



INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS: FIT AND PROPER CHECKS DURING THE COMPETITION FOR THE FOURTH NATIONAL LOTTERY LICENCE

Thank you for submitting a response to the Selection Questionnaire (SQ). We are now evaluating responses.

Applicants that are invited to participate in the Invitation to Apply will be required to submit this documentation to the Commission by the 18th December 2020 (the "Deadline"). It may take some time to collate the information required for all Persons Needing to be Checked and we advise that Applicants prepare early.

This update to the Information for Applicants on Fit and Proper Checks includes:

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Why does the Gambling Commission require Fit and Proper Checks?

Under the National Lottery etc. Act 1993, the Gambling Commission must ensure that the Licensee is fit and proper to operate the National Lottery.

What are Fit and Proper Checks?

Fit and Proper Checks examine the identity, integrity, criminality and financial integrity of those operating or benefitting from the National Lottery (or applying to do so).

In connection with its Fit and Proper Checks, the Commission may contact agencies including, but not limited to:

- Disclosure Scotland & Disclosure & Barring Services
- Financial Conduct Authority
- Insolvency Agency
- HMRC
- Serious Fraud Office
- Security Services

The Commission asks the agencies to report spent and unspent convictions, cautions, penalties, fines and intelligence.

Who needs to be subject to a Fit and Proper Check?

During the Competition, the Commission will require anyone who is a “Person Needing to be Checked” to undergo Fit and Proper Checks.¹

Those persons include anyone who, if the Application were successful would, at the start of the Licence, be:

- The Licensee
- A Lottery Beneficiary
- A Lottery Supervisor
- A Critical Function Employee.

This also includes each person who would, if the Application were successful, be a member of Transition Staff.

See Appendix 1 for definitions, or refer to the Lottery Beneficiary Illustrations pack provided for further information.

When in the Competition will Fit and Proper Checks take place?

Fit and Proper Checks will take place in tandem with the Competition process.

Following the deadline for SQ responses on the 2nd October, the Applicant’s nominated contact has been provided with the relevant forms to complete. The nominated contact will be required to collate the required information and return it to the Commission.

Once the Commission has received the required documentation, the Commission will commence Fit and Proper Checks. Fit and Proper Checks will take place in parallel with the ITA Stage.

The information in order to enable the Commission to undertake Fit and Proper Checks will need to be provided by the 18th December 2020 (the “**Deadline**”) in respect of anyone who the Applicant has identified in its response to the Selection Questionnaire as being a Person Needing to be Checked.

If the Applicant subsequently identifies anyone else as a Person Needing to be Checked, they will need to notify the Commission as soon as such person has been identified and promptly provide the information necessary for the Commission to carry out the Fit and Proper Checks in relation to that person.

Important information for persons having lived outside the UK within the last 5 years

Persons having lived abroad in the past 5 years are advised to apply as soon as possible to the relevant body for a ‘certificate of good conduct’ or equivalent. This certificate will be required for the completion of Fit and Proper Checks.

Details of how to obtain such a certificate are available on GOV.UK (<https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/criminal-records-checks-for-overseas-applicants>). If the country concerned is not listed, please contact the relevant embassy or consulate for further details.

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What are the minimum expectations regarding Fit and Proper Checks prior to Award Notification?

It is the Applicant's responsibility to ensure that all Persons Needing to be Checked are correctly identified and that the required information is provided to the Commission in line with the timelines set out in this document. As part of this, you will be required to provide organisational charts identifying the Persons Needing to be Checked.

As a minimum, before Award Notification, the Commission expects that the Applicant will have done everything it can to enable Fit and Proper Checks to have been carried out on anyone who, if the Application were successful would, on signature of the Enabling Agreement, be:

- The Proposed Licensee (which will become the "Incoming Licensee" on entry into the Enabling Agreement)
- A Qualifying Direct Shareholder of the Incoming Licensee
- A Connected Party of a Qualifying Direct Shareholder of the Incoming Licensee
- A Key Subcontractor (where that Key Subcontractor is referenced in the Application)
- A Connected Party of a Key Subcontractor (where that Key Subcontractor is referenced in the Application)
- A Senior Executive of any of the above
- A Lottery Supervisor, Critical Function Employee or member of Transition Staff upon whom the Incoming Licensee would be dependent in order to ensure that it will have access to sufficient operational resources to implement the Application and the Incoming Transition Plan and prepare to operate the National Lottery.

The Commission recognises that some Lottery Supervisors, Key Subcontractors, Critical Function Employees and Transition Staff may be identified later in the competition or during the Implementation Period. Where this is the case, the Incoming Licensee must notify the Commission as soon as possible, providing their details and all such other information as the Commission may require.

