Green Fundraising Ideas



Nature Walk-a-thon

Show off your Envirothon skills by taking your family and friends on a nature walk—identify the trees around you, the understory plants, or the footprints in the mud. Have people donate to your team or get sponsored to participate in your walk-a-thon.

Sell homegrown food and flowers

Does your school have a greenhouse? Consider planting some vegetable seeds in late winter, and sell the plants in spring to your local community.





Pancake Breakfast

Host a pancake breakfast at your school or within your local community, and make sure to include a fruit salad to add a healthy element!

School garage sale

Reuse! Invite students and families to donate items to a school garage sale, with all proceeds supporting your Ontario Envirothon team!





Design and sell cards

Have an artistic flair? Use one-sided paper to make cards and sell them to families and friends to use throughout the year. If your printers only print one-sided, then recycle the used paper by folding the paper in half, and then in half again to create a card.

Sell natural Christmas ornaments

Make natural Christmas ornaments using orange slices, pine cones, and cinnamon sticks or look online for lots of other great nature-inspired decorations.





Textile Recycling Drive

Help divert recyclable textiles from landfill and fundraising at the same time! Open to teams from regions where Textile Waste Diversion operates. More details on the next page.

Reduce Waste while Fundraising for Envirothon!

Did you know that textiles are recyclable and that diverting them from landfill can help reduce carbon emissions? Despite this 85% of all textiles in Canada currently end up in landfills.

You can help divert textiles from landfills while raising money for your Ontario Envirothon registration with **Textile Waste Diversion**. Participating teams will receive 10 cents per lb of eligible collected textiles.

Textiles can be in any condition as long as they are clean, dry and odorless. Accepted items include the following; used clothing, shoes/boots, purses, belts, eyeglasses, outerwear, linens/soft drapery and plush toys. Collected items must be in tied plastic bags to prevent damage.

Textile Waste Diversion currently operates in the following cities.

It can take 100 yrs for organic textile to decompose in landfill.

Get Started

Set up a textile drive committee that includes at least one teacher or staff member. Set a pound goal for how much you wish to collect.

Set a date to end your clothing drive that will give your team enough time to collect contributions. All drives must be completed and collected no later than April 1, 2019.

Ask permission from the school for a place where you can collect the clothing for the length of the clothing drive.

Suggestions:

Before your items are pick-up get creative photographs of your pile of clothing. Images shared with Textile Waste Diversion may be shared on social media.

Consider getting your local community involved. Perhaps a few local businesses will be willing to collect items on behalf of your team!

Have questions about setting up a textile drive? Contact Textile Waste Diversion at (888).980.8756 95% of what is collected is diverted from landfill. The best stuff stays local, what cannot be reused is recycled.

- Contact Textile Waste Diversion and let them know you are running a drive no later than Feb 25, 2019.
- At the end of your drive provide Textile
 Waste Diversion an estimated bag
 count so they can arrange for pick-up.
 Please note Textile Waste Diversion
 is only able to accommodate one pick-up
 run. Please ensure the pick-up location
 is easily accessible.
- Your contributions will then be weighed and payment issued promptly.
