FROM OUR GENERAL MANAGERS

Over the past few months, our team successfully completed the Tarong North Power Station major overhaul. This significant milestone was a result of months of planning, coordination, and hard work across the site. The dedication to safety, quality, and delivering this complex project is a credit to everyone involved. We also wish to thank the local community, especially the accommodation providers, for your support and patience throughout this busy period.

The next major overhaul on Unit 1 will take place from September to November 2025. These works are essential to maintaining the reliability and performance of our power generation assets, particularly as we head into the peak summer season.

At Meandu Mine, operations within the existing surface rights area have transitioned into a new section. We have taken additional steps to ensure the safety of our neighbouring communities and to keep you informed of any short-term traffic changes along Tarong Power Station Road as a result. We have progressed regulatory approvals for the proposed King 2 East project. As part of the Federal environmental approvals process, we recently issued a public notification to view the Preliminary Documentation Assessment Report, which has now closed.

TRANSFORMERS ENERGISED: TARONG BATTERY HITS ANOTHER MILESTONE

Recently, two 275kV transformers were successfully energised, further boosting the momentum of the Tarong battery project.

This significant milestone was achieved through proactive and collaborative teamwork by construction partner Yurika, Wilson Transformers, and the Stanwell project team.

The energisation of the transformers marks the end of a long journey that started in late 2022. The project team is now focused on energising the 33kV networks and preparing for the commissioning of the battery, which is expected to be achieved shortly.

A large amount of work is also being undertaken to integrate the battery into Tarong power stations' operational, maintenance and safety systems, which is a complex and multi-faceted process.

General Manager Portfolio Integration, Paul Schultz said he

was pleased with how each function took ownership in the operationalisation of this new asset to ensure integration was consistent with the high standard we expect from Stanwell assets.

Once operational, the battery can be charged when energy generation in the market is high and can discharge energy into the grid when generation is low or demand is high, or to maintain grid stability. This system can charge and discharge electricity several times a day, and can respond within fractions of a second to electricity demand.

Tarong power stations' employees will play a crucial role, taking charge of all preventative and reactive maintenance of the substation plant, and managing regular switching operations of the 33kV battery network to support Tesla battery maintenance. Two skilled Tesla employees, who will be based locally, will carry out all maintenance tasks associated with each battery unit.

MEANDU MINE: KING 2 EAST PIT PROGRESS

Since our last update, Meandu Mine has commenced mining operations in the northeastern side of the mine, known as the King 2 East pit. This area lies within the existing mine surface rights and marks the first step in the planned restart of mining in the King 2 East pit area. Expansion into the broader project area is subject to future approval.

The current activity area (highlighted in yellow on the map), represents a new phase in mine operations. As work progresses, we will continue to keep nearby communities informed.

To help manage any impacts, additional safety measures will be put in place to control traffic along Tarong Power Station Road when we are blasting in the King 2 East box cut area. Any short-term disruptions will be communicated in advance to minimise inconvenience and ensure public safety.

SUPPORTING ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE TOGETHER

Energy generation at Tarong Power Station relies on access to water, which is used for steam production and cooling. The primary source of water for the Tarong power stations is Boondooma Dam, which was built to provide water for this purpose.

The power stations also have access to water from Lake Wivenhoe via the Wivenhoe Tarong Pipeline, which is used when dam levels at Boondooma are low.

Routine inspections along the Wivenhoe–Tarong Pipeline are undertaken by the Tarong Power Stations Maintenace team and are essential to keeping infrastructure safe and reliable.

As much of the pipeline runs through private land, we work closely with landholders to ensure access is respectful and in line with individual property needs. Biosecurity is a shared responsibility. Our teams follow strict hygiene protocols—cleaning vehicles and equipment and adhering to landholder instructions—to help protect farms and the environment.

Clear communication and responsible land management are central to how we operate, helping us maintain strong relationships with the communities we work alongside.
