

# National Police and Fire Scholarship

**To honor our nation's firefighters' and police officers' service to this country, the University of Chicago announces its annual scholarship program.**

To be considered for this scholarship, candidates must be accepted to the University of Chicago and be children, stepchildren, or the legally adopted children of currently active, sworn municipal, county, or state firefighters or police officers in the United States and Puerto Rico. Students whose parent lost his or her life or was injured in the line of duty, or are mandatorily retired, are also eligible to apply.

Students selected for the scholarship can receive up to full-tuition coverage (12 academic quarters), provided they make satisfactory academic progress and remain enrolled full-time in the College.

Additionally, UChicago meets 100% of demonstrated need for students applying for financial aid.



## APPLICATION PROCEDURES

### All Applicants

Please complete the Common App or Apply Coalition, Powered by Scoir, as well as the UChicago Supplement, by the application deadline of your choosing. Candidates for the National Police and Fire Scholarship may apply by November 1st\* under either the Early Action or Early Decision I application plans or by January 2nd\* under the Early Decision II or Regular Decision plans, but may not be notified of scholarship selection results until mid-April.

Please complete both the student portion and the verification section of the Certification Form and directly upload the document into your UChicago Account by **November 1st\*** if applying for Early Decision I/Early Action or **January 2nd\*** if applying for Early Decision II/Regular Decision under the Police and Fire Verification Form tab. Students are also able to mail or fax these Certification Forms to the admissions office.

In addition to providing the applicant's and parent's names and information, we ask that students also include the name and contact information for the representative who will be able to supply employment verification for their parent's position.

\*If an application deadline falls on a weekend or holiday, the deadline will instead be the next business day.
