

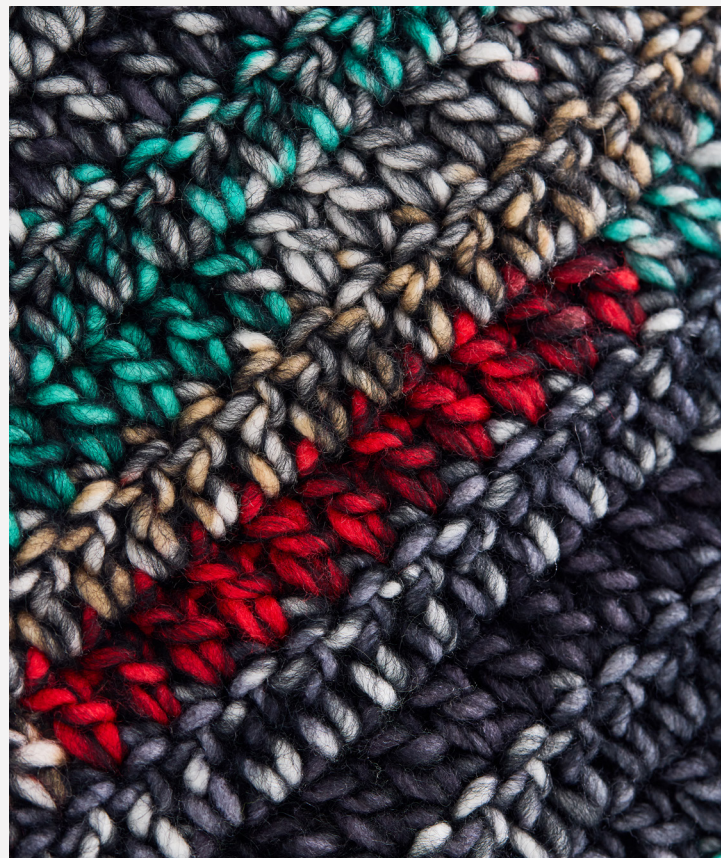

# Garden Vista Scarf

FREE CROCHET PATTERN

# Garden Vista Scarf



**TYPE:** Crochet

**DESIGNER:** Amy Gunderson for Premier Yarns®

**FINISHED MEASUREMENTS:**

**Length:** 81"

**Width:** 11"

**GAUGE:**

8 dc x 4 rows = 4"

**Save time, check your gauge.**

**MATERIALS:**

Premier® Yarns Spice Shop™ (80% Acrylic, 20% Wool; 3.5 oz/100g, 109yds/100m)

- CC1: 2137-01 Salt and Pepper – 3 balls
- CC2: 2137-02 Cayenne – 3 balls

**HOOKS & NOTIONS:**

- US Size L-11 (8 mm) or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

**SKILLS/TECHNIQUES USED IN THIS PATTERN:**

- Chains and double crochet stitches.
- Increases and decreases.
- Changing colors.

## PATTERN NOTES

This Scarf is worked flat in one piece on the bias. Increases are made on one side of the Scarf while decreases are made on the other side causing a slanted, biased piece.

Cut colors after each color change. When changing from one color to another, work up to the last pull-through in final stitch of the row with the old color, complete the stitch with the new color.

## SCARF

With CC1, ch 34.

**Row 1:** Dc in fourth ch from hook (skipped chs count as a dc), 2 dc in next ch, dc in each ch to last 3, dc2tog, dc in last ch, turn – 32 dc.

**Row 2:** Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), dc2tog, dc in each dc to last 2, 2 dc in next dc, dc in last dc, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 3, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each dc to last 3, dc2tog, dc in last dc, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 3, dc2tog, dc in each dc to last 2, 2 dc in next dc, dc in last dc changing to CC2, turn. Cut CC1.

**Rows 5-8:** With CC2, rep Rows 3-4, 2 times, changing to CC1 on last st. Cut CC2.

**Rows 9-12:** With CC1, rep Rows 3-4, 2 times, changing to CC2 on last st. Cut CC1.

Rep the last 8 rows until piece measures approximately 75", ending on a Row 8 or 12.

Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends and block lightly.

## ABBREVIATIONS

<b>CC</b>	contrast color
<b>ch</b>	chain
<b>dc</b>	double crochet
<b>dc2tog</b>	double crochet 2 stitches together (1 st decreased)
<b>rep</b>	repeat
<b>st(s)</b>	stitch(es)
