# <u>By the</u> numbers

The National Summer School Initiative offers an entirely new way to build teacher capacity and boost academic gains. This summer, thousands of like-minded educators joined forces with NSSI to deliver extraordinary learning experiences across the nation. From its inaugural summer in 2020 with 12,000 students, NSSI's impact has vastly expanded now preparing 82,000 students to thrive in the 2024-25 school year.

Guided by NSSI's expert mentors, 4,250 teachers and 715 school leaders sharpened their instructional skills and helped their students achieve meaningful academic gains. 27 partners

The education economist Thomas Kane has said that "summer is the most underused—and unequal—time of year educationally."

He's right: The effects of summer learning loss are in fact so grave that for a large swath of students it nearly erases the gains they made during the school year and blocks their path forward. Even averting summer slide can have dramatic effect on a child's educational trajectory.

But if we help students gain important ground during the summer—if we make the summer some of the best instructional weeks of the year children can thrive in the next grade and stay firmly on the path to college and career.

All of us at the National Summer School Initiative were deeply honored to be invited to partner with a diverse set of districts and CMOs from across the country. We were especially delighted that nearly all of last year's partners elected to work with us again. With 27 partners across 13 states, we reached 82,000 students, almost doubling our numbers from summer 2023.

But our work with teachers from partner districts and CMOs-4,250 strong—and leaders was especially gratifying. Across all of our partnerships, teachers experienced the power of discourse-based instruction to accelerate student learning.

Every year, we aim to get better. We are excited to prepare in the coming months for an even more impactful Summer 2025!

# Increase academic value from summer months

#### The problem

Inequitable access to summer learning exacerbates the achievement gap. Remedial summer programs are often uninspired. Enrichment-only does nothing to build academic skills.

#### Our solution

Partners choose NSSI to 'up their summer game' ensuring it becomes highly leveraged academic time that produces student gains. NSSI's program supports the teacher and addresses the needs of every learner.

## **ELA gains**

By putting rich discourse at the center, NSSI's ELA curriculum engages students in the deep, rigorous critical thinking it takes to unlock meaning across genres.

Assessments administered at the start and end of the program showed striking gains in student achievement. On a 100-point scale, the average class score in K-8 ELA increased by 12 percentage points from pre- to post-assessment. All grades showed improvement, with average gains ranging from two points to 19 points.



Two-thirds of parents observed growth in their child's reading skills as a result of summer school. A parent from Élan Academy Charter School shared, "My child is confident and comes home to work on assignments independently." A parent from NYCPS District 27 wrote, "My kids have shown significant growth in their academic abilities."

Teachers consistently reported high student engagement with NSSI's novels. Kelly Kiernick, a third-grade ELA teacher from First Philadelphia Preparatory Charter, wrote, "I have some students who are usually afraid to participate and to see them not only participate, but engage in higher level thinking this summer is wonderful!" Racquel Simpson, a sixth-grade ELA teacher from NYCPS District 17, wrote, "The material was so engaging—my students wanted to read more than the required pages each day."



## **Math gains**

On a 100-point scale, the average class score in K-8 and high school math increased by 24 percentage points from pre- to post-assessment. All grades showed improvement, with average gains ranging from 14 points to 45 points.

Teachers consistently noted how NSSI's curriculum got their students excited about math. Jeff Westhelle, a fifth-grade math teacher from Seminole County, wrote, "Students said, 'Math is fun'!" Chelsey Katona, a seventh-grade math teacher from Gem Prep, shared "My students thoroughly enjoyed the real world problems and how they could relate to them. They often said 'Oh, I've seen that before!' or 'It makes sense why we need to learn math!' The curriculum made math feel so much more applicable."

Patricia Loya, a fourth-grade teacher from Voices College-Bound Language Academy, shared, "One of my students who usually shuts down around math is now so excited to ask for additional division questions—and she wants to do them at the white board in front of everyone! She's giddy with happiness."

NSSI's math program fosters conceptual understanding and critical thinking to drive deep learning.

Across grades, math students made impressive gains from pre- to postassessments.

# "Now I can do math!"

Teachers consistently observed growth in their students' academic confidence. Jessica Michelman, a fifth-grade math teacher from NYCPS District 30, wrote, "I had one student stop me and say 'Now I can do math! I didn't know fractions and now I do—I can even divide!"

Parents reported their children more invested in learning than before the program's start. ## Leverage summer to <u>strengthen</u> instructional practice.

#### The problem

Moving from didactic to cognitively guided instruction is challenging. PD hours during the academic year are often minimal, not differentiated, and ineffectual.

#### **Our solution**

Partners choose NSSI to upskill teachers in inquirybased, discourse rich pedagogy as a means to improve Tier 1 instruction throughout the year. Transformative teacher training is at the heart of NSSI's model. Guided by our extraordinary Mentor Teachers, teachers hone their craft by watching their Mentors' moves and making them their own.
