Without strong financial literacy, people simply can't take full control of their finances, their family lives or their future. On a national scale, our economy suffers. That's why we believe financial literacy is the best tool to ensure stability across our community, and our country.

This year, we proudly invested \$325,000 into 12 nonprofits who are committed to cultivating financial wellness, driving financial literacy and creating financial freedom, from Central Florida to the I-4 Corridor, which includes Orange, Volusia, Seminole, Osceola, Hillsborough, Lake and Flagler Counties.

For CareerSource Central Florida (CSCF), this looks like helping students discover their path to a dream career.

With its \$25,000 grant, CSCF continued to invest in financial literacy, building upon the financial fundamentals in its Summer Youth Program. CSCF had the opportunity of empowering nearly 1,200 students, ages 15 to 19 through the program, helping them explore career paths, learn more about financial literacy, practice specialized career training, and gain work experience with local businesses.

"Students are gaining soft skills in the time they're with us," Nilda Blanco, Senior Vice President of Workforce Operations at CSCF, said. "We see them enter the program unsure of what to expect and leave it with a newfound confidence about who they are, what they're capable of and what's possible for them."

By enrolling into the course, participants opened the door to opportunities they never knew existed.

"I didn't know I could be a Computer Numerical Control Production Assistant until I learned about it over the summer," Jose, a Summer Youth Program participant who is now actively pursuing credentials in the machining industry, said. "I wish more people could experience what I did because it is truly something special."

These special experiences are what organizations like Lift Orlando focus on. Committed to strengthening neighborhoods with economic viability opportunities, Lift Orlando directly helps individuals and families in the The Communities of West Lakes and Central Florida's 32805 ZIP Code.

"As a place-based nonprofit, we meet people where they are, right where they live, and create opportunities for them," Eddy Moratin, President of Lift Orlando, said. "When you start to change the options available for people, those people can make good financial and life choices for themselves, and their families."

Lift Orlando invested its \$25,000 grant to work with residents, business leaders and community partners to strengthen services provided through West Lakes Financial Well Being Center and the Small Business Institute. By working directly within the community, individuals, families and business owners had greater access to personalized financial guidance. With the insight and resources they gained from Lift Orlando, more individuals had what they needed for the next step in their lives, from growing a business to owning a home.

In 2023, FAIRWINDS Foundation partnered with a number of organizations whose main focus is financial literacy amongst school-aged children. One of our grant recipients, Junior Achievement USA (JA), received a \$50,000 grant to make strides in its mission and vision as a nonprofit.

JA is dedicated to giving young people the knowledge and skills they need to own their economic success, plan for their future and make smart academic and economic choices. Through the JA Finance Park program, 24,509 students in Central Florida and 12,000 students in Tampa Bay gained access to vital financial education. A majority of these students are from low to moderate income households...

Similar to JA's mission, nonprofit organization 8 Cents in a Jar focuses on creating opportunities for students in marginalized neighborhoods and communities of color to achieve economic mobility through financial education.

With help from the \$20,000 grant from FAIRWINDS Foundation, 8 Cents in a Jar adopted Lakeville Elementary for the Orlando Saves program. Throughout the three-month program, fourth and fifth grade students learned about personal finances, worked together to save money and talked to professionals to help them better understand careers in the financial industry.

"We all worked together to save \$479.75," a student at Lakeville Elementary said at the end of the Orlando Saves program. "And now I know what I want to be when I grow up — a banker!"

As students grow up and go through their schooling, FAIRWINDS Foundation is there to support their journey in continuing their financial education. Organizations like FoolProof Foundation contribute to the growth in Financial Literacy for students and teachers, using its \$25,000 grant to build curriculums on critical thinking and money skills that students can take with them through life.

Additionally, with a \$10,000 grant, City Year Orlando is continuing its math and financial literacy program and initiatives at Title I, Orange County Public School

partner schools, and also equip AmeriCorps members serving in math classrooms with the resources and tools to support hundreds of students on foundational skills.

"Students are still working hard to recoup from math learning losses that happened during the pandemic," Mona Duffus, Senior Vice President and Executive Director at City Year Orlando, said. "The support we've received from FAIRWINDS Foundation is vital to students' academic success, and amplifies our work to help students and schools excel."