If it is necessary for a person to start work as a member of Transition Staff before the Commission has confirmed that such person is Fit and Proper, the Incoming Licensee will be required to notify the Commission and ensure that the individual is adequately supervised and prevented from accessing sensitive information. This will be set out in full in the Enabling Agreement.

Purpose of each document

Lottery Beneficiary Illustrations

This slide deck provides illustrations to support Applicants to identify Persons Needing to be Checked.

Corporate Declaration

The Corporate Declaration provides the Commission with the information required to conduct Fit and Proper Checks on corporate entities that meet the definitions of Persons Needing to be Checked.

This will include any corporate entity which, if the Application were successful would, at the start of the Licence, be the Licensee or a Lottery Beneficiary.

Individual Declaration for Beneficiaries and Supervisors

The Individual Declaration for Beneficiaries and Supervisors provides the Commission with the information required to conduct Fit and Proper Checks on individuals who, if the Application were successful, would be a Lottery Beneficiary or a Lottery Supervisor.

Individual Declaration for Critical Function Employees and Transition Staff

The Individual Declaration for Critical Function Employees provides the Commission with the information required to conduct Fit and Proper Checks on individuals who, if the Application were successful, would be a Critical Function Employee or member of Transition Staff.

Identity Verification form

The Identity Verification form evidences that appropriate ID checking processes have taken place and that checks are being carried out on the correct persons.

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What do Applicants need to do?

The Applicant is responsible for ensuring the Gambling Commission receives all the required information for all Persons Needing to be Checked by the Deadline. Applicants should note that Persons Needing to be Checked may be corporate entities or individuals, and for each Person Needing to be Checked, the correct declaration form must be provided.

The Commission reserves the right not to evaluate an Applicant's ITA response if the required documentation has not been accurately completed and submitted by the Deadline.

Access instructions

We have provided copies of each of the documents named above to the nominated contact from Applicants' Selection Questionnaire responses. We sent these documents by email.

Any Applicant that has not received the forms should check their email address junk folder before informing the Commission via Jaggaer.

Clarification instructions

Applicants must submit any clarification questions regarding Fit and Proper Checks to the Commission via Jaggaer using the clarification request form.

For the avoidance of doubt, the Commission will not respond to clarification questions submitted via any other channels.

Document submission instructions

Applicants are required to complete the forms and upload with any relevant documentation to the specified Sharefile upload area. A unique Sharefile link will be provided to each Applicant invited to participate in the ITA stage of the Competition.

Once the forms have been uploaded, Applicants are required to send a confirmation email to 4nlvetting@gamblingcommission.gov.uk stating that their forms are complete and ready to review.

The Commission recognises that the information uploaded may be personally sensitive. Applicants are not required to submit their documentation until they know whether they will be invited to participate in the ITA Stage of the Competition.

Applicants must complete a separate Declaration for each

Person Needing to be Checked, where such persons are referenced in the Application or the Applicant is otherwise dependent upon those Persons Needing to be Checked in order for their Business Plan to be viable.

Roles and responsibilities

The Applicant is responsible for ensuring that all Persons Needing to be Checked are correctly identified to the Commission, across all Persons Relevant to the Application. See Appendix 1 for definitions, or refer to the Lottery Beneficiary Illustrations pack provided alongside this document for further information.

The Applicant is responsible for co-ordinating and collating responses from all Persons Needing to be Checked relevant to the Application. It is likely that those Persons Needing to be Checked will include other corporate entities and their employees and executives, not just the Proposed Licensee. For example, the Applicant will need to collate information from any potential Lottery Beneficiaries (including Key Subcontractors) identified in their Application, and any individuals associated with that Lottery Beneficiary who would be Lottery Supervisors, Critical Function Employees or members of Transition Staff.

The Applicant is responsible for:

- any failure to identify the correct Persons Needing to be Checked;
- any failure to provide the necessary information for Fit and Proper Checks to take place in a timely manner;
- the consequences of the above.

If the Commission is not able to satisfy itself that the Proposed Licensee would be fit and proper, it will not award the Licence to that Proposed Licensee.

What happens after the Commission receives Applicants' information?

Once satisfied that the forms have been completed correctly, the Commission will send them to the relevant agencies for checks.

Once a response has been received from all the relevant agencies, the Commission will consider the information returned and determine whether the person is fit and proper.

What if additional persons are added to an Application after the SQ is submitted?

The Commission is relying on the information provided in response to the SQ in order to assess each Application,

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including (but not limited to) using the information provided as part of its assessment during the Competition of whether the Proposed Licensee meets the Fit and Proper Requirements.

