# Coastal Grandmother Sweater

## SKILL LEVEL – EASY

## SIZE

XS/S (M/L, 1X/2X, 3X/4X)

**Finished Bust** About 39 (47, 55, 63) in. (99 (119.5, 139.5, 160) cm)

**Finished Length** About 24 (25, 26, 27) in. (61 (63.5, 66, 68.5) cm)

**Note:** Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

## MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® 24/7 COTTON® (Art. #761)  
#098 Ecru 6 (7, 9, 10) balls (A)  
#110 Navy 1 (1, 1, 1) ball (B)
- LION BRAND® stitch markers
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle



## ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Circular knitting needle size 6 (4 mm), 36 in. (91 cm) long

Circular knitting needle size 6 (4 mm), 16 in. (40.5 cm) long

## GAUGE

20 sts + 28 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) over St st (k on RS, p on WS).

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

## STITCH EXPLANATIONS

**M1 (make 1)** An increase worked by lifting the horizontal strand lying between needles and placing it onto the left needle. Knit this new stitch through the back loop – 1 st increased.

## PATTERN STITCHES

### K2, p2 Rib (multiple of 4 sts + 2 additional sts)

**Row 1:** K2, \*p2, k2; rep from \* to end of row.

**Row 2:** K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Rep Row 2 for K2, p2 Rib.

## NOTES

1. Sweater is worked in 4 pieces: Back, Front, and 2 Sleeves.
2. Each piece is worked, back and forth in rows, from the lower edge upwards.
3. For Sweater, a circular needle is used to accommodate sts. Work back and forth in rows on circular needle as if working with straight needles.
4. For neckband, work in rnds on smaller circular needle.
5. “Coastal Grandmother” lettering is worked in intarsia colorwork, changing yarn color following a Chart. Read RS rows of Chart from right to left and WS rows from left to right.
6. When working intarsia, do not carry yarn across WS of work between color changes, use a separate ball for each section of color. Twist yarns on WS to prevent holes. If carrying color across 5 or more sts, twist yarns on WS to prevent overly long strands (floats) on the WS.
7. Sts are picked up around neck edge for neckband.
8. When you see work ‘even’ in the instructions, this means to continue on in the pattern st without changing the st count by increasing, decreasing, or binding off.

## BACK

With longer needle and A, cast on 98 (118, 138, 158) sts.

Work in K2, p2 Rib until piece measures about 2 in. (5 cm) from beg.

Work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) until piece measures about 23 (24, 25, 26) in. (58.5 (61, 63.5, 66) cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

### *Shape Back Neck*

Place markers on each side of center 30 (32, 34, 38) sts for back neck

**Row 1 (RS):** Knit to first marker for right side of neck; join a 2nd ball of yarn and bind off sts between markers, remove markers, k to end of row for left side of neck – you will have 34 (43, 52, 60) sts for each side of neck.

You will now work both sides of neck AT THE SAME TIME, using separate balls of yarn.

**Row 2:** On left side, purl to end of side; on right side, bind off 2 sts, purl to end of side.

**Row 3:** On right side, knit to end of side; on left side, bind off 2 sts, knit to end of side – 32 (41, 50, 58) sts for each side of neck.

**Rows 4 and 5:** Rep Rows 2 and 3 – you will have 30 (39, 48, 56) sts for each side of neck in Row 5.

**Rows 6-7:** Work even in St st on both sides, using separate balls of yarn.

**Row 8:** On left side, bind off all sts; on right side, purl to end of side.

Bind off all right side sts.

## FRONT

Work same as Back until piece measures about 9 (10, 11, 12) in. (23 (25.5, 28, 30.5) cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

### *Charted Pattern*

**Row 1 (RS):** With A, k8 (18, 28, 38), place marker (pm), knit AND change yarn color following Row 1 of Chart over next 82 sts, pm, k8 (18, 28, 38).

Slipping markers as you come to them, continue to work in St st AND change yarn color between markers following Chart until all 64 rows of Chart have been completed.

Cut B.

With A, work even in St st until Front measures about 3 in. (7.5 cm) less than Back, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

### *Shape Front Neck*

Place markers on each side of center 20 (22, 24, 28) sts for front neck.

**Row 1 (RS):** Knit to first marker for left side of neck; join a 2nd ball of yarn and bind off sts between markers, remove markers, k to end of row for right side of neck – you will have 39 (48, 57, 65) sts for each side of neck.

You will now work both sides of neck AT THE SAME TIME, using separate balls of yarn.

**Row 2:** On right side, purl to end of side; on left side, bind off 2 sts, purl to end of side.

**Row 3:** On left side, knit to end of side; on right side, bind off 2 sts, knit to end of side – 37 (46, 55, 63) sts for each side of neck.

**Rows 4-9:** Rep Rows 2 and 3 for 3 more times – 31 (40, 49, 57) sts for each side of neck in Row 9.

**Row 10:** On right side, purl to end of side; on left side, bind off 1 st, purl to end of side.

**Row 11:** On left side, knit to end of side; on right side, bind off 1 st, knit to end of side – 30 (39, 48, 56) sts for each side of neck.

Work even in St st on both sides of neck, using separate balls of yarn, until piece measures same as Back.

With separate balls of yarn, bind off both sides of neck.

## SLEEVES (make 2)

With longer needle and A, cast on 50 (54, 58, 58) sts.

Work in K2, p2 Rib until piece measures about 2 in. (5 cm) from beg.

Beg with a WS (purl) row, work in St st for 7 (5, 5, 3) rows.

**Increase Row (RS):** K1, M1, k to last st, M1, k1 – 52 (56, 60, 60) sts.

Rep last 8 (6, 6, 4) rows for 10 (13, 16, 21) more times – 72 (82, 92, 102) sts.

Work even in St st until piece measures about 18 1/2 (18, 17 1/2, 16) in. (47 (45.5, 44.5, 40.5) cm) from beg.



## ***Shape Top of Sleeve***

**Next 10 rows:** Bind off 4 (5, 6, 6) sts, work in St st to end of row – 32 (32, 32, 42) sts.

**Next 4 rows:** Bind off 5 (5, 5, 7) sts, work in St st to end of row – 12 (12, 12, 14) sts.

Bind off.

## **FINISHING**

Sew shoulder seams.

### ***Neckband***

From RS, with shorter needle and A, beg at right shoulder seam, pick up and k108 (112, 116, 120) sts evenly spaced around neck edge.

Place marker for beg of rnd. Join by working the first st on left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle.

**Rnds 1-7:** \* K2, p2; rep from \* around.

Bind off in rib.

Place markers on side edges of Front and Back about 7 (8, 9, 10) in. (18 (20.5, 23, 25.5) cm) from shoulder seams.

Sew Sleeves between markers.

Sew side and Sleeve seams.

Weave in ends.

## ABBREVIATIONS

**beg** = begin(ning)

**k** = knit

**p** = purl

**rep** = repeat

**RS** = right side

**st(s)** = stitch(es)

**St st** = Stockinette stitch

**WS** = wrong side
