we proudly invested \$400,000 into 15 nonprofits who are committed to cultivating financial wellness, driving financial literacy and creating financial freedom, from Central Florida to the I-4 Corridor, which includes Orange, Volusia, Seminole, Osceola, Hillsborough, Lake and Flagler Counties.

In 2024, FAIRWINDS Foundation partnered with a number of organizations whose main focus is financial literacy amongst school-aged children. One of our grant recipients, Junior Achievement USA (JA), received a \$50,000 grant to make strides in helping students identify their personal interests, skills, work preferences and career interests. This year, they taught a total of 28,584 students life-long skills — 15,435 students across Central Florida and 13.149 students in Tampa Bay and Hillsborough.

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"Many times, kids don't have any idea what a budget is," a volunteer with JA of Tampa Bay said. "By taking these classes, students experience a big 'aha!' moment that they'll carry with them for the rest of their lives."

Like JA, Quest, Inc., a nonprofit that focuses on supporting children and adults with developmental disabilities, poured its \$15,000 grant into its own financial literacy program: Quest Kids Academy, which helped 16 students master new money management, decision making and transaction skills throughout the spring semester.

Even after the school year ended, the learning continued. With help from its \$25,000 grant, CareerSource Central Florida's (CSCF) Summer Youth Program served 1,434 students from Lake, Orange, Osceola, Seminole and Sumter Counties, providing hands-on career exploration, financial literacy and workforce readiness.

"The program was a game-changer," Anaiya Aliceia, Summer Youth Program attendee, said. "I've never had this much control over my money before, and it's honestly empowering. Now, I'm thinking long-term, like how to manage my money so I can have more freedom and options in the future."

Students across Central Florida weren't the only ones thinking about their futures — teachers also benefited from learning more money management skills. In addition to keeping up its math and financial literacy program and initiatives at Title I Orange County Public School partner schools, with its \$10,000 grant, City Year Orlando provided AmeriCorps instructors in math classrooms the resources and tools needed to support hundreds of students.

Similarly, after being asked to provide insight in the building of a financial literacy curriculum in partnership with the Florida Department of Education, FoolProof, a nonprofit that reduces cycles of inequality through financial literacy, dedicated its \$50,000 grant to update its curriculum and directly support teachers in professional development courses related to financial literacy.

supporting journeys to self-sufficiency.

When it comes to financial freedom, career-readiness training proves to be just as important as financial literacy training.

School-aged children aren't the only ones gearing up for the next stage of their lives. FAIRWINDS Foundation supported a number of organizations whose focus is lifting up adults through financial literacy and careerreadiness support.

For The Sharing Center, offering individuals any necessary financial education and support to get them

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back on their feet is core to its mission. The nonprofit applied its \$10,000 grant to expand ProjectRISE, a program helping individuals grappling with homelessness and poverty be job-ready citizens, wellversed in essential life and work skills.

Since its inception ProjectRISE has touched the lives of over 100 individuals, and so has United Against Poverty Orlando's (UP Orlando) financial literacy program. This year, UP Orlando's \$15,000 grant fueled its Success Training Employment Program (STEP), helping low-income individuals and families gain workforce development, long-term career counseling and financial literacy training.

"I lost my job six months after I started due to health reasons, but thanks to UP Orlando, I found part-time work," Mandy, a STEP participant, recalled. "I've loved the positive environment at STEP and the 'no shame' culture UP Orlando has cultivated. It has meant everything to me as I got back on my feet."

Lighthouse Central Florida has helped hundreds navigate life as well. A nonprofit focused on providing



essential life support to those who are blind or visually impaired, its financial literacy program used its \$25,000 to help 400 individuals aged five and older with identifying currency, budgeting and career exploration.

Lifting up another underserved community, *FAIRWINDS* Foundation also awarded Prospera USA with a \$40,000 grant, providing financial literacy courses to Hispanic communities. This funding helped Prospera bridge gaps in Hispanic entrepreneurial success, equipping individuals with the tools to make sound financial decisions while addressing linguistic and cultural barriers.

"FAIRWINDS has demonstrated a commitment to investing in our communities and engaging meaningfully year-round," Prospera President & CEO Augusto Sanabria said. "Their financial and volunteer contributions to Prospera make a difference in our ability to educate, guide and empower more local Hispanic entrepreneurs who are starting, sustaining and growing small businesses."










Habitat for Humanity Seminole-Apopka dedicated part of its \$30,000 grant to its Financial Academy and Financial Education Program, teaching 206 participants how to budget, save and manage their finances, as well as putting some, like DiSen, on a path to owning — and keeping — a home.

DiSen was experiencing homelessness when she first heard about Habitat Financial Academy. Knowing she wasn't financially where she wanted to be, she took advantage of the program, applying all the skills she learned to eventually reduce her debt, pay off her car and save money. Now, she's living her wildest dreams, having just selected the lot where her house will be built.

Habitat for Humanity Greater Orlando and Osceola County is making dreams a reality too for its program participants. Taking its financial classes to a new level, the organization invested parts of its \$40,000 grant in the expert staff at Habitat U that make the program possible. For Nikita, one of the 557 individuals that gained the tools and confidence to build lasting financial security and buy a home, these classes changed her and her daughter's life.

"I'm very grateful for those classes because I wouldn't have known what I know now and I feel so confident in my decision-making," the single mom said. "I'm looking forward to my daughter having a safe, stable place she can grow up in."

Experts have found that individuals with a stronger grasp of financial concepts are better prepared to navigate and bounce back from crises. But what happens when individuals have minimal financial knowledge and experience hardship?

That's when organizations like IMPOWER step in. With programs in place to expand financial literacy services for children and teens struggling with addiction or homelessness, IMPOWER focused its \$15,000 grant on helping young people budget, build their credit and save their money.

Since March, 21 homeless youth have developed critical skills to prepare them to transition to financial independence. Additionally, IMPOWER has successfully served 69 vulnerable teens with individual support plans as they recover from serious chemical dependency issues, including opioid addiction.

As these teens transition to a stable, safer life, so do the survivors at Harbor House. A nonprofit that strives to prevent and break the cycle of domestic abuse, Harbor House's \$30,000 grant fueled 1,093 Economic Empowerment Program (EEP) services, helping 249 survivors learn financial safety plans, open bank accounts, better their credit, gain employment and more through individual counseling.

Individuals at Community Foundation & United Way of Volusia-Flagler Counties have also found success through one-on-one financial planning. A nonprofit helping families and individuals have access to and manage sustaining income, its \$20,000 grant went to helping individuals like Adam, a Gulf War veteran who through resilience, community support and careful financial planning, rebuilt his life step-by-step, embodying the spirit of perseverance that defined his military service.

Adam isn't alone in seeking help as a veteran. Camaraderie Foundation used its \$20,000 grant to provide financial wellness support specifically for military service members, veterans and their families. This year, 800 individuals were served, 100% of them reporting that they appreciate the value of financial literacy as a tool that opens the doors to passive income, budget creation, reduced spending strategies, diligent investments and credit risk minimization.

"I never expected that learning financial literacy would be so empowering," U.S. Army veteran and Financial Wellness for Veterans program participant said. "Thanks to the Camaraderie Foundation, I feel prepared to take care of myself and my family moving forward."

We're proud to celebrate our crewmembers — the heart of FAIRWINDS — who dedicated their time, talent and energy to making our community stronger. This year, in honor of our 75th anniversary and our commitment to building thriving communities, we launched CommUNITY Crew, a volunteer program granting eight hours of paid volunteer time off (VTO) to empower crewmembers to give back.
