## LOW-FIRE

Glaze shown was fired flat to cone 06 on white earthenware body.

Blick Essentials Gloss Glazes come in a variety of bright, true colors that can be intermixed to create an infinite palette of custom shades. The liquid color is consistent with the fired color so there will be no trouble visualizing the finished fired result while painting.

Blick Essentials Gloss Glazes can be used for opaque coverage or intricate design. They glide smoothly onto bisque, with a self-leveling formula that eliminates brushstrokes from the fired finish. Each coat dries quickly, speeding up handling time and allowing for additional decoration — great for classroom settings.



## MID-RANGE

Glaze shown was fired flat to cone 6 on white stoneware body.

Many Blick Essentials Gloss Glazes perform well at mid-range (cone 5/6). Darker colors such as green, red, blue, orange, and purple may darken compared to their cone 06 results. Lightly pigmented colors such as pink, yellow, tan, and lighter purples will fade. We recommend testing at your preferred firing temperature prior to use. Color performance at cone 6 is noted on each label.

No matter your firing temperature, Blick Essentials Gloss Glazes are easy to apply, consistent in firing, and essential in the studio or classroom.
