The survey also found that 4.9 percent of those surveyed said they had considered suicide and that their gambling had played some role in this. However, the commission noted that the 11.4 percent of respondents who indicated they had considered or attempted suicide in general represented a higher estimate than tends to be reported in other studies.

This is incorrect.

You would be accurate if you used these words instead:

Of the 11.4 percent of participants who had thought about or attempted taking their own life, 4.9 percent reported that this was related to their gambling either a little or a lot, with 1.1 percent reporting that this was related to their gambling a lot.
