The survey work

- Aboreal mammal habitat association research project.
- Small ground mammal habitat association research project.
- Motion-sensing camera projects resulting in many threatened animal and plant records added to the Victorian Biodiversity Atlas (VBA) database and new records of the threatened species.
- Greater Glider (Petauroides volans) spotlighting resulting in over 480 records added to the VBA
- Powerful Owl (Ninox strenua)
 searches, five breeding sites discovered.
- Barking Owl (Ninox connivens) searches, one breeding site discovered.
- Wombat Bossiaea(Bosssiaea vombata) plants found in rare plant searches, resulting in uncovering four of five known locations.
- Eastern Bent-wing Bat
 (Miniopterus orianae oceanensis) colonies
 located with a Song Meter acoustic recorder
- Mountain Skink (Liopholis montana) searches resulting in over 90 new records, extending the skink's range to Lerderderg State Park, and south and west of known locations.
- Brush-tailed Phascogale
 (Phascogale tapoatafa) recorded in multiple
 locations providing reliable local habitat
 descriptions.
- · Records of rare and unusual fungi.
- Communities Listening for Nature participant. The project, run by VNPA and Museums Victoria, used automated sound recorders to monitor birds
 - critically endagered
 - EN endangered
 - vulnerable
