## Peppercorn Pocket Scarf





**TYPE:** Crochet

**DESIGNER:** Liz Salazar for Premier Yarns®

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS:

Length: 56" Width: 9"

#### **GAUGE:**

4 SR x 9 rows = 6" Shell pattern (1 SR = 3 dc + 1 sc in Shell pattern) Save time, check your gauge.

#### **MATERIALS:**

<u>Premier® Yarns Spice Shop™</u> (80% Acrylic, 20% Wool; 3.5oz/100g, 109yds/100m)

2137-05 Saffron - 4 balls

#### **HOOKS & NOTIONS:**

- US Size L-11 (8 mm) or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

#### SKILLS/TECHNIQUES USED IN THIS PATTERN:

- · Chain, double and single crochet stitches.
- Seaming using mattress stitch.

#### STITCH GUIDE

**Shell (Sh):** 3 dc in indicated st/sp.

**Shell Pattern** (multiple of 4 chs + 2)

**Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook, \*sk next ch, **Sh** in next ch, sk next ch, sc in next ch; rep from \* across, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 2 (counts as dc throughout), dc in same st, \*sk next dc, sc in next dc, sk next dc\*\*, **Sh** in next sc; rep from \* to last sc, ending last rep at \*\*, 2 dc in last sc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1 (does not count as a st throughout), sc in same st, \*sk next dc, Sh in next sc, sk next dc, sc in next dc; rep from \* across, turn.

Rep Rows 2-3 for pattern.

#### PATTERN NOTES

This Scarf is made in one piece with the ends folded up and sewn at sides to create the pockets.

#### **VEST**

Ch 26.

Work even in **Shell Pattern** until Scarf measures 76" – 6 SR. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

bottom edge of Scarf. Weave in remaining ends.

#### **FINISHING**

#### **POCKET**

Measure 10" from the bottom edge of Scarf and fold inward to create a 10" deep pocket. Using mattress stitch, seam Pocket section at both side edges. Rep on opposite
