Hi both,

I've had a look into this consultation, but I don't feel it's that relevant for us to respond.

It looks at a very broad range of health and social care outputs produced by various health bodies (DHSC (including OHID), NHSBSA, UKHSA, ONS and NHS England) covering statistics on adult social care, cancer, COVID-19, disability, mental health, primary care and many more themes. The consultation generally looks to make possible changes such as to merge statistical products where there are multiple publications on the same or similar topic areas; to reduce the frequency of products where we expect there is limited value in more frequent data; to introduce new statistical products where there is a new or emerging need etc.

In the document, there is a very small reference to potentially changing the mode and/or frequency of HSE, but as we no longer use it and there is no mention of gambling throughout, it feels irrelevant to us.

One of the options is to change the survey mode from face to face to either online or a combination of online and telephone - note that nurse visits would still be carried out face to face. These changes may impact trend data and overall content due to time limitations.

Alongside changes to survey mode. NHS England is also considering the frequency of the Health Survey for England. NHS England is proposing to change the frequency of the Health Survey for England from annual to every other year. This change may be implemented alongside or instead of the change to survey mode.

There is also no change expected to the APMS.

I do think that given that the consultation will seek views on how statistics are published i.e. data dashboards, interactive tools, statistical bulletins, data tables, data downloads etc. it might be useful to review what their users have said in the summer when a high-level consultation response summary will be available to view – we might get some ideas from it!

I hope that helps explain why this consultation isn't as relevant as it might have initially appeared to be.