While early education is foundational to financial confidence later in life, it's never too late to learn more about money, especially as an aspiring entrepreneur or current small business owner. With the right support and access to essential financial education, we believe anyone can take their business to the next level, turning any dream into a successful reality.

To help individuals take the next steps in their businesses, we partnered with organizations focused on helping these up-and-coming entrepreneurs.

FAIRWINDS Foundation granted Prospera USA \$50,000 to address financial literacy through focusing on the training and coaching of underserved Hispanics. Through the grant, Prospera bridged the gap in Hispanic entrepreneurship success, helping individuals avoid poor financial decisions and mitigating linguistic and cultural barriers through bilingual education, individualized support, and advanced business consulting.

These services were especially helpful for individuals like Elvis Torres, the owner of the surveying company Optimal Point Solutions. Working closely with Prospera, Elvis underwent a comprehensive assessment of his company's legal and accounting practices, which helped Elvis optimize business operations and strengthen overall financial management. Dedicated to refining his entrepreneurial skills, Elvis also participated in several of Prospera's business seminars this year, gaining the skills needed to move his business forward.

Like Prospera, BBIF (Black Business Investment Fund) is also equipping other minority-owned businesses with the financial education and investments needed for lifelong success. With a \$30,000 grant, BBIF hosted six business-centric financial literacy workshops throughout the year, scaling and tailoring the curriculum to best support businesses where they need it most.



With a \$30,000 grant from FAIRWINDS Foundation, Habitat for Humanity Greater Orlando and Osceola County increased its reach in financial education classes and one-on-one mentoring programs. The Habitat U Financial Education and Housing Counseling program offered these learning opportunities in English and Spanish, online and in-person, allowing 537 community members to improve their financial wellbeing and stability.

"The classes taught me about credit, how to balance my checkbook and how to keep my spending down," Fatima, a Habitat U participant, said. "Once I got my finances in order, everything fell into place for my kids and me."

With Habitat Orlando putting the grant money towards overall financial literacy classes, Habitat for Humanity Seminole-Apopka put its \$30,000 grant towards a more specialized financial education program, one that gets individuals and families on the right path to home ownership.

For people like Daniell, these specialized services meant the world.

A mother of four determined to rise above life's challenges — layoffs, car trouble, an unsafe home — Daniell applied and was accepted into the Habitat Homebuyers Program. Here, she got her finances in order, learning money management skills through custom financial courses.

With help from the program, Daniell transitioned from homelessness to homeownership, buying a home for her and her family, and having the financial knowledge to keep it.

"Thanks to the FAIRWINDS Foundation's generous support, we get to help people like Daniell every day." Habitat CEO Penny Seater said. "The program has grown faster than imagined. We've graduated more than 200 people this past year alone."



It's a big part of why FAIRWINDS Foundation partners with organizations committed to equipping our community with the knowledge and tools needed to manage finances at all stages of life, even in the face of adversity.

For The Sharing Center, offering individuals any necessary financial education and support to get them back on their feet is core to its mission. The nonprofit applied its \$10,000 grant from FAIRWINDS Foundation to start ProjectRISE, a program with a goal to transform individuals grappling with homelessness and poverty into job-ready citizens, well-versed in essential life and work skills.

Throughout the year, over 50 participants received job offers after finishing ProjectRISE. Beyond individual skill development, ProjectRISE has also indirectly benefited over 300 family members of the participants, proving how reaching one individual can affect so many others.

As ProjectRISE program participants transitioned back to everyday life, so do the survivors at Harbor House, a nonprofit that strives to prevent and break the cycle of domestic abuse through empowerment-based programs, advocacy, education, and community involvement.

Knowing that physical and financial abuse often go hand-in-hand, Harbor House applied its \$20,000 grant to continue to fuel its financial literacy and economic empowerment program. Here, survivors received custom financial support, each working through their own goals, from buying a car or getting legal support to opening a bank account or putting a down payment on a house.

With the right support, these individuals found their way to a life where they can reach their full potential.

"The generosity of *FAIRWINDS* Foundation helps us provide invaluable economic empowerment programming and financial literacy education to hundreds of women, children, and men each year. Moving survivors beyond the basic needs and survival they first need when they come to us, this program sets them up for lifelong independence and success.
