

Sierra Wireless Products : California Regulation on Chemicals Proposition 65

Proposition 65, officially known as the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, was enacted as a ballot initiative in November 1986. The proposition protects the state's drinking water sources from being contaminated with chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm, and requires businesses to inform Californians about exposures to such chemicals.

To the best of its knowledge and having carried out appropriate diligence, Sierra Wireless believes that under normal conditions, Sierra products are in compliance with Proposition 65. Sierra products may contain identified chemicals, but these chemicals are not accessible to the customer during normal use, so level of exposure is low. Therefore, products do not require a Proposition 65 warning label.



Nevertheless, during destructive decomposition, Sierra Wireless' products may release trace amounts of chemicals, including Lead (Pb), Arsenic (As), Nickel (Ni) alloys/plating, Antimony Trioxide, Carbon black (CAS1333-86-4), Titanium Dioxide (13463-67-7), which are known to the State of California to cause cancer or birth defects or other reproductive harm.
