Before your next appointment:

- Ask yourself: Do I understand the purpose of each test and what it tells me?



During your appointment:

1. Ask questions to better understand your monitoring plan

- What's the role of each lab test in monitoring the ongoing health of my transplant?
- Is AlloSure currently part of my post-transplant care plan? If not, how would it fit?
- Is AlloSure appropriate for me? If it is, how often should I get an AlloSure test?

2. Share why you are interested in AlloSure. This could include:

- I want to stay ahead of potential challenges. I like that AlloSure may detect problems sooner than other methods.
- I appreciate the convenience of AlloSure – all it takes is a routine blood draw.

What is AlloSure?
