# Morning Light Wrap



**TYPE:** Crochet

**DESIGNER:** Liz Salazar for Premier® Yarns

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS:

**Length:** 19¼"

**Width:** 81"

## GAUGE:

20 sts x 7 rows = 4" in Lacy Stitch patt

**Save time, check your gauge.**

## MATERIALS:

**Premier® Yarns** *Everyday® Worsted Gradient* (100% Anti-Pilling Acrylic; 7oz/200g, 360yds/330m)

- 2115-08 Yellow Tones – 3 balls

## HOOKS & NOTIONS:

- **US Size I-9 (5.5mm) or size needed to obtain gauge**
- **Tapestry needle**

## SKILLS/TECHNIQUES USED IN THIS PATTERN:

- Chain and double crochet stitches.

## STITCH GUIDE

**Large V-st:** [2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc] in indicated st/sp.

**Lacy Stitch Pattern** (*multiple of 12 chs + 4*)

**Row 1: Large V-st** in 8th ch from hook (first 4 skipped ch count as dc, ch-1), \*ch 1, sk 3 ch, dc in next ch, ch 1, sk 3 ch, **Large V-st** in next ch; rep from \* to last 4 ch, ch 1, sk 3 ch, dc in last ch, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch-1), \***Large V-st** in ch-1 sp of next **Large V-st**, ch 1, dc in next dc, ch 1; rep from \* across, omitting last ch-1 and working last dc in top of turning ch, turn.

Rep Row 2 for patt.

## PATTERN NOTES

This Wrap is worked flat from end to end.

## WRAP

*Note: Start at the dark end of the first cake, when adding the second cake, start at the light end and start at the dark end when adding the third cake.*  
Ch 100.

Work in **Lacy Stitch patt** until Wrap measures 81”.

## FINISHING

Fasten off. Weave in ends.
