#### THERE IS COMING A DAY

The certainty of Jesus' return is underscored throughout the New Testament. Jesus Himself promised

His disciples that He would come again. In John 14:1-3, He reassures them, saying, "Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also."

The Apostle Paul also emphasized this promise in his letters. In 1 Thessalonians 4:16-17, he writes, "For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Lord." Moreover, the Book of Revelation, which is rich with prophetic imagery, repeatedly affirms the return of Christ. Revelation 22:12 states, "And behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward is with Me, to give to every one according to his work."

The Bible describes various signs and conditions that will characterize the world at the time of Jesus' return. These signs serve as warnings and reminders for believers to remain vigilant. In Matthew 24:3-14, Jesus outlines several conditions: "And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not troubled; for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. And there will be famines, pestilences, and earthquakes in various places. All these are the beginning of sorrows."

Another significant sign is the spread of the Gospel. Matthew 24:14 states, "And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in all the world as a witness to all the nations, and then the end will come." This indicates that the message of Christ will reach every corner of the globe before His return.

To illustrate the Second Coming, Jesus used several parables. One such parable is the Parable of the Ten Virgins (Matthew 25:1-13). In this story, ten virgins await the arrival of the bridegroom. Five are wise and bring extra oil for their lamps, while the other five are foolish and bring none. When the bridegroom arrives, the wise virgins are ready and enter the wedding feast, but the foolish ones are left outside. This parable emphasizes the importance of being prepared and vigilant, as the exact time of Jesus' return is unknown.

Given the certainty and the signs of Jesus' return, it is crucial for believers to prepare themselves. The Bible provides clear guidance on how to do this:

• **Live a Holy Life**: Believers are called to live in a manner that reflects their faith. 1 Peter 1:15-16 urges, "But as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, because it is written, 'Be holy, for I am holy."

#### WHEN FAVOR ARRIVES

"Not a single church in the Maine District is large enough to hold the people that will come to

them at the time of their visitation." This is a prophecy that was shared with me earlier this year.

Psalm 102:13
(AMP): "You will arise and have compassion on Zion,
For it is time to be gracious and show <u>favor</u> to her; Yes, the appointed time [the moment designated] has come."

This prophetic psalm was written by either David with a vision of the future, or by one of the prophets of captivity such as Ezra, Daniel, or Nehemiah. In this psalm, the writer sees the calendar of God and declares that the appointed time of favor has come. Wouldn't it be interesting to get a glimpse of God's calendar? If we had access to God's timing, what would we do differently? Ecclesiastes 3:1 (AMP) says "There is a season (a time appointed) for everything and a time for every delight and event or purpose under heaven". This lets us know that there are appointed times of favor and usually these moments do not happen how, when, or where we expect them to occur.

I'm reminded of an account about a customs officer that worked the border who saw a suspicious looking truck driver. He ordered the driver out of the truck and began to search the truck. He pulled off the bumpers, the panels, the wheels and he couldn't find any contraband or illegal substances. And so reluctantly, he waved the driver on. The next week, the same truck driver shows up, and again the customs officer searches the truck. Finding nothing, the officer decides to search the driver but still comes up empty. Once again, he lets the truck driver roll on. The next week the same driver pulls up but this time the customs officer gets the trained detection dogs, and has them search the truck. But even with all their training, the dogs can't find anything. And so again, the customs officer waves the truck driver on.

Week after week, month after month, this occurrence keeps happening until finally the customs officer is retiring. On the day of his

retirement, the same truck driver pulls his vehicle into the border crossing. The customs officer walks over to the driver and says, "Look, I'm not going to search you today. I know you're a smuggler, don't even try to deny it! All these times of you crossing

this border, I've never been able to figure out what it is you've been smuggling." He said, "Now I'm retiring, matter of fact, this is my last day. So just to satisfy my curiosity and since it's not going to do you any harm, would you tell me what you've been

smuggling across this border for all these years?" The truck driver leans in and says with a wry smile, "Trucks."

Sometimes God brings truckloads of favor and blessings into our lives and we are so busy looking for something at the distant end of the earth that we don't even recognize what God is doing today! In this season, the favor of God is upon us! The appointed time of visitation is here! Today is the day of salvation and now is the accepted time!

When favor arrives... "Not a single church in the Maine District is large enough to hold the people that will come to them at the time of their visitation."