If at any time during the Competition there are any material changes to the information provided in response to the SQ, or other information in relation to any Person Needing to be Checked which might be relevant to an assessment as to that person's fitness and propriety (including if a new Person Needing to be Checked is identified by the Applicant), the Applicant must advise the Commission through Jaggaer as soon as it becomes aware of the change.

Applicants should note that the Commission does not guarantee that it will be possible to complete Fit and Proper Checks before award of the Licence for persons who are identified after the deadline for ITA phase one Applications. Where the Applicant is reliant on any such person in their proposal, the Commission reserves the right not to evaluate the Applicant's ITA response.

What if Fit and Proper Checks return adverse information?

Adverse information refers to any conviction, caution, penalty or fine imposed upon a person, or any other information which gives rise to concerns about the Proposed Licensee's fitness and propriety to operate the National Lottery.

Persons Needing to be Checked may self-declare potential adverse information when they complete their forms. Adverse information may also be revealed by the agency checks.

Where the Commission thinks any adverse information may mean that a Person Needing to be Checked is not fit and proper, the following steps will be taken:

- Where possible, a letter will be sent to the person in question to confirm that the information relates to them and inviting them to comment upon it (if the information was not previously declared). Applicants should note that in some instances, the Commission may be unable for legal reasons to disclose to Applicants the detail of the adverse findings it has received. In this event, the Commission will provide notification that it has not been able to satisfy itself that the relevant person is fit and proper.
- The Commission will maintain records of all responses to queries.
- Where the person confirms that the information is

correct, they will be asked to write to the Commission and explain why it was not included in their original declarations.

- If the person does not respond, it will not be possible to complete Fit and Proper Checks in respect of that person.
- Where adverse information is disputed, the Commission may make further enquiries and/or invite the person to make representations.
- The Commission will determine whether the person meets the required standard of fitness and propriety. Adverse information will be considered in the context of the Commission's statutory duties.
- The Commission will not award the Licence unless it is satisfied that the Proposed Licensee is fit and proper.
- The Commission's decision is final.

Where Fit and Proper Checks cannot be completed or the Commission determines a person does not meet the required standard of fitness and propriety, the Applicant may be given the opportunity to replace the person in question.

The Commission does not guarantee that it will be possible to complete Fit and Proper Checks of any persons identified as replacements before the award of the Licence. If the Applicant cannot find a suitable replacement who can be checked within the competition timeframes and Commission considers that the Applicant is reliant on that person in their Application, the Commission reserves the right not to evaluate the Application or to disqualify the Applicant from the competition.

How will data be protected?

Adverse information will not be disclosed to third parties unless required by law and information will be kept securely at all times.

Information relating to the successful Applicant will be kept on file. Checks must be renewed at least every 5 years.

Information relating to the Applicant selected as the Reserve Applicant will be kept for so long as it remains the Reserve Applicant. That information will be destroyed after that date, unless that person becomes the successful Applicant.

Information relating to all other Applicants will be destroyed at the end of the Competition.

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What are the ongoing obligations for the successful Applicant?

The successful Applicant will be required to remain fit and proper throughout Transition and the Licence Term.

The obligations of the successful Applicant during Transition will be provided with the Enabling Agreement. The obligations of the Licensee can be found in Conditions 5 – 7 of the Licence.

Applicants should note that should they be successful, inaccuracies in the information provided to the Commission for the purposes of the above checks may result in the Enabling Agreement being terminated during Transition or a breach of the Licence.

Appendix 1: Categories of Persons Needing to be Checked

The following are the Persons Needing to be Checked.

Applicants should note that any reference to ‘person’ in the below table should be understood to mean any individual, company, corporation, firm, partnership, joint venture, association, state, state agency, institution or trust (whether or not having a separate legal personality).

In the table below, references to the Licensee are to the person who is the Proposed Licensee.

Appendix 2: Related definitions

In the table below, references to the Licensee are to the person who is the Proposed Licensee and, where relevant, each of the following definitions should be read in the context that they refer to the operation of the National Lottery during the term of the Licence.

Enabling Agreement	The agreement between the Commission and the Licensee, entered into in anticipation of the Licence being granted to the Licensee and governing the implementation of the Application and the Licensee's preparation to run the National Lottery in accordance with the Licence
Entry and Prize System	The integrated system used to record and store entries into Games, determine winners and validate Prizes
Game	Any constituent lottery or game of the National Lottery authorised by a licence granted under s6 of the National Lottery etc. Act 1993 (as updated from time to time) (the Act) and including any Ancillary Activity specifically related to that lottery or game
Group Company	In relation to a person (Person A), any other person (Person B) who is from time to time: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) a subsidiary of Person A; (b) a parent company of Person A; or (c) any other subsidiary of such parent company, <p>where "parent company" and "subsidiary" have the meanings given to those terms in defined in section 1162 of the Companies Act 2006</p>
